

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:33 a.m. on Tuesday, January 8th, 2019, by Chairperson Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Janet J. Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, Russ Karpisek and Philip S. Hardenburger, Commissioners, County Clerk Daryl Fikar and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three County newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Karpisek moved to approve the agenda with a change to move the County Surveyor interview to Executive Session, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Kohout, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the minutes of the December 26th, 2018 regular meeting, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, abstaining, Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving a notice of vehicle recalls and a notice of the high level of influenza occurrence, both from Public Health Solutions.

Henning reported that she has a Blue Valley Community Action meeting on January 15th and a Public Health Solutions meeting on January 17th.

Hardenburger reported that he will be attending a Blue Valley Community Action meeting on January 15th and a Saline County Agricultural Society meeting on January 16th.

Kohout reported that the Saline/Seward Solid Waste Committee meeting that was scheduled for December 27th was postponed due to the weather, and that he has a Saline County Wellness Committee meeting on January 10th.

Krivohlavek reported that she has a Veteran's Service Board meeting on January 10th.

Karpisek reported he has an Employee Wellness Committee meeting scheduled for January 10th, but he has a scheduling conflict and will be unable to attend.

McDermott reported that he received and distributed the Continuum mid-year report, he has orientation training for his new position on the NIRMA Board of Directors on January 25th, he reminded the Board of the Wellness Committee training tomorrow at the Extension Office, which will deal with self-defense training. On Thursday, he has an Employee Wellness Committee meeting. On January 17th, the State Fire Marshall will be in the courthouse to do the final inspection of the addition and renovation and on January 22nd he will be participating in a union negotiation meeting.

Karpisek moved to adjourn sine die with County Attorney Tad Eickman as acting chairman, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Karpisek, Hardenburger and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried. Purpose of this action is to reorganize and elect or re-elect a Chairmerson and Vice Chairmerson

Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson.

County Attorney, Tad Eickman, asked for nominations from the floor for Chairperson. Henning nominated Kohout, seconded by Krivohlavek. Henning then moved that nominations for Chairman cease, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Krivohlavek and Karpisek, abstaining Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Eickman announced that the nominations would cease and a voice vote would be used to elect the Chairperson. Voting aye for Kohout were Karpisek, Hardenburger, Krivohlavek and Henning, abstaining Kohout. Kohout receiving the majority of votes is elected as Chairperson of the Board of Equalization and Board of Commissioners for the 2019 calendar year.

Kohout then asked for nominations from the floor for Vice-Chairperson. Krivohlavek nominated Karpisek. After repeating the call for nominations three times, Henning moved that the nominations cease, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Kohout, abstaining



Karpisek, nays none, motion carried. Voting aye for Karpisek were Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Henning, abstaining Karpisek. Karpisek receiving the majority of votes is elected as Vice-Chairperson of the Board of Equalization and Board of Commissioners for the 2019 calendar year.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the 2019 appointments, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Karpisek, Hardenburger, Kohout, Henning and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:08 a.m., Henning moved to enter closed session, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Henning, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Hardenburger and Kohout, nays none, motion carried. Kohout announced that, during Executive Session, the Board would be conducting an interview for the County Surveyor position.

At 10:22 a.m., Karpisek moved to exit closed session, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Henning, Krivohlavek and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried. Kohout announced that, during Executive Session, the Board interviewed for the County Surveyor position and no action was taken.

Krivohlavek moved that the Board appoint Nick Siedschlag to the position of Saline County Surveyor, with the term ending on December 31, 2022. The motion was seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Hardenburger, Kohout and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Saline County Juvenile Diversion Program Administrator Anita Stougard presented a Memorandum of Understanding between Saline County, Katie Meyer and Crete Public Schools to implement the School Intervention Worker Program. Krivohlavek moved to approve the MOU, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Kohout, Henning, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Stougard then presented a Memorandum of Understanding between Saline County, Mikayla Parriott and Crete Public Schools to implement the School Intervention Worker Program. Karpisek moved to approve the MOU, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Hardenburger Kohout, Henning and Krivohlavek, , nays none, motion carried.

At 10:30 a.m., Nebraska State Senator Elect Tom Brandt introduced himself to the Board, detailing his background and experiences. He informed the Board that he would be sworn in to office on Wednesday, and is excited to begin work. He stressed that he sees one important part of his new job will be tax reform, as this is what he sees as his constituents' main concern.



At 10:50 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would recess.

At 11:02 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would reconvene.

Mark Headrick with Liberty Bankers Life Insurance Co. made a verbal presentation and asked the Board for their permission to present his company's products to the Saline County employees. The Board gave him verbal permission.

At 11:18 a.m., Weed Superintendent Lyle Weber gave his annual budget report, activity report and watch list and infestation reports to the Board. He also presented his 2019 noxious weed control plan.

At 11:23 a.m., Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi updated the Board on various road and bridge projects going on around the County. He noted that Saline County has applied for a tire clean-up grant.

Saline County veterans Dick Whittington, Roger Glenn, Larry Kaspar, Glen Pieper, Dennis McElravy and Phil Weber were present to voice support for the reappointment of Forrest Doyle as Saline County Veteran's Service Officer.

At 11:43 a.m., Krivohlavek moved to enter closed session, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Kohout, Hardenburger and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried. Kohout announced that, during Executive Session, the Board would be discussing a personnel matter.

At 12:17 p.m., Henning moved to exit closed session, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning and Kohout, nays none, motion carried. Kohout announced that, during Executive Session, the Board discussed a personnel issue and no action was taken.

McDermott presented the contract with SparqData Solutions for services and software related to electronic meeting administration. He noted that the set-up fee is \$500.00 and the yearly subscription fee is \$2,500.00. Henning moved to approve the contract, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

At 12:31 p.m., Henning moved to approve the Clerk of the District Court's report of fees for December in the amount of \$5,928.47, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Hardenburger, Krivohlavek and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the Sheriff's Report of Fees for December, showing Writ Fees: \$1,431.00; Mileage: \$1286.50; Vehicle Inspections: \$280.00; Gun Permits: \$75.00 and Miscellaneous: \$12.00 totaling \$3,084.50. Motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning, Kohout and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the County Clerk's report of fees for December in the amount of \$28,131.25, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenburger, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2019-001, transferring \$15,000.00 from the Inheritance Tax Fund #2700 to the General Fund #0100, to be reimbursed when funds become available. The motion was seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Kohout, Hardenburger and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2019-002, transferring \$65,000.00 from the Inheritance Tax Fund #2700 to the Road and Bridge Fund #0300, to be reimbursed when funds become available. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the claims as presented, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenburger, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Under correspondence, Bartels reported receiving a \$2,350.00 check from the Village of Swanton for 1st quarter Law Enforcement; the December 20th, 2018 minutes from the Five Rivers RC&D Council Meeting; the January 15th, 2019 Blue Valley Community Action Board of Directors meeting agenda; the January 17th, 2019 SENND meeting agenda; January 17th, 2019 Five Rivers RC&D Council meeting agenda; the January 18th, 2019 Crete City Council Special Meeting agenda; the January 28th, 2019 Saline County Aging Services Advisory Board meeting agenda; the November 20th, 2018 Blue Valley Community Action Partnership Board of Directors; a copy of the November-December 2018 Blue Valley Community Action news clippings; a staff member of Adrian Smith's office will hold a Mobile Office on February 5th, 2019 at the Saline County Courthouse Assembly Room; and received a letter from the Southeast Nebraska Area Health Education Center, informing they are hosting a third-year medical student for his rural family practice at the Crete Area Medical Center.

Kohout reported last week attended the Self Defense 101 class presented by Deputy Vogel, a Mutual Aid meeting, and a NACO telephone conference regarding the bills being sponsored in the Legislature; March 1st, 2019 is the Employee Recognition Banquet; will be attending a NACO Board of Directors meeting on Thursday; a Wellness Calculation Meeting on Thursday; and will be attending the NACO Legislative all day session on Friday.

County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three County newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Kohout, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the minutes of the January 22nd, 2019 regular meeting, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenburger, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving the September 10th and November 5th meeting minutes from the Regional Governing Board, and the semi-final inspection report from the State Fire Marshall.

Under report of officials, Henning reported that she will be attending a Region V meeting on February 11th.

Hardenburger reported attending the new County Board Member Training in Lincoln on January 26th, a Saline County Aging Services meeting on January 28th, the audit exit interview on January 30th and the union negotiations on January 22nd.

Kohout reported attending an employee recognition banquet planning meeting on January 23rd, a NACO Board meeting two weeks ago, a Saline County Diversion meeting, a Seward/Saline Solid Waste Committee meeting last Thursday and an Employee Wellness Committee meeting.

Krivohlavek reported attending a Saline County Aging Services full board meeting on January 28th.

Karpisek reported attending the union negotiations on January 22nd.

McDermott reported he participated in the union negotiations on January 22nd, an Employee Wellness Committee meeting, the orientation for his new position on the NIRMA Board of Directors, a CURB Coalition meeting on January 28th, the auditor exit interview on January 30th, a warranty walk through with Berggren Architects, the semi-final inspection with the State Fire Marshall and, coming up, he has a Continuum Leadership class next Tuesday, the Employee health fair on February 12th and 13th, and an Employee Safety Committee meeting on February 13th.

At 9:48 a.m., Jerad Reimers, Community Liaison for Congressman Adrian Smith's office was present to update the Board on the activities of his office. He reports on the work that the Congressman is involved in concerning his ability to help his constituents with government services such as social security and passports. Karpisek expressed his concern over the fact that federal government monies are continually being reduced, putting more pressure on local governments. Reimers will pass that information along to the Congressman.

At 9:58 a.m., Aging Services Director Lori Moldenhauer updated the Board on various programs that her office is initiating or expanding, including Tai Chi, Full Circle pop-ups and a 5K fundraiser named "shamrock shuffle" that is scheduled for March 16th. Bids were opened and read from Nebraska Machinery Co. of Lincoln and from Murphy Tractor and Equipment Co. of Lincoln. Krivohlavek reported attending the Employee Recognition Banquet, the Leadership Academy last week, Saline County Area Transit Soup Lunch in Western on March 2nd, and has signed up for the Shamrock Shuffle on March 16th.

The Board requested Windstream provide a ROW Contract to Tad Eickman and to notify the landowners before the installation.



At 10:09 a.m., Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi opened discussion regarding the semi-truck dispatch issue to Smithfield, Cold Storage, Americold, and Crete Core. Paul Doremus with Smithfield and Jessica Placek with Crete Core were also present. It was agreed the best way to resolve the issue of semi-trucks being routed incorrectly was to change the name of the road between Smithfield and the cold storage plants, from I Road. Filipi is to contact the City of Crete and research a new name for this stretch of road. Further discussion will be held during a Public Hearing at the April 2nd, 2019 Board meeting.

At 10:27 a.m., Under Citizens Forum, Pam Wakeman, a resident of Lancaster County, addressed the Board regarding the effect the Costco Chicken Farm will have on the Saline County Roads. Wakeman stated there are to be 1.6 semi-trucks per day and 30 semi-trucks six times a year when the chickens are ready for processing. Wakeman inquired if the Board was considering a Road Maintenance Agreement.

At 10:37 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would recess.

At 10:54 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would reconvene.

Discussion was held on the State Auditor's Audit Report and the signing of the response letter. Clerk of the District Court Amber Mulbery and Saline County Treasurer Deb Spanyers reported sending their responses directly to the State Auditor. The Board will solicit a determination from County Attorney Eickman if a motion and resolution is needed to amend the allocation of funds for the Veteran Memorial Maintenance.

Henning moved to authorize the signing of the Auditor's response letter, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Krivohlavek, Kohout, abstain Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2019-12 to establish the fee schedule for Saline County Zoning Applications, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenburger, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Under report of officials, Henning reported that she had attended a Public Health Solutions Board meeting last Thursday and a Blue Valley Community Action meeting on March 19th. She will attend a Region V meeting next Monday.

Hardenburger reported attending a Blue Valley Community Action meeting on March 19th, a 5 Rivers RC&D meeting on March 21st, a Continuum EAP Leadership class on March 26th and has fielded several road complaints.

Kohout reported attending a Saline/Seward solid waste meeting a week ago, a Fillmore County Board meeting to observe their use of the Sparqdata software, he has fielded several road complaints. He also attended a meeting with Pictometry Imaging and FEMA last week, and an Employee Wellness Committee meeting yesterday.

Krivohlavek reported that she attended a Saline County Aging Services full board meeting on March 25th and she fielded one road complaint.

Karpisek reported attending a SENDD meeting in Lincoln and an Employee Wellness Committee meeting yesterday.

McDermott reported attending a Continuum leadership class on March 26th, a WorkWell meeting, reporting that attendance at their classes will help Saline County when applying for a grant from NACO. He attended an Employee Wellness Committee meeting yesterday and will attend a NIRMA Board meeting on April 11th. McDermott also reports that Cheever Construction will be in the building during the next two weeks to get everything ready for the Fire Marshall final inspection on April 17th. Also coming up, the mason will be on site to begin repairs to the old jail garage on April 8th or 9th.

At 9:51, Chief Probation Officer of Probation District 1, Jeremy Behrends presented his annual report to the Board. He noted that, since last year, District 1 has changed in that Nuckolls and Clay Counties are now part of District 10, but that Otoe County is now part of the eastern half of District 1. He went on to detail some of the education programs that are offered by the Probation Office. He noted that the new offices in the courthouse are working very well.

At 10:03 a.m., Henning moved to open the public hearing to discuss changing the name of that section of County Road I between Highway 103 and County Road 2250. Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi informed the Board that he has checked the names of all other roads in Saline County and does not believe that renaming that stretch of road as "Industrial Road" will cause any confusion. He noted that the reason for the



name change is to attempt to make it clearer to the electronic mapping systems such as Garmin or Tom Tom, as well as Google maps, the location of Smithfield Foods and Crete Cold Storage.

At 10:10 a.m., Henning moved to close the public hearing, seconded by Karpisek.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2019-015, renaming that section of County Road I between State Highway 103 and County Road 2250 as Industrial Road. The motion was seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger and Kohout, nays none, motion carried. Filipi suggested that the "County Road I" sign remains along with the new "Industrial Road" sign for several months in case drivers are looking for the county road sign during that time.

At 10:12 a.m., Planning and Zoning Administrator Lyle Weber, along with Village of Western Village Clerk Donna Rut and Dwight Nickel were present to request approval of a minor subdivision for construction of a lagoon. After discussion, Henning moved to approve the application, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:20 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would recess.

At 10:31 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would reconvene.

County Treasurer Debbie Spanyers presented the Return on Public Tax Sale Report for approval. She reports that there were 22 bidders who purchased 93 out of 216 parcels. The total monies collected was \$148,166.76. Henning moved to approve the report, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Hardenberger, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:44 a.m., Veteran Service Officer Forrest Doyle gave his monthly report to the Board. Due to the recent flooding, he detailed the Nebraska Veterans Aid catastrophic aid program. He noted that any qualified veteran or family member of a veteran in need of aid may contact his office directly for information. Doyle informed the Board that he has contacted Windy Prairie and has learned that the new computer for the Veteran's memorial kiosk should be installed next week.

At 11:17 a.m., Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi reported to the Board that Rock On, Gana Trucking and Beatrice Concrete are all hauling crushed rock and Saline County is hauling gravel to be used on Saline County roads.

Filipi then updated the Board on the recent fire in the shop building in Friend. He informed the Board that he believes that it would be wiser to get rid of some of the other old buildings on the site and build a larger, more modern building. He stated that the insurance company would cover the cost of a building similar to the one that burned, as well as property that was in the building. A new, larger building would be approximately \$100,000 more. The Board requested that he get some exact estimates and come back to the Board with those numbers.

At 11:42 a.m., a new interlocal agreement with Thayer, Fillmore, Jefferson and Saline Counties was presented to fund the expenses of the District Court Bailiff. This is necessary due to the change of the District Court counties. Henning moved to approve the agreement, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Consideration of Resolution #2019-014 was rescheduled to the April 16th meeting so the Tourism and Veteran's Memorial Committees could be involved.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2019-016, transferring \$2,002.00 from the General Fund to the Employment Security Act Fund, as proposed in the 2018-19 budget. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2019-017, transferring \$1,001.57 from the Employment Security Act Fund to the General Fund, as proposed in the 2018-19 budget. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2019-018, closing the Employee Security Act Fund #1200. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.



A discussion was opened concerning the payments that Saline County is making to the various Fire and Rescue units in the County. There is a policy in place that allows for a payment of \$100.00 for each rescue call to which the Crete Area Medical Center-based Advanced Life Support (ALS) vehicle responds. This payment is made to whichever city, town or village unit is the primary responder. The discussion centered around whether this is fair to the units that may have another hospital that is closer, and is located in another county. In this case, that department would not receive the \$100.00. It was discussed whether to continue this program and include ALS units from other counties or to increase the stipend that is already paid to each organization in Saline County. This discussion will be continued at a future meeting.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2019-019, transferring \$332,000 from the Inheritance Tax Fund to the General Fund, to be reimbursed when funds are available. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2019-020, transferring \$25,000 from the Inheritance Tax Fund to the Road and Bridge Fund, to be reimbursed when funds are available. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2019-021, transferring \$180.00 from the Inheritance Tax Fund to the Employee Wellness Fund as proposed in the 2018-19 budget. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2019-022, transferring \$660.00 from the Inheritance Tax Fund to the Building Fund, to be reimbursed when funds are available. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

At 12:25 p.m., Karpisek moved to enter closed session, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried. Kohout announced that, during closed session, the Board would be discussing a personnel matter and general assistance application #2019-02.

At 1:15 p.m., Henning moved to exit closed session, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried. Kohout announced that, during closed session, the Board discussed a personnel matter and general assistance application #2019-02 and no action was taken.

Henning moved to approve the claims as presented, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:32 a.m. on Tuesday, April 16th, 2019 by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Janet J. Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, Phil Hardenburger, and Russ Karpisek, Commissioners, County Clerk Daryl Fikar and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Karpisek moved to approve the agenda with the addition of the consideration of appointing Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi as the authorized representative of Saline County for the federally declared disaster #DR-4420-NE. The motion was seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the minutes of the April 2nd, 2019 meeting, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Henning and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Under Citizens Forum, Manuel Portela of the Federal Emergency Management Agency and Javier Caltenco with the U.S. Small Business Administration were present to advise the Board of the services that their respective agencies offer, including grants and low interest loans to businesses and people affected by the recent natural disaster. Both agencies encourage people that have property damaged to register for help, even though they are unsure whether they will need it. Businesses register with SBA, individuals register with FEMA There will be a disaster recovery center in Crete, but it hasn't been decided where, yet. Also present was Emergency Manager John McKee, who informed the Board that 50 to 60 homes were affected, mainly in the Blue River Lodge and NW Crete areas.

At 10:04 a.m., the Saline County Tourism Committee and Veteran's Memorial Committee were present to discuss the recent changes in the method of distributing tourism tax monies. Previously shared with the Veteran's Memorial Fund, this will no longer be the case, but will be split between the Tourism Promotion Fund and the Tourism Improvement Fund. It was discussed that the Veteran's Memorial maintenance fund will now be a line item in the Veteran's Service Officers budget.

At 10:25 a.m., Henning moved to approve resolution #2019-023, formalizing the method of distributing the tourism tax monies. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Hardenburger, Karpisek and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:29 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would take a short recess.

At 10:45 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would reconvene.

Courthouse Maintenance Supervisor Dan Johnson and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott presented information to the Board concerning the problems that are occurring in the County Courtroom with the HVAC system. The courtroom continues to be extremely hot, especially when the room is crowded. Johnson asked permission to change from heating to air conditioning at this time. He noted that he usually changes over during the second week of May, but would like to change earlier this year to alleviate some of the problem in the courtroom. A more permanent solution will be required in the future. The Board gave him verbal permission to shut down the boilers and start up the air conditioning.

At 11:02 a.m., the box culvert bids were opened. Bids were received from Vogtscapes, Inc. of Bennet, NE, Collins Contracting of Wahoo, NE and Van Kirk Bros. Contracting of Sutton, NE. The bids were placed on file and are of public record in the Commissioners Journal as attachments 1, 2 and 3 to these minutes. Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi thanked all bidders and announced that the bids would be reviewed and he would come back to the Commissioners meeting on April 30th at 11:00 a.m. with a recommendation.

Filipi then presented a request to occupy right of way from Unite Private Networks to bury fiber optic cable on Road 2300 north of Crete. Henning moved to approve the request, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.



Filipi also presented a request to occupy right of way from the Village of Western to bury an electric cable/utility line under County Road V 33 feet south of the south line of section 16-5-2. This is to provide utility service to the future lagoon. Krivohlavek moved to approve the request, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then updated the Board on road projects going on around the county, telling them that they continue to open roads that were closed due to the recent flooding.

Kohout presented a letter to the Board from the Nebraska Emergency Management Agency, authorizing the Highway Superintendent to act as the authorized representative for the federally declared disaster #DR-4420-NE. Karpisek moved to approve the appointment, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the Clerk of the District report of fees for March, totaling \$28,217.14. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the Sheriff's report of fees for March: writ fees \$1,851.00, mileage \$1,451.25, vehicle inspections \$600.00, gun permits \$140.00 and miscellaneous \$68.92, totaling \$4,111.17. The motion was seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the County Clerk's report of fees for March, totaling \$21,190.05, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve resolution #2019-026, transferring \$268.75 from account 2330 666 00 3 0101 to account 2516 666 00 3 0101, as indicated by journal entry 19040002. The motion was seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve resolution #2019-024, transferring \$180.00 from the General Fund to the Inheritance Tax Fund. The motion was seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Hening moved to approve resolution #2019-025, transferring \$675.79 from the General Fund to the Building Fund, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve resolution #2019-027, transferring \$7,000.00 from the General Fund to the Employee Wellness Fund, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving a federal disaster declaration fact sheet from FEMA, a notice of pipeline inspection from TransCanada, the April 11th meeting agenda from the Southeast Nebraska Emergency Management Region, the March 7th meeting minutes from the Regional Governance Board, the April 16th meeting agenda, March 19th meeting minutes and the April CEO report, all from Blue Valley Community Action, a notice of possible financial disaster assistance from NACO CEO Larry Dix and a notice of 2 public hearings for subdivision plats from the Village of Dorchester.

Under report of officials, Henning reported that she attended a Region V meeting on April 8th and has a Blue Valley Community Action meeting tonight.

Hardenburger reported that he had attended a Saline County Ag. Society meeting on April 10th, a NIRMA conference on April 11th, and has a Blue Valley Community Action meeting tonight.

Kohout reported that he had investigated several road complaints, had participated in a NACO conference call, attended a NIRMA conference in Norfolk, he attended a NACO benefits meeting last Friday, where they announced that there will be no increase in health insurance premiums for the upcoming year, and he has a Planning and Zoning meeting tonight.

Karpisek reported that he had investigated several road complaints.



McDermott reported that he attended the NIRMA conference on April 11th, he reports that Masonry Construction, Inc. is now working on the garage of the old jail building. He informed the Board that two slabs of granite that have been in the Commissioners meeting room were picked up yesterday to be cut and engraved with the county seal, to be placed in the entryway of the courthouse. On April 18th he has a NACO meeting, where they will discuss the new NACO wellness grants, on April 20th, Berggren Architects will be taking a tour of the courthouse. Next week, he will participate in several conference calls with NIRMA, on Wednesday, he has a meeting with Workwell to discuss the Governor's wellness grant, on April 22nd, a CURB Coalition meeting at Public Health Solutions and on April 29th, a Diversion meeting.

Henning moved to close the bid for auditor services, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Bids were opened and read from Dana F. Cole and Company of Lincoln, Schulz & Associates, P.C. of Beatrice and the Nebraska State Auditor's Office of Lincoln. The bids were placed on file and are of public record in the Commissioners Journal as attachments 4, 5 and 6 to these minutes. Kohout announced that the bids would be reviewed and the decision would be made on April 30th.

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:39 a.m. on Tuesday, April 30th, 2019 by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Janet J. Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, Phil Hardenburger, and Russ Karpisek, Commissioners, Deputy County Clerk Anita Bartels, County Clerk Daryl Fikar and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the agenda, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the minutes of the April 16th, 2019 meeting, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Henning and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving the March 21st meeting minutes and April 18th meeting agenda from 5 Rivers RC&D, the April 25th Executive Committee meeting agenda from SENDD, the April 8th meeting minutes from the Regional Governing Board and, from the City of Crete, their annual report of community redevelopment projects.

At 9:43 a.m., Courthouse Maintenance Supervisor Dan Johnson and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott informed the Board that, after a meeting with representatives of Berggren Architects yesterday, that there is a plan in place to solve the heating/cooling problem in the county courtroom. The plan includes the installation of an isolated air conditioning compressor in the courthouse basement and an air conditioning evaporator in the emergency generator pit. The unit would be connected to existing duct work to direct cool air into the courtroom. Johnson will solicit quotes from local businesses.

At 9:48 a.m., Paul Moyer with the Nebraska Department of Agriculture presented his annual noxious weed report to the Board. Moyer explained the states' role in noxious weed control, explaining that they have no enforcement authority, but do have oversight to ensure that the counties are fulfilling their responsibilities. As far as Saline County, he commended the Weed Superintendent, Lyle Weber, stating that, out of 3400 possible points, Saline County retained 3165 for the 2018 calendar year.

At 10:14 a.m., Henning moved to open the public hearing to discuss increasing the county building budget, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Hardenburger, Karpisek and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Fikar explained to the Board that the county building budget has been overspent due to an error entering the budget numbers. There should have been approximately \$47,000 in the fund, but only \$17,000 was entered. He also explained that the county's CPA had recommended closing the fund and including those expenses in the building and grounds fund.

At 10:16 a.m., Henning moved to close the public hearing, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Henning, Kohout and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Hardenburger moved to approve increasing the County Building Fund #4050 budget from \$17,500 to \$18,500, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenburger, Karpisek, Krivohlavek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Karpisek moved to approve resolution #2019-28, closing Building Fund #4050, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenburger, Karpisek, Krivohlavek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:18 a.m., Planning and Zoning Administrator Lyle Weber presented an application for subdivision from Tom Scheffert. Scheffert explained that he wishes to subdivide an acreage from the family farm. The acreage would include a residence, along with a sewage system, totaling 4.65 acres in the NE ¹/₄ of the SE ¹/₄ of section 24-7-2. Karpisek moved to approve the application, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, Kohout, Hardenburger and Karpsiek, nays none, motion carried.



At 10:25 a.m., Bill Voss, Vice President of the Saline County Fair Board was present to inform that their Board had concerns over having enough funding to pay for the new construction on the fairgrounds when the bills become due. They have been in contact with three different banks that are willing to lend the Fair Board up to \$50,000 until the tax monies come in to repay the loan. They are not asking the Board or the county for more money or to guarantee the loan, but they wanted to keep the Commissioners informed of their actions.

Under report of officials, Henning reported that she had attended a Blue Valley Community Action meeting on April 16th.

Hardenburger also attended the Blue Valley Community Action meeting on April 16th along with the electronics and appliance clean up in Crete on April 27th. He announced that the hazardous waste clean up is planned to be held in August.

Kohout attended a Planning and Zoning meeting on April 16th, a Mutual Aid meeting, he participated in a NACO conference call, investigated several roads complaints and attended a Youth Diversion meeting yesterday. Coming up, he has an Employee Wellness Committee meeting on Thursday and an Employee Safety Committee meeting next week. He also announced that Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Crete has been designated by FEMA as the disaster registration center for the recent flood disaster. The center will be open May 2nd through May 6th from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Karpisek investigated several roads complaints and has an Employee Wellness Committee meeting on Thursday.

McDermott attended a NACO meeting on April 18th where they discussed the application process for the new wellness grants, he gave a tour of the courthouse to a group associated with Berggren Architects, he participated in NIRMA conference calls on April 22nd and April 25th, he reports that he is working on an application for the Governor's Wellness Award. Yesterday he attended a meeting with Berggren Architects to develop a plan for the HVAC system in the county courtroom, he had a CURB Coalition meeting last night, where they discussed scholarships for Wilber-Clatonia students to attend June Jam on the SCC Milford campus, he has an Employee Wellness Committee meeting on Thursday, an Employee Safety Committee meeting on May 8th and a Regional Coalition meeting on May 9th.

At 10:52 a.m., Karpisek moved to go into closed session, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Henning and Kohout, nays none, motion carried. Kohout announced that, during closed session, the Board would be discussing a personnel issue and burial assistance application #2019-02.

At 10:57 a.m., Karpisek moved to exit closed session, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Hardenburger, Karpisek and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried. Kohout announced that, during closed session, the Board discussed a personnel issue and burial assistance application #2019-02, and no action was taken.

Henning moved to approve burial assistance application #2019-02 in the amount of \$1,300.00, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Henning, Kohout and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:57 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would take a short recess.

At 11:14 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would reconvene.

Assistant Highway Superintendent Bill Slezak made his recommendation for the box culvert project that was bid during the April 16th meeting. He recommends Vogtscapes, Inc. of Bennet, NE with a bid of \$303,045.00. Karpisek moved to approve the recommendation, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenburger, Karpisek, Krivohlavek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Slezak then updated the Board on various road and bridge projects going on around the county. He estimated that there are now only about eight miles of county roads that are still closed due to the recent flooding, and that rock and gravel hauling has slowed significantly.

At 11:23 a.m., McDermott presented a new lease agreement with Diode Communictions. Diode will provide internet service to the various county buildings in return for the County providing space to house antennae and low-powered internet radios at two rural tower sites owned by the County. Karpisek moved to



approve the agreement, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, Kohout, Hardenburger and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

At 11:27 a.m., the Board reviewed three bids for auditor services. The bids were from the State Auditor's Office at \$15,000.00 per year, Dana F. Cole & Company at \$16,250.00 for a one year contract or, for a three year contract, \$15,300.00 for year one, \$17,700 for year two and \$19,200.00 for year three. The third bid was from Schulz & Associates at \$11,500.00 for year one, \$12,000.00 for year two and \$12,500.00 for year three. Krivohlavek moved to accept the bid from Schulz and Associates with a three year contract, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Krivohlavek, Henning and Kohout, Karpisek abstaining, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve resolution #2019-029, transferring \$170,000.00 from the Inheritance Tax Fund to the General Fund, to be reimbursed when funds are available. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Hening moved to approve resolution #2019-030, transferring \$315,000.00 from the Inheritance Tax Fund to the Road and Bridge Fund, to be reimbursed when funds are available, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the claims with the addition of \$1,300.00 for burial assistance application #2019-02, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Karpisek, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Karpisek moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the minutes of the April 30th, 2019 meeting, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Henning and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

At 9:40 a.m., C.J. Johnson with Region V Systems presented their annual report and budget request.

At 9:56 a.m., Dave Merrill of Region V Services presented their annual report and budget request.

At 10:05 a.m., Karpisek moved to close the bidding for the Saline County Public Defender position, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Hardenburger, Karpisek and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

One bid was received from Gropp Law and Mediation, LLC of Wilber. The bid is \$84,000 per year for the duration of the two year contract, which is unchanged from the current contract. Also bidding \$2,000 per year additional allowance for interpreters, which is reduced from \$4,000 on the current contract. The Board will review the bid and announce their decision during the May 28th meeting. The bid is placed on file and is of public record in the Commissioners' Journal as attachment #1 of these minutes.

At 10:22 a.m., Javier Caltenco with the U.S. Small Business Administration updated the Board on the disaster claims that have been received due to the recent flooding. The claim center, in Crete, has received two claims for assistance at this time.

At 10:25 a.m., Saline County Aging Services Director Lori Moldenhauer was present to update the Board on the recent activities of her office, including the receipt of several grants. She also asked to Board to approve the hiring of Korbyn Moldenhauer as a temporary, part-time employee of her office. Upon the advice of the County Attorney, the Board approved her employment, conditional on the advertising and interviewing of any other applicants for the position.

At 10:42 a.m., Clerk of the District Court Amber Mulbery presented three items to the Board: She asked whether the leather covered doors that, prior to the courthouse renovation, were on the west entrance to the District Courtroom could be donated to the Saline County museum. The Board advised that the doors should first be declared as surplus property. The second item was to ask permission to have a locking mechanism installed on the door of one of the conference rooms on the third floor. She provided an estimate of \$673.00 for the mechanism and installation. After discussion of other possibilities, Krivohlavek moved to approve the purchase and installation of the lock, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Henning, Kohout and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried. The third item she reported was a concern by the District Court Judge that there is a large gap at the bottom of the door between the District Courtroom and the Judge's chambers, allowing conversations in her chambers to be heard in the courtroom. Courthouse maintenance supervisor Dan Johnson will check on resolutions to this problem.

At 11:14 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would take a short recess.

At 11:27 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would reconvene.

Krivohlavek moved to close the bidding for the new shop building in Friend, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenburger, Karpisek, Krivohlavek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.



One bid was opened and read from Astro Buildings. The bid, for \$159,636.00 is placed on file and is of public record in the Commissioners' Journal as attachment #2 of these minutes. Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi will review the bid and come back with his recommendation at 11:00 during the next Commissioners' meeting on May 28.

Filipi then presented a request to occupy right of way from Windstream to bore under the county road at 2376 County Road 400 to install electric cable/utility line. Henning moved to approve the application, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, Kohout, Hardenburger and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then updated the Board on various road and bridge projects going on around the County.

At 11:40 a.m., Krivohlavek moved to enter closed session, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, Kohout, Hardenburger and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried. Kohout announced that, during closed session, the Board would be discussing general assistance application #2019-02, general assistance application #2019-03 and general assistance application #2019-04.

At 12:03 p.m., Henning moved to exit closed session, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Henning and Kohout, nays none, motion carried. Kohout announced that, during closed session, the Board discussed general assistance application #2019-02, general assistance application #2019-03 and general assistance application #2019-04 and no action was taken.

Henning moved to approve general assistance application #2019-04 for the amount of \$1,864.25, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Hardenburger, Karpisek and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Karpisek moved to approve general assistance application #2019-03 for the amount of \$225.38, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenburger, Karpisek, Krivohlavek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Karpisek moved to not approve general assistance application #2019-02, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Henning, Kohout and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving a notice from the Nebraska Dept. of Transportation that Highway 74 will be closed for repair, going west from the Saline/Fillmore County line for approximately 1 mile. The work is tentatively scheduled to begin in the spring of 2020 and take approximately 70 calendar days to complete. During construction, the highway will be closed and a detour marked.

Under report of officials Henning reported that she had attended a Region V meeting on Monday and has a Public Health Solutions meeting this Thursday.

Kohout reported that he attended an Employee Wellness Committee meeting on May 2nd, he participated in a NACO conference call, attended a Dorchester Village Board meeting, and an Employee Safety Committee meeting.

Krivohlavek announced that she has a Veteran Service Committee meeting this Thursday and a Saline County Aging Service Executive Committee meeting next Monday.

McDermott reported that he attended an Employee Wellness Committee meeting on May 2nd, an Employee Safety Committee meeting on May 8th, a CURB Coalition Regional meeting in Lincoln on May 9th, he participated in a Blue Cross/Blue Shield webinar yesterday and a CURB Coalition meeting last night. Coming up, he will have a NIRMA Board meeting on May 23rd and 24th, and he announced that the date for the Fire Marshall final inspection is still up in the air due to District Court scheduling.

McDermott then presented the new Employee Wellness by-laws, explaining that the items that have been added will help Saline County when applying for grants, as some of the grant requirements were being abided by, but were not in the by-laws. Hardenburger moved to approve the by-laws, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenburger, Karpisek, Krivohlavek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Fikar presented the annual contract with Blobaum and Busboom for CPA services. The contract is for \$6,310.00, compared to \$6,150.00 last year. Henning moved to approve resolution #2019-031, transferring \$450.00 from the General Fund to the Employee Wellness Fund, as proposed in the 2018-19 budget, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve resolution #2019-032, transferring \$1,750.00 from the General Fund to the Emergency Preparedness Fund, to be reimbursed when funds are available, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the claims with the addition of \$225.38 for general assistance application #2019-03 and \$1,864.25 for general assistance application #2019-04 seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Karpisek, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:47 a.m. on Tuesday, May 28th, 2019 by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Janet J. Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, Phil Hardenburger, and Russ Karpisek, Commissioners, Deputy County Clerk Anita Bartels, County Clerk Daryl Fikar and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. Deputy County Attorney Steve Reisdorff was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Karpisek moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the minutes of the May 14th, 2019 meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Henning and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

At 9:50 a.m., John Day, Executive Director of Blue Valley Behavioral Health presented their annual report and budget request.

At 9:58 a.m., Scott Keene of Ameritas and Tom Sorensen of Edward Jones were present to update the Board regarding outstanding bonds, mainly 2012 Highway Allocation bonds. They informed the Board that, at this point, reissuing the bonds may be considered due to the lower interest rates that the County could enjoy. Reissuing all of the bonds would mean a 2.47% to 3.13% present value savings, and a partial reissue would mean a 3.58% to 4.39% savings. He also noted that the Board would have to consider the savings, but also the amount of time and work that it would entail to update the County's financials.

At 10:19 a.m., Logan Winston with EDF Renewables and David Levy with Baird Holm law offices were present to update the Board on the progress of the Milligan 1 wind energy project. They noted that, since the conditional use permit was issued, they have added 12 parcels to the project, meaning that they are now planning to erect 99 windtowers, with two different manufacturers and three different designs. They are aware that this means that they will need to apply for a new conditional use permit. They also need to finalize a road haul agreement with the County. At this time, they plan to begin construction of the towers during the fourth quarter of 2019, and begin commercial operations in the fourth quarter of 2020. The Board thanked them and asked that they keep the Board updated of any new phases of their planning and construction.

At 10:40 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would take a short recess.

At 10:53 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would reconvene.

Karpisek moved to open the public hearing for a conditional use permit application from Tom Koch.. Voting ave were Henning, Kohout, Hardenburger, Karpisek and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Planning and Zoning Administrator Lyle Weber explained that Koch intends to receive and sell firearms from a building on his property at 2049 County Road W, DeWitt. Mr. Koch explained that he does this as a favor to friends and family, and does not intend to open sales to the general public. He does not intend to sell more than 10 or 15 firearms per year. These will include handguns, rifles and shotguns.

Karpisek moved to close the public hearing, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Karpisek, Krivohlavek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Karpisek moved to approve the conditional use application for Tom Koch, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Henning and Kohout. Voting nay, Hardenburger, motion carried.

At 11:00 a.m., Pam Wakeman and Bruce Barrett made a presentation to the Board concerning the proposed COSTCO confined chicken feeding operation in Lancaster County, one mile east of the Saline/Lancaster line. They have hired an engineering firm to do a study of the Lancaster County road between the Saline County line and the proposed facility. They have estimated that it would cost approximately \$180,000 to bring the road up to the point where it would support the proposed truck traffic. They asked that the Saline County Board approach the Lancaster County Board concerning the on-going cost of maintaining the



Saline County road. The Board thanked them for the information and will take their suggestion under consideration.

At 11:34 a.m., Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi recommended Astro Buildings, Inc. to construct the new shop building in Friend. He suggested at the previous meeting that the new building be bigger than the one that burned, allowing the Roads Dept. to demolish several smaller buildings and have only two buildings on site. The cost of the new building is \$159,636.00, which is approximately \$110,000 more than the insurance company will pay to replace the old shop, due to the larger size. Hardenburger moved to approve Filipi's recommendation, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenburger, Karpisek, Krivohlavek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then commented on the conversation that took place earlier concerning the proposed COSTCO chicken facility. He believes that the road in question will be able to handle the expected truck traffic. He states that local farmers are now using semi-trucks to haul their grain, and these trucks are in comparable size and weight to the trucks that will be hauling feed and chickens to and from the facility. He will speak to Lancaster County Engineer Pam Dingman concerning the route to and from the COSTCO facility.

Filipi then presented for consideration a request to declare a Hyster flatbed trailer as surplus. The trailer has been replaced by a new unit and is no longer needed. Karpisek moved to declare the trailer as surplus property, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, Kohout, Hardenburger and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi also informed the Board that all repair projects from the 2015 flood have now been inspected and approved by NEMA, and we can expect to receive payment from them by the end of June.

Filipi then informed the Board that he attended a Wilber City Council meeting where they discussed resurfacing North Shimerda Street. He believes that the County share of the project would be approximately \$100,000.00, but there are no cost estimates available from the engineer, so he will keep the Board updated as the information is available.

A conversation then followed concerning the March 5th meeting, where Windstream introduced a project to install towers in the County right of way to supply internet to rural areas. Windstream was informed that they need to apply for permission to install their equipment in the right of way, but have not done so.

Filipi then updated the Board on various road and bridge projects going on around the County.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving a notice from SENDD that their May 23rd Executive Committee meeting was postponed due to lack of a quorum. The meeting will now be held on May 30th. He also received a notice from the City of Crete of a public information meeting concerning replacement of the bridge on the south side of Tuxedo Park. Also, the meeting minutes of the May 13th Regional Governing Board, and information from Javier Caltenco of the Small Business Administration. He reports that, statewide, as of May 21st, the SBA approved 616 home loans for \$29.9 million and 39 business loans for \$5.5 million. In Saline County, there were two home loans approved.

Under report of officials, Henning reports that she attended a Public Health Solutions meeting last week and has an LEPC meeting on June 5th.

Hardenburger reports that the 5 Rivers RC&D meeting that he was to attend was cancelled due to lack of a quorum.

Karpisek reports that he has a SENDD Executive Committee meeting on Thursday, and will be attending NACO workshops for the Board in Kearney.

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:40 a.m. on Tuesday, June 11th, 2019 by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Janet J. Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, Phil Hardenburger, and Russ Karpisek, Commissioners, and Deputy County Clerk Anita Bartels. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Henning moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Hardenburger moved to approve the agenda with the deletion of a right of way request from Windstream, which was listed twice on the agenda, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the minutes of the May 28th, 2019 meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Henning and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving a copy of a letter from NIRMA that notified the Saline County Road and Bridge Department of the approval of an ASSIST grant, totaling \$7,423.50, for bridge tonnage and safety signage.

Under Report of Officials, Henning attended a CISDA meeting and a Blue Valley Community Action meeting.

Hardenburger attended a Blue Valley Community Action meeting on June 25th and the NACO budget workshop on June 27th.

Kohout attended the budget workshop on June 27th, he has met with the County Assessor regarding valuation hearings, and attended a Seward/Saline Solid Waste Committee meeting.

Krivohlavek reminded everyone about the Western Old Settlers Picnic on July 20th.

McDermott attended the budget workshop on June 27th, the Wellness Committee cholesterol class, he participated with Berggren Architects walk-through on June 29th and will be consulting with NIFCO, ETI and Air and Fluid Management regarding the HVAC in the Roads Office. He has a CURB Coalition meeting on July 15th, and has a Wellness Committee meeting scheduled on July 17th.

At 9:41 a.m., Maintenance Superintendent Dan Johnson reported that he had received 3 estimates for new garage doors on the old jail building. The Board asked that he present copies of the estimates at the next meeting on July 23rd.

At 9:45 a.m., Amanda VanAsperen with the Southeast Nebraska Adult Drug Court presented the 2019-2020 Interlocal Agreement with Fillmore, Gage, Jefferson and Thayer Counties. Henning moved to approve the agreement, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Hardenburger, Karpisek and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

At 9:55 a.m., Shari Wurtz-Miller with CASA presented their annual report and budget request. The request will be submitted and considered during the budget hearings.

At 10:15 a.m., Warren Vyhnalek with the Saline County Agricultural Society was present to update the Board on the building improvement project that was started last year. He believes that they are close enough to completion that the building will be ready prior to the Saline County Fair. He stated that their budget request will return to the normal level, approximately \$45,000 for the next budget year.

At 10:20 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would take a short recess.

At 10:32 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would reconvene.

Gary Wooten, representing the Nebraska Czechs of Wilber and the American Legion was present to request that the Board vote to allow the Nebraska National Guard to land and display a helicopter in the parking lot north of the courthouse. After a discussion about liability, the Board requested a letter from the National Guard holding Saline County harmless for any damage or injuries that may occur due to the helicopter and other equipment being present. Karpisek moved to approve the request, contingent upon the approval of the letter by



the Saline County Sheriff's Office and the Saline County Attorney's Office. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:47 a.m., Planning and Zoning Administrator Lyle Weber was present to inform the Board of a formal complaint that he had received from Sandra Koll, concerning the conditional use permit extension that was granted to the Milligan 1 wind tower project. The complaint states that the extension could not have been granted because the original conditional use permit should have been revoked when there was no commencement of development within the one-year deadline. Speaking on behalf of the complaint were Sandra Koll, Jeff Koll, Gary Veprovsky and Chuck McKay.

In an answer to the complaint, it is the opinion of the Deputy Saline County Attorney that, since the Board of Commissioners had determined during their March 9, 2018 meeting that development had commenced and, therefore, granted the extension, then it is valid. The County Attorney's Office also opined that, according to state statutes, the complaint would have to be filed within 30 days of the decision to extend the permit in order for the complaint to be valid. Speaking in favor of this opinion were Myron Hayek and Lumir Kotas and representatives of EDF Renewable Energy Matthew McCluskey and David Levy. Since this was a discussion only topic, no decisions were presented or finalized.

At 11:47 a.m., Emergency Manager John McKee informed the Board of an incident involving a lightning strike on the Wilber water tower. The strike destroyed some communication equipment that allows the cameras at the remote tower sites to be viewed, as well as equipment for the Nebraska Regional Interoperability Network, which allows towns and counties to communicate with each other. McKee will investigate to see who is responsible for insurance on the equipment.

McKee then informed the Board that we are still having problems with the lighting on the Swanton communication tower. The lights should change color at night, but are not. He states that the expenses involved in maintaining the current system are excessive, and suggests that the County switch to an LED system for the tower. He will get bids on changing to LED's and return on July 23rd with estimates.

McKee then informed the Board that he has not heard back from several Saline County communities concerning their Local Emergency Operations Plan. He will keep working to complete the LEOP.

At 12:08 p.m., Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi presented a haul route agreement between Saline County and TransCanada Keystone Pipeline, LTD. Filipi noted that this is the second agreement with TransCanada, and he was impressed that they had been very responsive to any concerns from Saline County during construction of the first pipeline. He also noted that TransCanada has provided a \$3,000,000 bond in the agreement. Henning moved to approve the agreement, seconded by Krivohlavek. Krivohlavek moved to approve the request, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then presented another request to Occupy County Right-of-Way from Windstream Nebraska, LLC to raise the cable and pedestal 3 feet off of the ground due to flooding. Krivohlavek moved to approve the request, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then presented another request to Occupy County Right-of-Way from Windstream Nebraska, LLC to install poles in the county right of way for rural internet access. They will be located at 1331 County Road N, at 1620 County Road 1900, at 2208 County Road M and at 567 County Road 1800. Krivohlavek moved to approve the request with the stipulation that all of the poles be steel, and not wood. The motion was seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then addressed the Board concerning payments that come in to his office with a debit or credit card. He states that his office has no method to process these payments, and that the Treasurer's Office does not have a category in their processing system to track his payments. County Treasurer Debbie Spanyers was



present for the conversation. Spanyers volunteered to contact the software company that they use to see if they can add a category for payments to the Roads Department.

Henning moved to approve resolution #2019-052, transferring \$130,000.00 from the Inheritance Tax Fund to the Road and Bridge Fund, to be reimbursed when funds are available, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve resolution #2019-053, transferring \$5,200.00 from the Inheritance Tax Fund to the Aging Services Fund to be reimbursed when funds become available, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, July 23rd, 2019 by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Janet J. Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, Phil Hardenburger, and Russ Karpisek, Commissioners, County Clerk Daryl Fikar and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Karpisek moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the minutes of the July 9th, 2019 meeting, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Henning and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving the Dec. 5th, 2018, January 9th, 2019, February 13th, 2019, March 13th, 2019, April 10th, 2019, May 8th, 2019 and June 12th, 2019 and all corresponding financial reports from the Saline County Agricultural Society. Also received were the Saline County Aging Services June 24th full board meeting minutes, the 5 Rivers RC&D July 18th meeting agenda and a notice from NIRMA that the Dakota County Public Safety Service Agency has withdrawn from coverage effective July 1st.

Also under correspondence, Kohout announced that he had received a notice from the Nebraska Dept. of Natural Resources, announcing a meeting to discuss the flood risk needs and concerns of people in the Turkey Creek Watershed. The meeting will be held on Tuesday, July 30th in the DeWitt Senior Center at 202 E. Fillmore, starting at 10:00 a.m. Kohout also announced that he had received copies of letters from Joseph H. Murray, P.C. LLO that were sent to the Saline County Sheriff and the Clerk of the District Court. The letters were thanking the respective offices for their hard work and cooperation during the recent murder trial in Saline County District Court. Kohout then reported having a conversation with Wayne Crosby, who lives just east of the courthouse parking lot. Mr. Crosby is still having concerns regarding moisture that is getting into his storage shed. He believes that the moisture is due to runoff from the courthouse parking lot.

Under Report of Officials, Kohout announced that he had attended an Employee Wellness Committee meeting on Monday.

Karpisek also attended the Employee Wellness Committee meeting on Monday.

Eickman updated the Board on the recent murder trial and the upcoming trial in Saline County District Court. He wanted the Board to know that they will need to budget for any expenses not yet claimed from the first trial, and for expenses for the upcoming trial.

McDermott reported that the HVAC problems in the Roads Office seem to be resolving. He reports that the annual elevator inspection has been completed, he has a CURB Coalition meeting on July 15th, he had an Employee Wellness Committee meeting yesterday, a NACO leadership academy webinar tomorrow, and reports that the Continuum EAP billing will be submitted as a claim during the next meeting.

At 9:52 a.m., Maintenance Superintendent Dan Johnson presented three estimates for new garage doors on the old jail building. The first, from Wilber Windows and Doors, is for \$4,625.00, the second, from Blue Valley Door Co., is for \$4,642 and the third, from Overhead Door Company of Lincoln, is for \$5,680.00. Johnson recommended to the Board that, since Wilber Windows and Doors is the low bid, and they are located in Saline County, that they be chosen for the doors and labor. Krivohlavek moved to approve the bid from Wilber Windows and Doors, with a bid of \$4,625.00, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Hardenburger, Karpisek and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

At 9:57 a.m., Denise Boyd with Aging Partners presented their annual report and budget request. Susan Hayek was also present to report to the Board that her father, who has recently passed away, used the services of the Saline County Aging Services office, and was very pleased with the services that he had received there.



At 10:13 a.m., Emergency Management Director John McKee presented three estimates for replacement of the FAA lights on the Swanton tower, that were discussed at the July 9th meeting. The estimates were from Zephyr Towers of Beatrice for \$23,530.25, SkyTop Towers of Malcom for \$33,288.75, and LumenServe of Austin, Texas for \$24,975.00. After discussion, Krivohlavek moved to approve the quote from Zephyr Towers. The motion was seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Henning, Kohout and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:25 a.m., Planning and Zoning Administrator Lyle Weber presented an application for a minor subdivision from Linda Gibbs to divide 3.01 acres in part of the NE1/4 of the SE1/4 and part of the SE1/4 of the NE1/4 of section 25-5-4. Weber informed the Board that the Planning and Zoning Committee had unanimously approved the application. Krivohlavek moved to approve the application, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenburger, Karpisek, Krivohlavek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:29 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would take a short recess.

At 10:42 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would reconvene.

Sandra Koll, representing Marilyn Capek, who owns the E1/2 of the SE1/4 of section 33-7-1. Ms. Capek has filed an official complaint with the Board that she refers to as an occupancy permit violation. She is referring to an application to occupy right of way that was approved for EDF Renewable Energy by the Board on June 25th. The right of way approved a request from EDF to run electric cables in the county right of way. The Board requested that the discussion be delayed until the County Attorney returns from his scheduled court appointment.

At 10:46 a.m., Saline County Treasurer Debbie Spanyers presented the semi-annual summary of collections, disbursements and balances for the six-month period from January 1st to June 30th. Spanyers reports that, as of June 30th, the total of investments and cash is \$9,356,470.72. Krivohlavek moved to approve the report, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, Kohout, Hardenburger and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:51 a.m., the County Attorney returned to the meeting and Sandra Koll was invited back to continue her testimony. She questioned why the agenda item classification was changed from "action" to "discussion". Eickman replied that there could be no action taken on the complaint, so it was changed to discussion.

At 10:54 a.m., Larry Shestak presented additional information concerning the plan to land and display the Nebraska National Guard helicopter in the courthouse parking lot. He informed the Board that the Guard had declined to send a letter indemnifying the County for any damage or injuries that occur due to the movement or display of the helicopter or any other equipment. He further explained that there are state statutes in place that allow for compensation between government entities for damage done by one or the other. He also provided a letter that the Guard requires, which provides information and permission from Saline County to the National Guard. Henning moved to approve the request to land and display the helicopter and other equipment in the parking lot, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Henning and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

At 11:03 a.m., Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi arrived, and Sandra Koll was invited to continue presenting the complaint concerning the right of way occupancy. Koll questioned whether Filipi was aware of any restrictions on what type of entity may apply for and be approved for a right of way occupancy. Filipi replied that he was not aware of any restrictions. Eickman then repeated to the Board that no action could be taken on the complaint.

Treasurer Spanyers then returned to present the delinquent tax list to the Board. The report shows unpaid principal of \$13,733.62 and delinquent special assessments of \$7,562.32. Henning moved to approve the report, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Hardenburger, Karpisek and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Spanyers then presented the list of certificates, depositories and bank pledged collateral activity.

At 11:14 a.m., Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott presented change order #015, which included change requests #PR63, PR67, PR68, PR69 and credits for PR46 and PR66. The net amount for all changes is



\$65,688.00. Henning moved to approve the change order, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Henning and Kohout. Voting nay, Hardenburger, motion carried.

At 11:19 a.m., Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi presented a request to occupy right of way from Black Hills Energy to replace a section of gas line approximately 460 feet west of County Road 2250 and Industrial Road. Henning moved to approve the request, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then presented Resolution #2019-58, a professional service agreement with JEO Consulting, providing for consulting services for project BRO-7076(25). Henning moved to approve the agreement, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then presented a request to Occupy County Right-of-Way from Wayne Havlat to bury irrigation water line under County Road F between sections 26-8-3 and 35-8-3. Henning moved to approve the request, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then presented Resolution #2019-59, an authorization for the Board Chairman to sign the fracture critical bridge inspection agreement between Saline County and the State of Nebraska Department of Transportation. Henning moved to approve the resolution, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then updated the Board on various road and bridge projects going on around the County.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Karpisek moved to approve the agenda with the addition of consideration of general assistance application #2019-06 during closed session and the presentation of the preliminary 2019-20 budget by CPA Brian Blobaum, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Karpisek moved to approve the minutes of the July 23rd, 2019 meeting, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Henning and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Under citizens' forum, Chuck McKay questioned the Board concerning a possible time limit for consideration of a conditional use permit, and whether a permit that is not approved may be considered at a later meeting without holding another public hearing. Kohout answered that he was unaware of any time limit, but he suggested to wait until the County Attorney is present to answer his question. McKay then questioned whether the towers that were permitted to Windstream for internet availability were wise, given their height. Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving a public records request from Mattson Ricketts asking for material related to the Milligan 1 windfarm and a notice from the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources advising about a discovery meeting scheduled for residents of the middle Big Blue watershed. The meeting is at 10:00 a.m. on Sept. 14th at the BPW Service Center, 500 N. Commerce St. in Beatrice.

Also under correspondence, Kohout reported receiving a letter from Terry Jessen of Oshkosh, asking that the Commissioners draft and pass a resolution to place a property tax relief issue on the 2020 ballot. He also received a letter from Milo Pesek concerning the road conditions in his area.

Under Report of Officials, Hardenburger reported that he had attended a Planning and Zoning meeting in Fillmore County.

Kohout, Krivohlavek and Karpisek reported attending the Czech Festival in Wilber, with Karpisek commenting that he believes that the National Guard helicopter display went well.

McDermott reported that, although he was unable to attend, that the teen dance during Czech Days was well attended and went well. The meeting will be on Sept. 4th at 10:00 a.m. at the BPW Service Center in Beatrice. He also received a notice from Ameritas that several of their investment bankers had resigned, and notified the Board that Saline County had received a NACO wellness grant.

Under Report of Officials, Hardenburger reported that he had attended a Saline County Agricultural Society meeting on Wednesday.

Kohout reported that he had participated in a NACO Education Committee conference call, as well as a NACO Board of Directors conference call, where they discussed and advised against signing any resolution recommended by True Nebraskans, and that they had discussed an opioid settlement, where the states would receive monies from the pharmaceutical companies based on the number of cases in each state. Kohout also attended an Employee Wellness Committee meeting yesterday, has an Employee Safety Committee meeting tomorrow and a Planning and Zoning meeting tonight. He also reminded the Board of the NIRMA self-defense conference on October 3rd and 4th.

Krivohlavek noted that the Tourism grant applications that are online are outdated and that the deadline for completing and submitting the applications is November 1st.

Karpisek reported that he had attended the Employee Wellness Committee meeting yesterday.

McDermott reported that he has been participating in the Professional Development Academy, he had a CURB Coalition meeting on August 12th, that the County had received only one bid for modifications to the HVAC system in the County Courtroom. He has contacted Unite Private Networks concerning a possible switch for the phone and internet systems. He attended an Employee Wellness Committee meeting yesterday, has an Employee Safety Committee meeting tomorrow, a NIRMA Board of Directors meeting on Thursday and Friday and will be attending a Continuum Leadership Academy class on August 27th.



At 9:49 a.m., Henning moved to approve the County Clerk's report of fees for July in the amount of \$13,819.50. The motion was seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Hardenburger, Karpisek and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:01 a.m., Sandra Koll and Gary Veprosky addressed the Board, asking that there be declared a six month moratorium on any and all wind development in Saline County. Koll explained that she believes that considerations need to be made in the County's Planning and Zoning regulations concerning aircraft lights on the towers, noise levels of the generators, the height of the towers, a more comprehensive environmental impact statement, interference of over the air television signals, and lowering of property values. Veprosky believes that the County should request a cash reserve to be provided for decommissioning of the towers and held in the County Treasury, he questions whether the towers will interfere with guidance systems on farming equipment and whether the tower blades will disperse applied herbicides to areas where it is not wanted.

David Levy, attorney for EDF Renewable Energy addressed the Board, stating that his opinion is that any moratorium would need to be an amendment to the Planning and Zoning regulations. He explained that EDF is only required to follow the regulations that were in place at the time of conditional use permit approval.

County Attorney Eickman explained the Board will not take any action or make any comments, due to the pending lawsuit that has been filed against the County and the Commissioners.

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, September 17th, 2019 by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Janet J. Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, Phil Hardenburger, and Russ Karpisek, Commissioners, County Clerk Daryl Fikar and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Henning moved to approve the agenda, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the minutes of the September 3rd, 2019 meeting, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the minutes of the August 27th, 2019 special budget meeting, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Under citizens' forum, Dwayne Thomas presented the Board with a list of 18 concerns that he had which involved the proposed road haul agreement with Milligan Wind 1 LLC. This agreement is on the agenda for consideration at 11:00. Mr. Thomas asked that the Board consider whether the plan is preliminary, as stated, or a final contract. He also asked that the County look at Milligan 1Wind LLC's financial statements to determine whether that company can afford to hold the County harmless under certain conditions. He also questioned the timing of any road repairs that will need to be made and whether the \$1,500,000 letter of credit would be in place prior to commencement of construction.

Next up was Sandra Koll, who questioned the quality and accuracy of the map that was provided with the road haul agreement. She noted that the map does not show the access roads what will be required and does not even have the county roads labeled. She informed the Board that she believes that there is land on the map that appears to be available for wind tower placement that was not included in the conditional use permit. Also, since the lawsuit filed by Marilyn Capek has not been settled, would any future approved right of way occupancies be legal? She also questioned whether the decommissioning plan for the wind towers has been approved.

Gary Veprovsky spoke next, questioning whether the bond, as promised in the agreement was valid and he also doubted whether the restrictions for overhead line "blowout" would provide enough protection during high wind conditions. He also commented that the map provided with the road haul agreement was insufficient to determine where the wind towers would be placed, as there are no labels for properties or roadways. He also mentioned that there are two properties that were in the area that were not approved by the Board.

At 9:56 a.m., Veteran Service Committee member Lyle Bartels and Veteran Service Officer Forrest Doyle introduced veteran Robert Kasl, who was presented a Certificate of Appreciation by Board Chairman Marvin Kohout. The certificate reads "The Saline County Commissioners wish to Recognize your military service to the United States of America. Throughout our Nation's history, it is the effort of the men and women, such as yourself, that have provided the freedoms we, as Americans, dearly enjoy today. Please accept our deepest gratitude and appreciation. Let us never forget your demonstrated sacrifice, service, love, and commitment to your country. Thank You, God Bless You, and God Bless the United States of America". After which, Mr. Kasl thanked the Board and received a standing ovation.

At 10:02 a.m., Henning moved to open the public hearing to discuss the 2019-20 budget. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried. Brian Blobaum, CPA, explained the budget process, noting that there will be a 3% overall increase in the county tax request for the 2019-20 budget year. Raising the levy by 3.0% will mean a \$217,364.00 increase in revenue over last year. This, combined with the County property valuation decrease of



1.02% results in a levy rate increase from .308551 to .321071 cents per \$100 in valuation. County taxpayers would pay \$12.52 more per \$100,000 in valuation this year compared to last year. The tax request for 2019-2020 would be \$7,462,819 compared to \$7,245,455 last year.

Prior to approving the budget, Chairman Kohout noted that during the previous budget year, the budget was set to balance by using \$1,279,000 of inheritance tax funds, but only about \$300,000 was actually used. He recommended that, instead of raising the levy by 3%, and not using all of the funds, that the Board raise the levy by 2%, which he believes would be more realistic.

Blobaum informed the Board that a 2% overall increase in the county tax request would mean an increase of \$144,909.00 in revenue over last year. This, combined with the County property valuation decrease of 1.02% results in a levy rate increase from .308551 to .317953 cents per \$100 in valuation. County taxpayers would pay \$9.40 more per \$100,000 in valuation this year compared to last year. The tax request for 2019-2020 would be \$7,390,364 compared to \$7,245,455 last year.

At 10:11 a.m., Henning moved to close the public budget hearing, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Karpisek moved that the Board approve a 2% increase in the budget over last year, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2019-079, approving a general fund property tax request of \$6,722,358, a jail bond property tax request of \$35,000 and a courthouse bond fund property tax request of \$633,006. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning called for a vote on Resolution #2019-080, Resolution of Adoption and Appropriations, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:31 a.m., Extension Educator Leanne Manning informed the Board that the course of the 2019 Crete fun run needed to be altered due to recent flooding. She noted that part of the course is now on county roads, and she would like the Board to give permission for the runners to use that part of the county roads. Karpisek moved to approve the use of the road, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:33 a.m., Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott presented two bids for the modifications to the HVAC system in the County Courtroom. The bids were from Pribyl Plumbing and Heating, Inc. of Crete for \$20,500.00 and from McCormick's Heating and Air Conditioning of York for \$17,895. After discussion concerning the fact that, were it not for the large difference in the amount of the bids, it would be best to hire within the County, Henning moved to approve the bid from McCormick's Heating and Air Conditioning, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning and Kohout. Voting nay, Hardenburger, motion carried.

At 10:39 a.m., Krivohlavek moved to approve the 2019 office and shop inventories, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenburger, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the Clerk of the District Court report of fees for August, totaling \$82,974.48. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the Sheriff's report of fees for August: writ fees \$1,554.00, mileage \$1,268.00, vehicle inspections \$660.00 and gun permits \$50.00, totaling \$3,532.00. The motion was seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the County Clerk's report of fees for August, totaling \$13,873.75, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.



Henning moved to approve Resolution #2019-081 transferring \$8,200.00 from the #0100 General Fund to the #2250 Aging Services Fund, to be reimbursed when funds become available, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Kohout, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:44 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would take a short recess.

At 11:03 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would reconvene.

McDermott presented a memorandum of understanding between Saline County, Ana Perez Mendez and Crete Public Schools to implement the school intervention workers program. Henning moved to approve the agreement, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Karpisek, Krivohlavek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving a thank you to the County Commissioners from the Nebraska Czechs of Wilber for the use of the Extension Office building for the quilt display during Czech Days, and the August 25th meeting minutes of the Saline County Historical Society.

Under Report of Officials, Henning reported that the LEPC meeting that was scheduled for Sept. 5th was cancelled, she attended a Region V meeting on September 5th and has a Public Health Solutions meeting on Thursday.

Hardenburger reported participating in the Hazardous Household Waste Collection in Crete on September 7th from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

Kohout reported that he had checked abandoned cemeteries and that they all looked well kept, he investigated several roads complaints and reported that the tire collection had better than anticipated participation, estimated at 200 tons. He has a Planning and Zoning meeting tonight.

Krivohlavek reports that she has a Veteran Service Committee meeting on Thursday and a Saline County Aging Services full board meeting next Monday.

Karpisek has a SENDD meeting this Thursday and an Employee Wellness Committee meeting on September 30th.

McDermott also reports that the LEPC meeting was cancelled, as a NIRMA Board member, he has visited with the Boards of Jefferson and Gage Counties and Blue River Community Action. He has been in contact with Unite Private Networks as a possible alternative to Windstream and he is still participating in the Professional Development Academy. Coming up, he has a CURB/Coalition meeting on the 23rd, an Employee Wellness Committee meeting on the 30th and reminds the Board that flu shots will be given in the courthouse and law enforcement center on October 15th.

Henning, Phil Hardenburger, Russ Karpisek and Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, Commissioners and County Clerk Daryl Fikar.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss, consider and possibly approve the EDF Milligan 1 LLC road haul agreement.

Notice of said meeting was posted on September 17th, 2019 in the Saline County Clerk's Office, the City Offices of Wilber and Friend, the Village Offices of Dorchester and DeWitt and the offices of the Crete News, The Friend Sentinel and The Wilber Republican

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Henning. Prior to voting, Karpisek questioned the reason for the special meeting. Kohout replied that the meeting was requested by a Board member. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nay Karpisek, motion carried.

Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi explained the changes that were made to the road haul agreement since the discussion that was had during the September 17th meeting: in Section 2 (a) "For purposes of this Section 2, County shall mean the County Highway Superintendent" is removed, any reference to actions or approvals by the County that "shall not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed" were removed, in Section 6, the Standard and Poor rating of the insurance company retained by EDF Milligan 1 Wind LLC is changed from a rating of B+ to a rating of A, and in Section 7(c), the waiting period before drawing on the letter of credit is reduced from 15 days to 5 days.

Karpisek then questioned whether the road haul agreement is part of the preliminary or final approval for the project, and whether the final approval would require a vote of the Board. Planning and Zoning Administrator Lyle Weber stated that he believes that the final approval is a function of his office.

Krivohlavek moved for a vote on the road haul agreement, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, voting nay were Karpisek and Henning, abstaining, Kohout. As a tie vote, the motion did not pass. The Board requested that the issue be placed on the agenda for October 1st, 2019.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 8:45 a.m. The next regular meeting will be on October 1st, 2019 at 9:30 a.m. in the Saline County Commissioners' Room, Courthouse, Wilber, NE.

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, October 1st, 2019 by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Janet J. Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, Phil Hardenburger, and Russ Karpisek, Commissioners, County Clerk Daryl Fikar and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Henning moved to approve the agenda with the addition of union contract discussion in closed session, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Hardenburger moved to approve the minutes of the September 17th, 2019 regular meeting, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the minutes of the September 24th special meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.,

Under citizens' forum, Sandra Koll questioned the process for the final application approval for the EDF Milligan 1 LLC windfarm project. She questioned the absence of site maps, video simulations, the final decommissioning plan and environmental analysis. She distributed a list of concerns, indicating that the Commissioners would be negligent if they were not involved in the approval of the final application, the concrete plant, the roads agreement and the roads impact statement. Karpisek informed Koll that all of the documentation that was mentioned was included in a comprehensive plan that was submitted to the Board by EDF, but since it was not yet considered, it was not yet made public.

Next up was Jeff Koll, who mentioned that, at the September 24th special meeting, County Attorney Eickman was asked to "look into" some items.

Next up was Matt McClusky of EDF, who distributed a package of information concerning the impact of wind energy on property taxes in Saline County. He informed the Board that there are two categories of taxes that will benefit Saline County taxpayers: Name plate capacity tax for above ground improvements, which will generate approximately \$3,518 per megawatt , and real property tax from improvements, including foundation of the turbine, buildings and access roads, which will generate approximately \$1,800 per megawatt. Together, it is estimated that the project will generate \$1,590,000 annually in tax revenue. Of this, 61% would go to 5 school districts in the project area, 21% to Saline County, 6% to Southeast Community College and 11% to other taxing jurisdictions. EDF estimates that the taxes generated would allow Saline County taxpayers to pay 5% less in property taxes.

Speaking next was Doris Ourecky, who introduced herself as a long time member of WIFE (women involved in farm economics). She informed the Board that she has testified in Washington D.C. concerning the benefits of wind farms and believes that the benefits of having a wind farm in Saline County should not be ignored. She countered the recent letters to the editor that have been published as misinformation.

Next was Myron Hayek, who stated that Saline County has no coal, but it does have wind. He said that he would rather listen to the sound of a wind turbine than the whistles of coal trains as they pass through the county.

Chris Krivohlavek also believes that the recent letters to the editor in the local papers are untruths. He stated that, if people have questions regarding the windfarm, they should speak to any member of the Saline County Wind Association, as they have been involved with wind energy for a number of years, and are well informed. He stated that 4% of the money goes to landowners and believes that a few people should not be able to tell the rest of the citizens what they can or cannot do on their property.



Darrel Hayek addressed the Board next, stating that not all of the rules are being followed, but he believes that they are there for a reason, and should be followed. He also mentioned that a conditional use permit has been lost.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving three items, all from Five Rivers RC&D: their July 18th meeting minutes, their August 29th meeting minutes and their September 19th meeting agenda.

Under report of officials, Henning reported that she has a Region V meeting and a CASA meeting coming up, and attended a Public Health Solutions meeting.

Hardenburger reported attending a Saline County Ag. Society meeting, where they discussed changing their insurance coverage to Nebraska Intergovernmental Risk Management Association, the same insurance company that provides coverage to Saline County.

Kohout reported that he attended a Planning and Zoning meeting two weeks ago, he attended a Youth Diversion meeting, an Employee Wellness Committee meeting and reminded the Board of the NIRMA self-defense conference beginning on Thursday and, coming up, he will be attending the legislative conference.

Krivohlavek reminded the Board that County Government Day has been changed to October 9th, she informed the Board that she will miss the Board meeting on October 15th and that she has a Saline County Area Transit meeting on October 17th.

Karpisek reported attending a Southeast Nebraska Development District meeting in Lincoln last Thursday and an Employee Wellness Committee meeting yesterday.

McDermott reports that he continues his conversation with Unite Private Networks as a possible replacement to provide our phone and internet service, he is participating in the Professional Development Academy, he will be visiting with the Boards of Seward and Pawnee Counties as a representative of NIRMA. He had a CURB Coalition meeting on September 23rd, he attended an Employee Wellness Committee meeting yesterday, he will be participating in County Government Day on October 9th and reminds the Board of the flu shots to be given on October 15th.

At 10:09 a.m., Henning moved to open the Public Hearing to consider a conditional use permit for IEA Constructors to build a temporary concrete batch plant in the W1/2 of the NW1/4 of section 3-6-2 to support construction of the Milligan 1 windfarm. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Planning and Zoning Administrator Lyle Weber explained that this issue had been heard by the Planning and Zoning Board and had passed by a vote of 8 yeas, 0 nays and 1 abstention.

Mark Donnarumma with IEA Constructors, the builder and operator of the plant, made a presentation to the Board, concerning the number of employees (15 - 20), the amount of cement that will be produced (1600 cubic yards per day), the hours of operation of the plant (7 a.m. to 7 p.m.). He also informed the Board that the plant will be operational for weeks at a time, and then be idle for weeks until work resumes. All aggregate will be purchased from local suppliers.

Karpisek questioned Donnarumma about their relationship with EDF, and whether there was an ownership interest. Donnarumma responded that IEA Constructors is a sub-contractor for EDF, but is not owned by them. Todd Eagleston with EDF informed the Board that Milligan 1 LLC is a subsidiary of EDF, and IEA is under contract with them.

Sandra Koll asked whether there is a different, updated map available, since that was one of the issues during the special meeting on September 24th. Krivohlavek said that there was a new map in the package that was supplied by EDF, but that had not yet been made publicly available. Koll then asked about the hours of the concrete plant, and whether they would ever operate outside of those hours. Donnarumma answered that there will be workers present prior to 7 a.m., but that no trucks would leave the yard before 7 a.m. Koll then asked whether "mineral processing" is similar enough to concrete production that it could be included in the conditional use permit, and whether the plant could be located in an agriculture zoned area, or whether it needed to be re-zoned to commercial.

Chris Krivohlavek spoke again, stating that, with a few exceptions, the landowners in the area are in favor of the project.



Darrel Hayek asked whether damage to the roads will be repaired as an expense to EDF or to the County. Krivohlavek answered that road repair is included in the road haul agreement, which will be considered later in the meeting.

At 10:31 a.m., Hardenburger moved to close the public hearing, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the conditional use permit for IEA Constructors to build a concrete batch plant, contingent on the passing of the road haul agreement. The motion was seconded by Hardenburger. The vote was taken by paper ballots. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning. Voting nay, Karpisek, abstaining, Kohout, motion carried.

At 10:32 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would take a short recess.

At 10:48 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would reconvene.

McDermott presented an agreement between Saline County and Anita Stougard to implement the Saline County Juvenile Service Plan. McDermott noted that the agreement, except for the dates, is identical to the agreement that was approved last year. Henning moved to approve the agreement, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:50 a.m., Maintenance Supervisor Dan Johnson presented information to the Board concerning the garage door project on the old jail building. He distributed a picture of the floor in the garage, showing a large void under the floor where the sand under the floor had settled or washed out over the years. He told of speaking to the representative of a company that could fill the void with a foam like material. The estimate for the portion of the floor that showed the void was \$3,500, and for the entire floor, \$5,000. The Board advised to get a formal quote and, if the amounts were consistent, to have the work done. Johnson also spoke of removing the old pedestal lights on the west side of the courthouse that haven't been used for years, of needing a new concrete pad where the dumpsters sit, a new dumpster pad for the Aging Services building, having a sidewalk poured north of the courthouse where people cut across the grass, what to do with the left over marble that is on the west side of the old jail building, and several ideas for the island in the parking lot north of the courthouse.

Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi presented a request to occupy right-of-way from Windstream Nebraska LLC to build out fiber for a new fixed wireless tower site between Dorchester and County Road 1800. Henning moved to approve the request, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then presented a request to occupy right-of-way from Unite Private Networks to bury fiberoptic cable at the SE1/4 of section 14-8-1. Krivohlavek moved to approve the request, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then presented a request to occupy right-of-way from Windstream Nebraska LLC to replace a buried drop to a customers' house at 1479 County Road C. Karpisek moved to approve the request, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then presented a request to occupy right of way from Windstream Nebraska LLC to replace a buried drop to a customers' house at 293 State Highway 80, boring under County Road C. Karpisek moved to approve the request, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then presented the Transportation Impact Analysis for the EDF Milligan 1 Wind LLC wind project. The analysis includes an overview, an executive summary, a detail haul route, a road study, bridge inventory and culvert evaluation, along with bridge and culvert recommendations and an overall structures index. Krivohlavek moved to approve the analysis, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Krivohlavek and Henning. Voting nay, Karpisek, abstaining, Kohout, motion carried.

Filipi then presented a County Roads Agreement with Milligan 1 Wind LLC, which details the responsibilities of EDF Milligan 1 Wind LLC and Saline County for the county roads that will be used to build and maintain the Milligan 1 wind farm. Henning moved to approve the agreement, seconded by Krivohlavek. Prior to voting, Karpisek asked whether this would be the last step prior to final approval for the wind farm, and

whether Planning and Zoning Administrator has the authority to give final approval. It was decided to wait for County Attorney Eickman to return to the meeting to give his opinion prior to voting.

Filipi announced to the Board that Saline County had received \$282,874.79 from NEMA and FEMA as aid to help pay for repairs due to damage from the 2015 flooding disaster.

Henning moved to approve resolution #2019-082, transferring \$2,700.00 from the General Fund to the Aging Services Fund, to be reimbursed when funds are available. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Hardenburger moved to approve resolution #2019-083, transferring \$250.00 from the General Fund to the Juvenile Services Aid Program Fund, to be reimbursed when funds are available. The motion was seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

At 11:25 a.m., Henning moved to approve the claims as presented, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Karpisek moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the minutes of the October 1st, 2019 regular meeting, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Under citizens' forum, Jeff Koll notified the Board that he had requested minutes from Planning and Zoning meetings on October 3rd, and has not yet received them. He mentioned that he had received minutes of the Board of Commissioners meetings, but that was not what was requested. Kohout suggested that the question wait until County Attorney Tad Eickman returns to the meeting.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving a notice from the Fillmore County Planning and Zoning Administrator of public hearings that will be held on October 22nd, 2019 by the Fillmore County Joint Planning Commission and on October 22nd, 2019 by the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors. The hearings will address the possible adoption of amendments to the Fillmore County wind energy systems regulations. Also received was an email from 5 Rivers RC&D that their October meeting has been cancelled and, from BVCA, their August 20th meeting minutes, October 15th meeting agenda, October reports to the Board of Directors and their August-October news clippings.

Kohout reported that he had received a notice from Public Health Solutions (Area Health Education Center) in Crete that they are hosting a third-year medical student for their rural family medicine rotation, and asking that we welcome them.

County Attorney Eickman returning to the meeting, Koll again asked why he has not received the information that he had asked for. Eickman replied that he was unaware of the reason and would have to check into it.

Present at the meeting was a representative of EDF, Ric Nelson, who was questioned by Karpisek a to whether any property was taken by eminent domain to complete the windfarm project. Nelson answered that the only organization that is allowed to take property by eminent domain is NPPD. Nelson continued that the substation that will be used to connect the windfarm to the Pauline Moore line, along with the land it is on will be given to NPPD after the project is complete. Nelson texted his company and found that the letter had been delivered to Saline County last week.

Kohout reported that he attended the NIRMA Self-Defense conference, he had a NACO Board of Directors meeting last week, having discussed the fact that the only county officials that are not required to attend continuing education classes are the Board, the Treasurer and the County Clerk. He also attended the legislative conference.

The Board agreed that Saline County does proclaim the week of October 23rd to the 31st as Red Ribbon Week, encouraging its' citizens to participate in drug prevention education activities all year long. Henning moved to approve the proclamation, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout and Henning, nays none, motion carried. The Board thanked the students for their involvement in this effort and encouraged them to continue presenting, by their actions, positive examples to their peers.

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:35 a.m. on Tuesday, October 29th, 2019 by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Janet J. Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, Phil Hardenburger, and Russ Karpisek, Commissioners, County Clerk Daryl Fikar and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the agenda with the deletion of consideration of resolution #2019-089, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Karpisek moved to approve the minutes of the October 15th, 2019 regular meeting, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Kohout, Henning and Karpisek. Abstaining were Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving a letter from the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice informing the County that the Saline County Jail has been inspected and found to be in full compliance. Also received was the Southeast Nebraska Development District's September 19th meeting minutes and their October 24th meeting agenda and from Saline County Aging Services, their October 24th meeting agenda. A letter from John Kreuscher of Gothenburg was sent to the Commissioners, thanking them for approving the Milligan 1 windfarm project. Kreuscher's family owns farm ground in Saline County.

Kohout reported receiving a letter from the US Department of State, notifying that the draft supplemental environmental impact statement for the proposed Keystone XL project will be available online for public viewing and comments beginning on October 4, 2019.

Under report of officials, Henning reported that she attended a Blue Valley Community Action meeting last week and has a Region V meeting on November 4th.

Kohout reported that he attended a mutual aid meeting in Friend, where representatives of Milligan 1 LLC presented Saline County Fire Departments a check for \$15,000.00. He also attended the Governor's Wellness Award Banquet, the Southeast District NACO meeting in Lincoln and an Employee Wellness Committee meeting last week.

Krivohlavek reported that she had attended a Saline County Aging Services Board meeting yesterday. She reminded the Board that the Full Circle program will address Alzheimer's during the November program, have a Christmas theme during the December program and will make a "scams and frauds" presentation during the January program.

Karpisek reported attending an Employee Wellness Committee meeting last week.

McDermott reported that 78 people received their flu shots at the recent offering, he attended an Employee Wellness Committee meeting, the Governor's Wellness Award Banquet, an advanced wellness committee meeting in Lincoln, the Southeast District NACO workshop, he is still participating in the Leadership Academy, he has a CURB Coalition meeting on November 4th, and informed the Board that the next Continuum class will cover employee performance reviews.

At 9:50 a.m., Planning and Zoning Administrator Lyle Weber presented an administrative subdivision for Dale Schmidt. They are selling the acreage in the NE ¼ of the NW ¼ of section 23-7-4, and wish to adjust the boundaries to better define the property. Henning moved to approve the application, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

At 9:56 a.m., Veteran Service Committee member Lyle Bartels and Veteran Service Officer Forrest Doyle introduced veterans Charles and Lambert Zoubek, who were presented Certificates of Appreciation by





Board Chairman Marvin Kohout. The certificates read "The Saline County Commissioners wish to Recognize your military service to the United States of America. Throughout our Nation's history, it is the effort of the men and women, such as yourself, that have provided the freedoms we, as Americans, dearly enjoy today. Please accept our deepest gratitude and appreciation. Let us never forget your demonstrated sacrifice, service, love, and commitment to your country. Thank You, God Bless You, and God Bless the United States of America". After which, the Zoubek's thanked the Board and received a standing ovation.

At 10:05 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would take a short recess.

At 10:19 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would reconvene.

Aging Services Director Lori Moldenhauer was present for a discussion concerning her budget. The history of her office was discussed, outlining the fact that, when first opened, the office was technically "owned" by Aging Partners, and then was taken over by Saline County. The employees, at first, were considered as employees of Aging Partners, but were later also taken over by the County. This has presented a problem with budgeting for the Director, as the contribution by the County has not increased enough to cover the salaries and other expenses of the office. It was decided that the County Clerk would calculate what the County contribution should be, based on the salaries of the Director and office staff. A resolution will be presented for consideration at the next meeting on November 12th.

At 11:18 a.m., Emergency Management Director John McKee presented Resolution #2019-091, approval of the 2019 Local Emergency Operations Plan for Saline County. Henning moved to approve the resolution, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger and Kohout, nays none, motion carried. McKee then updated the Board on the DeWitt stream gauge, telling them that the Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality has pulled their funding for the gauge, leaving the entire expense to the Natural Resources District. However, he says that there are several other agencies that may be interested in helping with the expense to keep the gauge operating. Karpisek volunteered that the Southeast Nebraska Development District has been having discussions about helping with the expense.

At 11:38 a.m., Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi presented a request to occupy right-of-way from Windstream Nebraska LLC to replace 215 feet of drop line at 371 County Road E. Henning moved to approve the request, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then presented a request to occupy right-of-way from Windstream Nebraska LLC to build out fiber for a new fixed wireless tower site near County Road M and Highway 103. Henning moved to approve the request, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then presented a request to occupy right-of-way from Windstream Nebraska LLC to replace 190 feet of buried drop to a customers' house at 2376 County Road 400. Karpisek moved to approve the request, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:34 a.m. on Tuesday, November 12th, 2019 by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Janet J. Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, Phil Hardenburger, and Russ Karpisek, Commissioners, County Clerk Daryl Fikar and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Hardenburger moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Karpisek moved to approve the minutes of the October 29th, 2019 regular meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Henning, Karpisek and Krivohlavek and, nays none, motion carried.

Under Citizens Forum, Ric Nelson with EDF Renewables updated the Board on progress being made with construction of the Milligan 1 windfarm. He said, above all else, safety is their priority. He informed the Board that all employees are picking up any trash that they find. They have created 30 roads to the work sites, pouring cement for the foundations, installing culverts as needed. Krivohlavek questioned Nelson, stating that she had received an email from a citizen, questioning the total wattage of the project. Nelson answered that all of the plans had been approved by their engineers and by NPPD. He said that the towers themselves will not be at maximum output, and that there is a voltage loss from the point of generation to where the lines connect to the substation, so this will also drop the wattage. Nelson noted that they have installed warning signage on the roads that are being used by the cement trucks, and that some of them have already been stolen. They are going to put the signs up in a more permanent manner. Krivohlavek is concerned that she has seen postings on social media, joking about hunting in the area where construction is taking place. She reports that she is concerned about the safety of the workers. Nelson responded that anyone working on the project is required to wear a safety vest, helmet and boots.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving the October 27th meeting minutes from the Saline County Historical Society, and a summons from Mattson Ricketts Law Firm naming Saline County and companies involved in building the Milligan 1 windfarm. All are being sued by Alan Brunkow, Debbie Brunkow, Gary Veprovsky, Dennis Pallas, Deborah Pallas, Charles McKay and Rebecca McKay. The suit is challenging the validity of the conditional use permit issued by the County to construct the windfarm.

Kohout reported that he had received a letter from a Saline County resident, stating that she had received a note from the Milligan 1 wind project, thanking her for supporting the project, but she states that she is against the project. Kohout also received, from the Saline County Attorney's Office, a notice of two tax foreclosures.

At 10:00 a.m., Sheryl Kastanek and Gary Wooten of the Saline County Tourism Committee presented the list of organizations that they had approved for tourism grants. Hardenburger moved to approve the grants, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Kohout and Henning, nays none, motion carried. The Board questioned how the vote was taken should any of the members also be members of the requesting organization. Wooten answered that, should that happen, the member would abstain from voting.

At 10:18 a.m., Veteran Service Committee member Lyle Bartels announced that the recipient of the November Veteran Certificate of Appreciation is William J. Kottas. The certificate reads "The Saline County Commissioners wish to Recognize your military service to the United States of America. Throughout our Nation's history, it is the effort of the men and women, such as yourself, that have provided the freedoms we, as Americans, dearly enjoy today. Please accept our deepest gratitude and appreciation. Let us never forget your demonstrated sacrifice, service, love, and commitment to your country. Thank You, God Bless You, and God





Bless the United States of America". As Mr. Kottas was unable to attend, the certificate was presented to Nebraska State American Legion Commander Gary Wooten.

At 10:23 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would take a short recess.

At 10:42 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would reconvene.

Aging Services Director Lori Moldenhauer was present to ask approval of Saline County Aging Services Board member Trudy Kubicek. Henning moved to approve Kubicek as a Board member, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Henning, Karpisek, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Krivohlavek moved to approve Resolution #2019-093, transferring \$6,597.58 from the General Fund health insurance line to the Aging Services Fund, to reimburse for premiums that were paid from Aging Services. The motion was seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Kohout, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

The Board then resumed the discussion concerning the Aging Services budget. Fikar had calculated what the salaries will be for the 2019-20 fiscal year. Henning moved to approve Resolution #2019-094, transferring \$92,306.34 from the General Fund to the Aging Services Fund, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Kohout, nays none, motion carried. Discussion was had concerning how the salaries for Aging Services would be paid for the 2020-21 budget year. Fikar offered that there should be a line item created in the General Fund, and pay the salaries of Aging Services staff from there.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2019-092, setting a fee schedule for Saline County Offices, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

At 11:06 a.m., County Treasurer Debbie Spanyers presented her distress warrant report for 2018 taxes. She reports that she has turned over 67 warrants, valued at \$43,681.74 to the County Sheriff for collection.

Henning moved to approve the Clerk of the District Court report of fees for October, totaling \$46,587.90. The motion was seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the Sheriff's report of fees for October: writ fees \$1,937.00, mileage \$1,736.50, vehicle inspections \$590.00 and gun permits \$65.00, totaling \$4,328.50. The motion was seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the County Clerk's report of fees for October, totaling \$17,229.53, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Under report of officials, Henning reported that she attended a Region V meeting on November 4th and has another on November 18th. She also has a Public Health Solutions meeting on November 21st.

Hardenburger reported that he had attended a Saline County Tourism Committee meeting on November 7th, and on the 4th, the Saline County Long Term Recovery Team meeting in DeWitt.

Kohout reported that he had attended an Employee Recognition Committee meeting, informing the Board that it was decided to have the banquet on March 28th, 2020 at the Legion Hall in Wilber.

McDermott reported attending a CURB Coalition meeting, he has been in contact with Bill Donnelly, the are supervisor for the US Census Bureau. They are still looking for workers for the 2020 census. He reports that he has completed the Professional Development course, he has a regional Coalition meeting this Thursday, an Employee Wellness Committee meeting on the 18th, a Continuum class on the 19th, an Employee Safety Committee meeting on the 20th, and reminds the Board of a Wellness class on the 20th.

At 11:30 a.m., Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi presented Resolution # 2019-095, the Annual Certification of Program Compliance for the Nebraska Board of Public Roads Classifications and Standards. Henning moved to approve the resolution, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.



Filipi then updated the Board on road and bridge projects going on around the County. He then asked for and received permission to investigate the possibility that Saline County may be able to trade in a motor grader, and not be billed until the next fiscal year.

Kohout reported that he had attended an Employee Wellness Committee meeting on November 18th and an Employee Safety Committee meeting on November 20th.

Karpisek reported that he had attended an Employee Wellness Committee meeting on November 20th.

McDermott reported attending a Regional Coalition meeting on November 14th, an Employee Wellness Committee meeting on November 18th, a Continuum class on November 19th, an Employee Safety Committee meeting on November 20th and an Employee Wellness class on the evening of November 20th. Coming up, he will be scheduling meetings of the Saline County Handbook Committee, a NIRMA meeting on December 5th and a Diversion meeting and a CURB Coalition meeting on December 9th.

Maintenance Supervisor Dan Johnson addressed the Board, informing them that the new doors have been installed on the old jail building, but there is still some work to do on the roof drain that was routed inside the garage. He also states that the new heat pump for the County Courtroom is installed and has been working properly.

At 9:55 a.m., Bill Donnelly with the U.S. Census Bureau addressed the Board, telling them that recruiting census workers in Saline County has been very challenging. Saline County is 89th out of the 93 Nebraska counties, and asked that the Board help in any way possible in recruiting. He noted that the



requirements for workers are that they are 18 years old and are U.S. citizens. The current pay is \$13.50 per hour, plus .58 cents per mile. The hourly rate may change at the beginning of December and the mileage rate may change at the end of 2019.

At 10:11 a.m., Tim McDermott presented the 2020 Employee Wellness Program handbook. He noted that the main change from the previous year is the option for employees to participate in an online program, where they would be issued a wearable device to track their steps. This would then be downloaded to an online program, and their points tracked online. County Attorney Eickman disagreed with some of the rules of that option, telling the Board that he believes that the number of steps required per day, 10,000 may be excessive, and that the program does not consider anything under 10,000 steps. Commissioner Krivohlavek stated that she bicycles and does weight training, which would not count under that option. Commissioners Karpisek and Kohout explained that this is a brand new offering, and would probably need to be "fine tuned" for any future programs, and that anyone could still stay with the previous method of tracking physical activity. Karpisek moved to approve the 2020 Wellness Program, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:34 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would take a short recess.

At 10:54 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would reconvene.

Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi presented a request to occupy right of way from Don Homolka to install a water line under County Road 1200 in the NE ¼ of the E ½ of section 25-6-2. Hardenburger moved to approve the request, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then presented two agreements with Speece Lewis Engineers. The first, for engineering on Saline County Culvert Project structure number C007604520P, will be charged at a lump sum of \$10,850.00 plus \$750.00 per inlet plan, \$750.00 per outlet plan and \$2000.00 if the Army Corp of Engineers requests an onsite visit. Observation of the project will be charged at \$70.00 per hour plus mileage. The second agreement, for engineering on Saline County Culvert Project structure number C007604515P has charges identical to the first. Henning moved to approve both agreements, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout, Karpisek and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Consideration of the right of way requests from Milligan 1 Wind, LLC will be delayed for two weeks to give Filipi more time to study the affected areas.

Filipi then updated the Board on various road and bridge projects going on around the County.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2019-096, transferring \$50.00 from the General Fund Adult Drug Court Fund, to be reimbursed when funds are available. The motion was seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Kohout, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2019-097, transferring \$80.000.00 from the General Fund to the Courthouse Bond Debt Service Fund, to be reimbursed when funds are available. Krivohlavek seconded the motion. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the claims as presented, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:33 a.m. on Tuesday, December 10th, 2019 by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, Janet J. Henning, Phil Hardenburger, and Russ Karpisek, Commissioners, County Clerk Daryl Fikar and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Henning, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Hardenburger moved to approve the minutes of the November 26th, 2019 regular meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Karpisek, Henning and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Under Citizens Forum, Jeff Koll questioned how and when the permits were issued for driveways to be used by the windfarm equipment. Chairman Kohout asked for Koll to hold his questions until Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi could be called to the meeting. Filipi then answered that the permits are issued as the work progresses, and the permits are needed. Koll then questioned how the boring will be accomplished on roads that are not in the road haul agreement, should the right-of-way requests from Milligan 1 Wind, LLC be approved. Filipi answered that the equipment will be brought around the section, on roads that are included.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving the December 5th Southeast Nebraska Development District Board of Directors meeting agenda. He also received, from the Saline County Agricultural Society, their July 10th, July 17th, July 19th, July 21st, August 14th, September 18th, and October 9th meeting minutes.

Kohout reported that he had received notice that both of the properties that were on the Sheriff's tax sale had sold.

Under report of officials, Henning reported that she has a CISDA meeting scheduled for December 18th.

Kohout reported that he had attended a quarterly Diversion meeting and had attended a demonstration in Beatrice hosted by the UNL Extension concerning emerald ash borers.

McDermott reported attending a NIRMA meeting on December 5th, where they considered and approved ASSIST grants, on December 9th a Diversion meeting and a CURB Coalition meeting. Coming up, he will be attending the NACO conference in Kearney and announced that the Employee Wellness meeting scheduled for December 16th may be cancelled because he and another member were able to put together the employee wellness packets, which was planned to be done on the 16th.

At 9:49 a.m., Maintenance Supervisor Dan Johnson addressed the Board, informing them that there were several heating/cooling units in the courthouse that had worn out over time. He stated that he had attempted to have them replaced during the previous fiscal year, but had received the incorrect sized units, and then time ran out before the work could be completed prior to the end of the fiscal year. The Board advised that he contact local companies and get estimates concerning the cost and time to get them replaced. He also asked whether he should contact an architect to consult on tuckpointing for the old jail building and courthouse, he informed the Board that he will have crushed rock put in the drainage area in the middle of the parking lot across the street from the courthouse, and that he plans to have new sidewalks installed from the street to the new parking lot in the spring.

At 9:58 a.m., LeAnn Manning and Anita Stougard of the Extension Office presented the 2020-21 Crime Commission Diversion Grant. They report that the grant now covers juvenile diversion, school interventionist programs, electronic monitoring, family support and, in Crete and Wilber, mental health counseling. The grant amount is \$49,498.00. Henning moved to approve the grant, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.



At 10:04 a.m., Veteran Service Officer Forrest Doyle announced that the recipient of the December Veteran Certificate of Appreciation is Floyd R. Johansen of Friend. As Mr. Johansen is now 102 years old and resides in assisted living in Seward, he was not able to attend the ceremony. Mr. Johansen joined the U.S. Army on April 28th, 1942. He served as an anti-aircraft gunner in the Aleutian Islands and the 87th combat infantry division in Europe, taking part in the liberation of survivors of the concentration camp at Dachau. He was discharged on November 29, 1945. VSO Doyle will deliver the certificate to Mr. Johansen at his residence.

He has been assigned a project to work on for the University between those two dates. He gave some background on his replacement, Nathan Mueller, who will take over his duties in the Extension Office on January 2nd, 2020. He also informed the Board that the new Engagement Zone Coordinator for this region is Megan Burda, whose office is in York.

Pryor then gave the annual report for his office, covering the time period from January 1st through December 31st, 2018. The report is on file in the County Clerk's Office.

Pryor then presented an Apple iPad that the County, through his office, purchased approximately 5 years ago.. He states that the unit will no longer run the software that they require for the county fair, and asks that the Board declare it as surplus. Karpisek moved to declare the iPad as surplus property, seconded by Hardenburger.

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, December 23rd, 2019 by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, Janet J. Henning, Phil Hardenburger, and Russ Karpisek, Commissioners, County Clerk Daryl Fikar and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Henning moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Henning, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Karpisek moved to approve the minutes of the December 10th, 2019 regular meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Karpisek, Henning and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving the November 21st meeting minutes and the December 19th meeting agenda from 5 Rivers RC&D.

Under report of officials, Henning reported attending a CISDA meeting, stating that they are moving to a new building, and the NACO Conference in Kearney.

Hardenburger reported attending the NACO Conference and a 5 Rivers RC&D meeting last Thursday.

Kohout reported that he had attended the NACO Conference, the employee Christmas party, the retirement party for Randy Pryor, and reported that the Planning and Zoning meeting had been cancelled due to lack of agenda items.

Krivohlavek reports that she has a Veteran Service Committee meeting and a Saline County Area Transit meeting, both on January 16th.

McDermott reported attending the NACO Conference, he also reports that the Employee Wellness Committee meeting scheduled for January 16th has been cancelled and that the employee health fair will need to be revised as Blue Cross/Blue Shield is no longer covering the cost.

At 9:45 a.m., State Senator Tom Brandt gave his annual report to the Board, including the topics of growth, the Youth Rehabilitation and Treatment Center, state prisons, the Imagine Act, state revenue and tax exemptions and petitions that are going to possibly be on the ballot next year.

At 10:25 a.m., Ashley Griess, the new District 1 Chief Probation Officer introduced herself and gave their annual report.

At 10:40 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would take a short recess.

At 10:51 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would reconvene.

Board Chairman Kohout presented Presidential Executive Order #13888, "On Enhancing State and Local Involvement in Resettlement". The Order has to do with allowing refugee resettlement in Saline County. Krivohlavek moved to approve the document, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Henning, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Kohout and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.
