Phragmites



Common reed forming dense patches in wet and fertile soils along banks of ponds, lakes, roads, and ditches. Phragmites can grow to be 3-20 feet tall. This can be a problem plant because once established, it crowds out other wetland plants. They shoot runners towards water, and every few inches, a plant will shoot up.



Management:

Aquatic glyphosate (Rodeo)

Arsenal – Apply in spring before flower or in fall

<u>Life Span</u>: Perennial
