

### SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:30 a.m. on January 13, 2015, by Chairperson, Janet J. Henning. Present were Marvin A. Kohout, Willis D. Luedke, Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek and Tim McDermott, Commissioners, and Linda Kastanek, County Clerk. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Henning advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Kohout moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were McDermott, Henning, Kohout, Krivohlavek, and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

McDermott moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Luedke, Krivohlavek, Henning, McDermott and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Under Citizens' Forum, Zach Pilfold with CASA updated the Board, stating that there will be an information meeting at the Cultural Center in Wilber on Thursday evening. When they started in Saline County, they had 22 cases and they are now down to 16 cases and 10 children. They have one advocate from Seward who comes to Saline County. They are trying to acquire office space in Wilber.

At 9:45 a.m., Kohout moved to adjourn sine die, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Luedke, Krivohlavek, and McDermott, nays none, motion carried. Purpose of this action is to reorganize and elect or re-elect a Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson.

Deputy Clerk, Daryl Fikar, asked for nominations from the floor for Chairperson. Kohout nominated Henning, and Krivohlavek seconded the motion. Kohout moved that nominations cease and cast a unanimous ballot for Henning, seconded by McDermott.

Henning then asked for nominations from the floor for Vice-Chairperson. Henning nominated Kohout for Vice-Chair, seconded by McDermott. Henning moved to cast unanimous vote for Vice-Chair, all voted aye. The Board went over the Appointments and Policies for 2015, as follows:

After discussion, Kohout moved to increase payment for cemetery care for cemeteries of 5,000 square feet or more to \$600 per year, leaving the cemeteries under 5,000 square feet at \$500 per year. Motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were McDermott, Henning, Krivohlavek, Kohout and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi and Assistant Highway Superintendent Bill Slezak discussed the drive-way permit fees. After discussion, Kohout moved to increase the fees for county installed driveways from \$200 to \$400, and if excessive dirt work and equipment is needed, from \$300 to \$500. Motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Luedke, Krivohlavek, Henning, McDermott and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Jerry Berggren with Berggren Architects presented the color samples for the offices that will be in the new addition. The Board discussed an asbestos survey proposal with him. After discussion, Luedke moved to



approve Bockmann Inc., who will do the survey of the court house to identify possible asbestos containing building materials within the building. State and Federal regulations require an asbestos survey to be completed prior to the start of any renovation project. Cost of the survey is not to exceed \$1,750.00. Motion was seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Luedke, Henning and McDermott, nays none, motion carried.

Berggren discussed security companies and will be advertising for bids soon. He handed out a preliminary timeline of the steps to be taken during the bidding process. After discussion, Luedke moved to approve having a separate contract for the security bidding process from the General Contractor bidding process, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, McDermott, Kohout, Henning and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:53 a.m., Henning announced that the Board would take a short break.

At 11:08, Henning announced that the Board would reconvene.

Under Negotiations, Realtor Nicki Zalesky was present to discuss the purchase of two properties across the street north of the Court House to be used for a future parking lot. After much discussion, Luedke moved to authorize the purchase of the property at 518 W. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street. Motion was seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, McDermott, Luedke and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Luedke moved to authorize the purchase of the property located at 510 W. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, McDermott, Kohout, Henning and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi requested to declare 3 Sheriff's vehicles as surplus property, to be taken to the state sale in the spring. Kohout moved to approve declaring the vehicles as surplus, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were McDermott, Luedke, Henning, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

At 11:40 a.m., Kohout moved to enter Executive Session, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Luedke, Krivohlavek, Henning, McDermott and Kohout, nays none, motion carried. Henning announced that purpose of closed session is to discuss GA#2015-01 and GA#2015-02, Insurance and Personnel. Negotiations were discussed earlier in the meeting.

At 1:11 p.m., Kohout moved to exit Executive session, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Luedke, Krivohlavek, Henning, McDermott and Kohout, nays none, motion carried. Henning announced that during closed session the Board discussed GA#2015-01 and GA#2015-02, insurance and personnel. Action on GA#2015-02 was tabled until further information is presented.

Emergency Management Coordinator BJ Fictum updated the Board on the Hazard Mitigation Plan. He handed out a proposed project schedule from JEO Consulting Group relating to the Mitigation Plan. He will be attending an Emergency Management 101 class in Lincoln January 20 - 22; there will be a NIMS class in Dorchester on January  $28^{th}$ , and January  $27^{th}$  in the afternoon, there will be a LEOP update for Commissioners and all officials.

Luedke moved to approve the County Treasurer's Semi-Annual Statement, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were McDermott, Luedke, Henning, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried. Spanyers explained the pledged collateral information.

Luedke moved to approve the Clerk of District Court Report of Fees for December in the amount of \$4,999.25, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Kohout Krivohlavek, McDermott, Luedke and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Luedke moved to approve the County Clerk Report of Fees for December in the amount of \$8,204.49, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, McDermott, Kohout, Henning and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Kohout moved to approve Resolution #2015-01, requiring all county subdivisions which receive financial assistance, grants or awards from Saline County to submit a copy of all minutes of meetings required to be kept, in accordance with Nebraska law, to the County Clerk of Saline County Nebraska, for reported



purposes and to be posted on the Saline County Nebraska website. Motion was seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Luedke, Krivohlavek, Kohout, McDermott and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Kohout moved to approve Resolution #2015-02, transferring \$2,400.00 from the General Fund into the Grant fund, to be reimbursed when funds become available. Motion was seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Henning, Luedke, Kohout, Krivohlavek and McDermott, nays none, motion carried.

McDermott moved to approve the claims but pull #15010250 for \$74,252.23 until next pay period, and adding \$255.41 for General Assistance #2015-01. Motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Luedke, Henning, Krivohlavek, McDermott and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Luedke moved to approve the minutes of the January 13, 2015 meeting, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Henning, Luedke, Kohout, Krivohlavek and McDermott, nays none, motion carried.

Weed Superintendent Lyle Weber presented the annual Weed Report. Weber discussed "teasel", stating that there are about 30 acres in Saline County that have been sprayed. After discussion, Luedke moved to approve the report, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, McDermott, Henning, Luedke and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Deputy County Clerk, Daryl Fikar reported receiving a check for \$33.18 from First Choice Vending, which is the County's share of profit from the vending machines that were on the first floor of the Courthouse, a check for \$19.00 from Vonage, and a check for \$13.00 from Level 3 Communications, both for 911 Surcharges, the agenda from Blue Valley Community Action for their January 20 meeting and the minutes of their November 18, 2014 meeting, the agenda for Saline County Aging Services January 26 meeting and the minutes of their October 27, 2014 meeting.

At 9:45, Craig Caples of NETS presented to the Board a software program called eMeetings that is designed to make meeting agendas, notes and minutes more accessible to board members, county officials and the public. The Board will take this information under advisement.

Extension Educator, Randy Pryor was present to request approval of the 2015 Extension Board members. They are Josie Filipi, Larry Schafer, Larry Starr, Chairman Chris Peters, Vice Chair Travis Nerud, Secretary Bob Homolka, Treasurer Mary Jo Weber, Cheryl Retherford and Pam Fuller. The new 4-H Council Representative is Sandy Krivohlavek.

Luedke moved to approve the list of Extension Board members, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, McDermott, Henning and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Weed Superintendent Lyle Weber presented a minor subdivision request from John Vosta in the NW1/4 of section 1-8-3. Luedke moved to approve the request, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, McDermott, Henning, Luedke and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Weber then presented a minor subdivision request from Ray Rezabek in the NE1/4 NE1/4 of section 13-7-2. Luedke moved to approve the request, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were McDermott, Henning, Luedke, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Luedke moved to approve the Sheriff's Report of Fees for December, showing Writ Fees, \$1,577.00; Mileage, \$1,201.75; Inspections, \$420.00; Gun Permits \$75.00; and Miscellaneous \$46.00 totaling \$3,319.81. Motion was seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Henning, Luedke, Kohout, Krivohlavek and McDermott, nays none, motion carried.

Krivohlavek moved to approve Resolution #2015-03, transferring \$61,122.24 from the Milford Road Project Fund #4600 to the Milford Road Bond Fund #3700, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Luedke, Kohout, Krivohlavek, McDermott and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Luedke moved to approve Resolution #2015-04, changing the name of the Milford Road Project Fund to the Capital Outlay Fund, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, McDermott, Henning and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.



Kohout moved to approve Resolution #2015-05, transferring \$500.00 from the General Fund to the Grant Fund, to be reimbursed when funds are available, seconded by Luedke. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, McDermott, Henning, Luedke and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:48 Henning announced that the Board would take a short break.

At 10:58 Henning announced that the Board would reconvene.

Saline County Emergency Manager B.J. Fictum presented a Commercial Lease Agreement between Saline County and the City of Crete to allow the County to place radio antennas on the Crete water tower for the county-wide communications upgrade. After discussion, Kohout moved that the Lease Agreement with the City of Crete be approved, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were McDermott, Henning, Luedke, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried. Fictum then asked that the first year's rent of \$250.00 be added to the claims for this pay period.

Fictum updated the Board on the Communications Upgrade, telling them that the upgrade is nearly complete, except for a communications link between the City of Crete and Saline Center, which must have a larger antenna installed to make it 100% reliable.

Henning advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Luedke moved to approve the agenda as presented, with the addition of a building permit approval, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were McDermott, Henning, Kohout, Krivohlavek, and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

McDermott moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Luedke, Krivohlavek, Henning, McDermott and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Under Report of Officials, Henning reported attending the Spelling Contest, a CISDA meeting, a Public Health Solutions meeting; the County Health Fair; and has a Behavioral Health Board meeting next week.

Luedke reported that the Blue Valley Community Action meeting was cancelled due to the weather; he attended various meetings with the Architect and Security Company; and he attended the County Health Fair.

Saline County should be receiving \$277,631.71 in the next few days. The STP funds total \$101,691.71. This money is used for construction or repair of public highways, streets, roads or bridges and facilities, and roadway structures. The Bridge Funds total is \$175,940.02, to be used for construction, reconstruction, improvement, repair or non-routine maintenance of public bridges.

Slezak presented a Request to Occupy ROW by Unite Private Networks, to plow and trench to bury utility line for cable customers in the Dorchester area. ### SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:30 a.m. on March 24, 2015, by Chairperson, Janet J. Henning. Present were Marvin A. Kohout, Willis D. Luedke, Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek and Tim McDermott, Commissioners, and Linda Kastanek, County Clerk. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Henning advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Kohout moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were McDermott, Henning, Kohout, Krivohlavek, and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

McDermott moved to approve the minutes of the March 10, 2015 meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Luedke, Krivohlavek, Henning, McDermott and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Zach Pilfold with CASA updated the Board on recent activities. He noted that the numbers have not changed since last month. There will be a new training class starting March 31. He stated that April is Child Abuse Awareness month and that they will have several activities relating to child abuse during the month.

### SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:30 a.m. on April 7, 2015, by Chairperson, Janet J. Henning. Present were Marvin A. Kohout, Willis D. Luedke, Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek and Tim McDermott, Commissioners, and Linda Kastanek, County Clerk. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Henning advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Luedke, Krivohlavek, Henning, McDermott and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Kohout moved to approve the minutes of the March 24, 2015 meeting as presented, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, McDermott, Luedke, and McDermott, nays none, motion carried.

Kastanek reported receiving a dividend check from Farmers Union Coop in Friend for \$115.50, and the minutes from the Saline County Tourism Advisory Committee and Saline County Aging Services.

Emergency Management Coordinator BJ Fictum reported that the Hazard Mitigation meeting will be held on June 17<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. at the Saline County Extension meeting room. He noted that Dorchester is done and Friend will be on the 14<sup>th</sup>. There will be an IED training on April 17<sup>th</sup> from 6:00 until 7:30 p.m., before the Mutual Aid meeting at 8:00 p.m.in Friend. The SE Emergency Management Region will be funding this training. On April 11<sup>th</sup> there will be a transportation incident training from 10:00 until 2:00 p.m. at the DeWitt Community Center for all area responders. Lunch will be served. This training is through the 3 & 33 Mutual Aid. On May 4 or 18<sup>th</sup> (date not yet determined) a NIMS 1, 2, 7, and 8 training will be held in Crete.

The NRIN (Nebraska Regional Interoperability Network) is about 65% complete across the state. This is an IP Microwave network that connects 911 centers across the state through towers like grain elevators, water towers, government owned or existing communications towers. This is being paid for by the Department of Homeland Security.

He noted that he is working with DEQ to get the Tier 2 Haz-Mat reports on-line.

Fictum stated that there were approximately 351 in attendance at the weather seminar.

Luedke reported attending several meetings with McDermott, representatives from Midwest Storage and County Treasurer Debbie Spanyers and Clerk of District Court Joyce Wusk, to discuss storage options for the new vault areas in the new addition; he gave a presentation to the Crete Rotary on the Court House addition; attended a teleconference on LB610, (to increase the gas tax) and encouraged the rest of the Board to call our Senator and discuss this bill.

Kohout reported attending the Take Cover tabletop exercise last week; a Wellness Committee meeting; the Weather Seminar; an Employee Recognition meeting last week, and will be attending the active shooter training, a NIRMA meeting on Thursday and the Employee Recognition banquet on Friday evening.

Krivohlavek reported attending the Take Cover tabletop exercise, and will be attending two NIRMA meetings on Wednesday and Thursday; and a SCAT meeting next Thursday.

McDermott reported attending the meetings with Luedke, the storage company and Spanyers and Wusk; the Take Cover tabletop exercise; the Wellness Committee meeting; the Severe Weather Seminar; the NIRS workshop with the Drug & Alcohol Prevention Coalition; he will have a Drug & Alcohol Coalition meeting tonight, noting that letters will be going out to all parents of Juniors and Seniors in high school county-wide, reminding them that proms and graduations are coming up, and to be aware of possible underage parties. Coming up, the active shooter training tomorrow, the NIRMA Self Defense class on Thursday, a negotiations meeting on Friday, an Executive SENDD Board meeting, a Walkability Conference in Beatrice, a Wellness presentation to the County Treasurers at their state conference in June; and sat in on the LB610 teleconference.

Kevin Harrington, Lisa Henning and Katie Bossung gave a presentation on accident insurance and critical illness insurance for county employees.

At 10:20 a.m., Henning announced that the Board would take a short break.



### At 10:29 a.m., Henning announced that the Board would reconvene.

The building committee introduced their recommendation to the Board from the bids received for the Courthouse Addition. After much discussion with the Architect on the merits of available reductions in the proposed plan, it was advised to approve a contract with the lowest bidder, Cheever Construction, in the amount of \$6,651,000.00. The Board also supported implementing two known deductions in using alternative stone and eliminating faux painting, which will reduce the amount by an estimated \$250,000.00 as construction commences. Justin Kurtzer with Cheever Construction and Erin Dobesh with Berggren Architects were present to round out the discussion. Luedke moved to accept the contract with Cheever Construction with the low bid of \$6,651,000.00, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, McDermott, Kohout, Henning and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Tom Sorensen with Edward Jones, was present to discuss the sale of bonds for the Court House addition. The Board gave verbal approval to begin the process of bond documents that will support the funding of the addition project. The bonding discussion detailed paying bond interest only from the sale of the new bonds until the current payment for the remainder of the Jail bonds expires in 2017. At that time, the principal on the new bonds will be added to the interest and will provide a lesser impact in a levy increase overall, as compared to current payments in paying off County bonds. Bond payments for the Courthouse project are targeted to be paid in full in 2035.

The Board discussed the lease/purchase agreement for the security equipment to be installed in the Courthouse. After discussion, Luedke moved to approve the agreement with Electronic Contracting Company in the amount of \$178,845.72. Motion was seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, McDermott, Luedke and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

The Board also discussed a contract with Midwest Storage Solutions for vault storage in various offices in the addition. After discussion, Luedke moved to approve the contract in the amount of \$100,548.33, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, McDermott, Kohout, Henning and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

The Board discussed the two properties purchased to construct a new parking area to the north of the Court House. These properties will be leveled by the County Road crew after final abatement of hazardous materials in those properties. Bond payments will include the addition, architectural fees, the parking lot, haz-mat survey, haz-mat abatement, vault shelving and landscaping.

At 11:33 a.m., Henning announced that the Board would take a short break.

At 11:40 a.m., Henning announced that the Board would reconvene.

Planning and Zoning Administrator Lyle Weber discussed the Crete airport zoning map.

At 11:50 a.m., Kohout moved to enter into Executive Session, seconded by Luedke. Voting aye were Henning, Luedke, Kohout, Krivohlavek and McDermott, nays none, motion carried. Henning announced that during closed session, the Board would be discussing personnel matters.

At 12:14 p.m., McDermott moved to exit closed session, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Luedke, Krivohlavek, Henning, McDermott and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Henning announced that during closed session, the Board verbally agreed to permit Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi to help Seward County with a bridge project on his own time.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the Tourism Grant Requests as presented, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, McDermott, Luedke and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

### SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:32 a.m. on June 2, 2015, by Chairperson, Janet J. Henning. Present were Willis D. Luedke, Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek and Tim McDermott, Commissioners, and Linda Kastanek, County Clerk. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments. Commissioner Marvin A. Kohout was absent.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Henning advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

McDermott moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Krivohlavek, Kohout, Luedke and McDermott, nays none, motion carried.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Luedke, Krivohlavek, Henning and McDermott, nays none, motion carried.

Kastanek reported receiving a \$3.00 check from CareMark RX, a check from Granite Communications in the amount of \$1.00 and a check from Windstream for \$7,445.00 for 9-11 surcharges. She reported receiving the agendas and minutes from the Regional Governing Board; SENDD; Public Health Solutions; and the 2015 schedule for Aging Services meetings. McDermott reported sitting in on the secondary due diligence phone call with Tom Sorensen regarding the Court House addition bonds, a pre-construction meeting, a Safety Committee meeting, a meeting with Seward-Saline County Sheriffs, Seward police and first responders for back-up if needed, and coming up he has an LEPC meeting, a Wellness Committee meeting, negotiations and the County Board workshop in Kearney.

Emergency Management Coordinator BJ Fictum updated the Board on preliminary storm damage assessments by NEMA and FEMA and the SBA. Five teams began surveying the damaged areas on May 27<sup>th</sup> to determine the extent of damage to public infrastructure such as roads, bridges, public buildings and critical facilities such as power lines and water treatment facilities. Preliminary damage assessments provide a big picture of the disaster area and do not include detailed examinations of every affected road or building. The SBA is also in Wilber and has set up a temporary office in the Cultural Center in the City Office building. They will help small businesses, small ag cooperatives, small businesses engaged in aquaculture and most private, non-profit organizations of all sizes meet their ordinary and necessary financial obligations that cannot be met due to the disaster.

John Day, Executive Director of Blue Valley Behavioral Health, updated the Board on activities, thanked the Board for past support and gave the Board their budget request of \$8000.00.

Bobbie Meints with 5Rivers RC&D was present and thanked the Board for past support and updated the Board on recent activities and projects. She reminded the Board that there will be a Household Hazardous Waste collection in late summer or early fall. Besides weed management, they are also partnering with REAP to offer QuickBooks Training courses, applying for several grants, will help with electronics collections, assist in designing travel guides and distributing them, will again hold the annual Doc Gigstad Steamboat Trace Race on September 12, and assist in promoting and organizing pasture tours. She also requested the annual membership dues of \$2,840.00 be considered at budget time.

Tom Sorensen updated the Board on the bond sales for the Court House addition. There are still some bonds for sale. They are marketing locally in Saline County, and late yesterday, the sales were opened to other



Edward Jones offices in the State. Sorensen handed out preliminary rates and figures, which will be locked in tomorrow. The money should be wired to the bank next week.

Henning advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

McDermott moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Henning, McDermott, Krivohlavek, Kohout and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

McDermott moved to approve the minutes of the June 16, 2015 meeting, seconded by Luedke. Voting aye were Luedke, Krivohlavek, Henning, McDermott and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Kastanek reported receiving a Public Hearing Notice from the City of Friend considering approval of a redevelopment plan, a letter from rural citizens concerned about the condition of a county road and bridge; the minutes from the Saline County Ag Society meeting; the agenda for the Aging Partners Area-wide Advisory Council meeting; the minutes from the Regional Governing Board meeting; and a \$19.00 check from Vonage for 9-11 surcharges.

Luedke reported attending an RC&D meeting, a union negotiations meeting, a meeting with the contractors; and noted that the general contractor will make a video of each office before construction begins.

Kohout reported that he and McDermott gave a Wellness Committee presentation at the State Association of County Treasurers meeting; viewed a property in Friend; attended the Seward-Saline County Solid Waste meeting and attended the SCAT Open House in Western.

Krivohlavek attended an Aging Services meeting and coming up, the Protest Hearings.

McDermott reported on the Wellness Committee presentation; a Drug & Alcohol Prevention Coalition meeting; the SCAT Open House; a full SENDD Board meeting; the final negotiations meeting; a construction meeting; the NIRMA Cyber-Security webinar; a Hazard Mitigation meeting with Fictum and Luedke; and will sit in on the UNICO HR webinar; and coming up, the Protest Hearings, a regular Coalition meeting and a Wellness Committee meeting on the 13<sup>th</sup>.

Eric Stehlik, Kent Musil, Warren Vyhnalek, Teresa Vernon and BJ Fictum, all with the Ag Society Board, were present for their annual update and budget request.

Emergency Management Coordinator BJ Fictum, discussed the Federal Disaster Declaration for 12 Nebraska counties resulting from the May 6th to June 17<sup>th</sup> severe storms and flooding. Assistance is only allowed for emergency work and repair or replacement of disaster-damaged facilities. It includes federal funding on a cost-share basis for hazard mitigation measures for all counties in the state. Each time, 15% statewide is set aside for HM projects from each awarded declaration (\$3.4 million) such as generators, outdoor warning sirens, drainage projects and other projects identified by the locals. Applicant briefings for the initial counties are scheduled to inform applicants on how to submit information for projects. The Saline County portion of the Hazard Mitigation Plan was held last week and all eligible communities were represented, along with the County and the two Natural Resources Districts. The next step is data collection and collation, then printing of the first draft of the plan, distribution to the communities for their review and then another meeting at the end of August to formally discuss the new parts of the plan. Fictum handed out a Mitigation Actions Status Update listing the projects identified in the 2011 Hazard Mitigation Plan, and the estimated costs.

June Pederson, Denise Boyd, Trudy Kubicek, all with Aging Partners and Amy Hanson with Aging Services updated the Board on the annual activities, and presented their budget requests for consideration.

Kohout moved to approve the appointment of Marty Stones as the Aging Partners Area-Wide Advisory Representative. Motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were McDermott, Henning, Krivohlavek, Kohout and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.



Carmen Hinman with Hope Crisis Center updated the Board on the annual activities including fund raisers held throughout the year for domestic and sexual abuse awareness. She also presented the annual budget request.

Tom Sorensen with Edward Jones, updated the Board on the sale of the Court House Addition bonds, noting that all of the bonds have been sold, and the money is in the bank. Wieting will be working with veterans, their families and the VetsEd program.

#### SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:30 a.m. on July 28, 2015, by Chairperson, Janet J. Henning. Present were Marvin A. Kohout, Willis D. Luedke, Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek and Tim McDermott, Commissioners, and Linda Kastanek, County Clerk.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Henning advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Luedke.

Voting aye were McDermott, Henning, Krivohlavek, Kohout and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

McDermott moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting, seconded by Luedke. Voting aye were Luedke, Krivohlavek, Henning, McDermott and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Ardith Eisenhauer was present to request approval of a minor subdivision – Slepicka Acres – located in the SW ¼ of Section 1-5-2, containing 2 ½ acres. Kohout explained that this had been approved by the Planning and Zoning Board. After discussion, Luedke moved to approve the subdivision request, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, McDermott, Kohout, Luedke and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Ralph Drake presented a minor subdivision for approval, located in the SW <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of Section 28-8-2, known as Honeyfield Acres, containing 5.02 acres. Kohout stated that this subdivision request was also approved at the Planning and Zoning meeting. Luedke moved to approve the minor subdivision, seconded by McDermott. Krivohlavek moved to approve the new Interlocal Cooperation Agreement to Join Southeast Nebraska Development District, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, McDermott, Luedke and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning announced at 10:13 a.m., that the Board would recess until 10:30 a.m.

At 10:30 a.m., Henning announced that the Board would reconvene. They met in the Assembly Room with Emergency Management Coordinator and Dan Weis.

Fictum invited everyone to a NEMA course scheduled for August 13<sup>th</sup>. He noted that the second Hazard Mitigation meeting would be held on August 26<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. at the Extension Office meeting room.

Dan Weis, Director of Engineering for First Wireless, Ind., and Emergency Management Coordinator B.J. Fictum discussed the progress of the communications voting system upgrade and some interference problems. McDermott reported that he and Fictum had attended the Saline County Mutual Aid Association meeting in Tobias the previous Wednesday and had received several comments about decreased paging coverage. After discussion, Weis suggested that the first step would be to have all pagers checked out by a service facility to make sure there are no problems and then in step two, he will contact Neil Johnson, Sarpy County Communications Director, to obtain details of their simulcast paging system.

Henning announced that the Board would recess at 11:05 a.m.

Henning announced that the Board would reconvene at 11:13 a.m.

Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi presented a Request to Occupy ROW from Windstream for replacement of buried cable due to flood damage. This is located between Sections 6-6-3 and 5-6-3.



Krivohlavek moved to approve the Request, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Henning, Luedke, Kohout, Krivohlavek and McDermott, nays none, motion carried.

A map showing the roads, bridges and culverts damaged during the May floods was shown to the Board. Filipi explained that on June 29<sup>th</sup>, there were 22 roads totally closed, and today only ten of them are left to open up. Five bridges were completely washed away, and three could possibly be replaced with culverts, the engineers are checking it out. One road should be opened by Friday, and another next week.

Kohout moved to approve the NDOR Urban Area Boundary Map as presented, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were McDermott, Luedke, Henning, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Under Correspondence, Kastanek reported that Deputy Fikar had approved four special designated licenses for Saline Center, and she had received a check for \$697.02 for recycling rebate.

Luedke reported attending the Visitors' Committee meeting held at the Pour House in Friend; and RC&D meeting, where they finalized plans for the Household Hazardous Waste collection on August 15 from 2:30 - 4:00 p.m. in Crete; a meeting with the contractors and noting that the sheet piling on the north side of the Court House will not work as there is too much sand, so they will be using auger cast pilings across the north side of the Court House; the construction crew is working on the parking lot across the street; and he attended the Nestle Open House.

Kohout attended the County Fair; the SCAT pie and ice cream social in the new SCAT building at the Western picnic; the Historical Society meeting; a Planning and Zoning meeting, where they approved three minor sub-divisions; a Wellness Committee meeting; he received a check from Citizens State Bank in Friend for upkeep of the Gilbert Cemetery; he noted that several farmers are irrigating and not turning off the end guns on their pivots, this needs to be reported to the Sheriff if you come across one spraying on the roads; (Kastanek noted that she had put the legal notice in the papers regarding pivots spraying the roads).

County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the agenda with the addition of Masonic Lodge lease agreement, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Kohout, Luedke and McDermott, nays none, motion carried.

McDermott moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Luedke, Krivohlavek, McDermott and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Zach Pilfold and Wess Robotham with CASA updated the Board on current and recent activities. Pilfold noted that three children have been assigned CASA volunteers and 6 children are on the waiting list. They requested \$5,000.00 for support for the next fiscal year. They also apply for grants through CASA of Nebraska.

Henning advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Kohout moved to amend the agenda by moving the reappointment of appointed officials to the January 12, 2016 meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Krivohlavek and Kohout, voting nay were McDermott and Luedke, motion carried.

Kohout moved to approve the agenda as amended, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Krivohlavek and McDermott, voting nay, Luedke, motion carried.

McDermott moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Luedke, Krivohlavek, Henning, McDermott and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Under Citizens Forum, Zach Pilfold of Southeast Nebraska CASA introduced Cindy Essam of Beatrice as a new CASA representative. He reports that there are now approximately 30 representatives in the region.

Kohout also attended an employee handbook meeting, a meeting in the Friend shop and a Wellness meeting.

McDermott reported a Union negotiation meeting, a Wellness meeting, a SENDD Executive Board meeting, a meeting with the Courthouse addition contractors, a Juvenile Services meeting, where they worked on the Juvenile Services Aid Grant, an Identity and Marking meeting and has a meeting on the 31<sup>st</sup> with Sheriff Moore and Jefferson County Emergency Manager John McKee in the Emergency Operations Center. He also has a Drug & Alcohol Coalition meeting on January 7.

Luedke moved to approve the Sheriff's Report of Fees for November, showing Writ Fees: \$1,290.00; Mileage: \$1,013.35; Inspections: \$\$340.00; Gun Permits: \$60.00; and Miscellaneous: \$6.00; totaling \$2,709.35.
