

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:46 a.m. on Tuesday, January 7th, 2020 by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, Janet J. Henning, Phil Hardenburger, and Russ Karpisek, Commissioners, County Clerk Daryl Fikar and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Henning, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the minutes of the December 23rd, 2019 regular meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Karpisek, Henning and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Under citizens forum, Ric Nelson of EDF Renewables reported that construction of Milligan 1 windfarm is back to full speed following the holiday break. He said that they are pouring the foundation for one turbine per day and they continue to apply rock to the roads that they are using. He also informed the Board that EDF is in frequent contact with 5 different school districts, concerning the bus routes, and will consider the needs of local farmers once the planting season begins. He is aware of problems caused by local trucking companies not following the rules of EDF or of Saline County and they continue to work to correct that, stating that safety is their number one priority.

Under correspondence, Kohout reported receiving a telephone call from Tom Sorenson of Edward Jones Investments. Kohout states that he was informed that Sorenson, who previously assisted Saline County with bonds, will no longer be able to help. He also received an email concerning the road to Blue River Lodge, and forwarded it to the Highway Superintendent.

Under report of officials, Hardenburger reports that he has an Ag. Society meeting tomorrow and a 5 Rivers RC&D meeting and a Blue Valley Community Action meeting coming up.

Kohout reported that he has an Employee Wellness Committee meeting next Monday and a Saline County Historical Society meeting on January 19th.

Krivohlavek reports that she has a Veteran Service Committee meeting and a Saline County Area Transit meeting, both on January 16th.

Karpisek reports that he has an Employee Wellness Committee meeting on Monday.

McDermott reported that he has a Regional Coalition meeting coming up, an Advanced Wellness meeting in Lincoln on January 9th and an Employee Wellness Committee meeting on January 13th, which he believes, may have to be rescheduled.

At 10:04 a.m., maintenance supervisor Dan Johnson and Jerry Berggren of Berggren Architects reported on the problem with moisture entry into the courthouse. Berggren believes that approximately 30% of the building needs to be tuck pointed, as the mortar at certain points is disintegrating, allowing moisture between the blocks. He wants to do a study with a drone to get a closer look, and will report back to the Board at a later meeting. The Board asked what the charges will be for his part of the project. Berggren replied that he will charge 10% of the total, plus other reimbursable expenses which, he states, is a standard charge.

At 9:56 a.m., Veteran Service Committee member Lyle Bartels and Veteran Service Officer Forrest Doyle introduced veteran Roger A. Wolfe, who was presented a Certificate of Appreciation by Board Chairman Marvin Kohout. The certificate reads "The Saline County Commissioners wish to Recognize your military service to the United States of America. Throughout our Nation's history, it is the effort of the men and women, such as yourself, that have provided the freedoms we, as Americans, dearly enjoy today. Please accept our deepest gratitude and appreciation. Let us never forget your demonstrated sacrifice, service, love, and commitment to your country. Thank You, God Bless You, and God Bless the United States of America". After





which, Mr. Wolfe introduced his wife, Marilyn and daughters Diane and Julie. Mr. Wolfe thanked the Board, and received a standing ovation.

At 10:22 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would take a short recess.

At 10:38 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would reconvene.

Under reorganization, County Attorney Tad Eickman, asked for nominations from the floor for Chairperson. Henning nominated Kohout, seconded by Karpisek. Henning then moved that nominations for Chairman cease, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Krivohlavek and Karpisek, abstaining Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Eickman announced that the nominations would cease and a voice vote would be used to elect the Chairperson. Voting aye for Kohout were Karpisek, Hardenburger, Krivohlavek and Henning, abstaining Kohout. Kohout receiving the majority of votes, is elected as Chairperson of the Board of Equalization and Board of Commissioners for the 2020 calendar year.

Kohout then asked for nominations from the floor for Vice-Chairperson. Henning nominated Karpisek, seconded by Krivohlavek. After repeating the call for nominations three times, a vote was called. Voting aye for Karpisek were Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Henning, abstaining Karpisek. Karpisek receiving the majority of votes is elected as Vice-Chairperson of the Board of Equalization and Board of Commissioners for the 2020 calendar year.

At 10:52 a.m., Weed Superintendent Lyle Weber presented his annual reports to the Board. After discussion, Henning moved to accept and approve the reports, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Kohout, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the Clerk of the District Court report of fees for December, totaling \$26,318.26. The motion was seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.



Henning moved to approve the Sheriff's report of fees for December showing: writ fees \$1,344.00, mileage \$1,108.50, vehicle inspections \$500.00, gun permits \$175.00 and miscellaneous \$40.08 totaling \$3,167.58. The motion was seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the County Clerk's report of fees for December, totaling \$13,998.50, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve resolution #2020-001, transferring \$4,775.00 from the Inheritance Tax Fund to the Grant Fund, to be reimbursed when funds are available. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve resolution #2020-002, transferring \$206,000.00 from the Inheritance Tax Fund to the General Fund, as proposed in the 2019-20 budget. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve resolution #2020-003, transferring \$350.00 from the Inheritance Tax Fund to the Juvenile Services Aid Program Fund, to be reimbursed when funds are available. The motion was seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Henning moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Henning, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Karpisek moved to approve the minutes of the January 7th, 2020 regular meeting, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Karpisek, Henning and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Under citizens forum, Dennis Pallas presented some concerns regarding the maintenance of the county roads near his residence. He was asked to wait until the Highway Superintendent is present.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving the January 23rd agenda and December 5th minutes from SENDD, the January 21st agenda, November 19th minutes, the January report to the Board of Directors and the November and December news clippings from Blue Valley Community Action, updates from the Keystone XL pipeline project, the January 27th agenda and October 28th minutes from Saline County Aging Services, the January 16th agenda and December 19th meeting minutes from 5 Rivers RC&D and a notice from Lincoln/Lancaster Planning Department regarding a February 4th hearing to consider changes to their feedlot regulations.

Kohout reported receiving a brochure regarding information concerning the NACO Institute of Excellence, which he recommends attending. He also received a notice from the U.S. Dept. of State with information about the final impact statement of the Keystone XL pipeline. Kohout noted that he had received a letter from Jack Sukovaty, recommending that the Planning and Zoning Board review their regulations and consider increasing the setback for wind generation towers. He believes this is necessary due to the increasing height of the towers. Kohout also read part of a letter from Crystal Vavra, commending Saline County for approving the Milligan 1 windfarm.

Under report of officials, Henning reported that she attended a CASA meeting on January 15th and has a Blue Valley Community Action meeting tonight.

Hardenburger reported attending a Saline County Ag. Society meeting on January 8th and a 5 Rivers RC&D meeting on January 16th.

Kohout reported attending an Employee Recognition meeting, he reported that there is a need for help with the spelling contest, which will be on February 12th, he has an Employee Wellness Committee meeting tomorrow, a Mutual Aid meeting last Wednesday, where they discussed the need to change over from analog to digital radios and reported that the construction company of the windtowers, IEA was present to detail a mock disaster drill that they will be conducting sometime in the future. He also attended a hearing in Gage County District Court on the 15th.

Krivohlavek reports that she attended the hearing in Gage County District Court on the 15th, a SCAT meeting on the 16th, notifying the Board that the soup and sandwich fund raiser will be on February 29th, she attended a Veteran Service Committee meeting on the 16th and has a Saline County Aging Services full board meeting on the 27th.

Karpisek reported that he has an Employee Wellness Committee meeting tomorrow.

McDermott reported that he attended a Regional Coalition and an Advanced Wellness meeting, both on January 9th, he reminded the Board that the Continuum "Know Stress" challenge began on January 20th, he has an Employee Wellness Committee meeting tomorrow, a NIRMA Board meeting on the 24th, an Employee Handbook meeting on the 27th, a Continuum EAP class on the 28th, cyber security training in Nebraska City on



the 29th and 30th and a County Coalition meeting on February 3rd. He also reminded the Board that the deadline to sign up for the upcoming employee health fair is January 31st.

At 10:13 a.m., Leanne Manning with the County Extension Office presented and asked for approval of the 2020 Extension Board members. The members are LuAnn Jackson, Gary Baxa, Mark Strouf, Aaron Niederklein, Michele Renner, Kellen Novak, Deb Steuk, Sandy Krivohlavek, Cheryl Retherford and 4-H Council Representative Theresa Vernon. Henning moved to approve the Board membership, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Henning, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Kohout and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried. Manning then reminded the Board of the upcoming reception for Nathan Mueller, the new Extension Agent, which will be on January 24th from 3 to 5 p.m.

At 10:16 a.m., Aging Services Director Lori Moldenhauer updated the Board on activities going on in her office. She noted the recent Alzheimer's information class given by Randy and Pam Kozeal, the fraud watch class given by the Attorney General's Office, the recent Medicare Part D enrollment assistance, the grants that she has applied for and received and noted that the renovation of the Aging Services office is nearing completion in the front and she is hoping to begin renovation in the back, if funds are available.

At 10:22 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would take a short recess.

At 10:37 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would reconvene.

Clerk of the District Court, Amber Mulbery and Maintenance Supervisor Dan Johnson were present to inform the Board that the floor in the District Courtroom is in need of work. The floor is over 90 years old and consists of cork. This means that there are indentations and worn spots in the floor. They have contacted Servicemaster in Lincoln, who have given an estimate of \$4,500 to resurface and seal the floor with acrylic. The Board advised them to continue with this plan.

At 10:45 a.m., Jerry Berggren of Berggren Architects presented an estimate of the cost to tuck point the courthouse. The cost of doing the entire building, with an amount of stone repair equivalent to what was needed during the previous work in 2002 and a 20% contingency is \$274,643.40. The Board gave him verbal permission to solicit bids.

At 11:13 a.m., Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi presented a request to occupy right of way from Windstream to install a ground wire at 2273 County Road V. Henning moved to approve the request, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Kohout, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Hardenburger asked Filipi if he had any information regarding the internet towers that Windstream is installing around the County. Hardenburger stated that he had heard rumors that Windstream was receiving subsidies for installing the towers and that some, possibly, served no customers. Filipi replied that he had no information regarding this.

Dennis Pallas then questioned Filipi regarding the number of times the road graders are grading the roads around his residence. Filipi replied that there is a schedule, but he would have to check the reports of the personnel responsible for the roads. He stated that occasionally the driver must be called to an emergency, but he is not aware that this happened in this case. He also stated that dirt roads are not graded as often as gravel roads.

Karpisek then asked Filipi whether he had given permission to extend the area of the road haul agreement. Filipi replied that, due to a safety issue, he had given permission to use less than a mile of road to reach Highway 41 from the lay down yard. This will allow the trucks access to the highway without meeting other truck traffic on a gravel road.

Filipi then updated the Board on various road and bridge projects going on around the County.

The motion was seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

The Board then reviewed the County Treasurer's six month pledged collateral listing and listing of CD and fund balances ending December 31, 2019.

Karpisek moved to approve the County Treasurer's semi-annual report, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to re-appoint Bruce Filipi as Saline County Highway Superintendent, Forrest Doyle as Saline County Veteran Service Officer, Lyle Weber as Saline County Weed Superintendent and Planning and Zoning Administrator and John McKee as Saline County Emergency Management Director. The motion was seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

At 11:35 a.m., Henning moved to enter closed session, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried. Kohout announced that, during closed session, the Board would be discussing a personnel issue and burial assistance request #2020-01.

At 12:04 p.m., Henning moved to exit closed session, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried. Kohout announced that, during closed session, the Board discussed a personnel issue and burial assistance request #2020-01 and no action was taken.

Henning moved to approve burial assistance request #2020-01 in the amount of \$1,300.00, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the claims with the addition of \$1,300.00 for burial assistance request #2020-01, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:32 a.m. on Tuesday, February 4th, 2020 by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, Janet J. Henning, Phil Hardenburger, and Russ Karpisek, Commissioners, County Clerk Daryl Fikar and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Henning moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Henning, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Karpisek moved to approve the minutes of the January 21st, 2020 regular meeting, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Karpisek, Henning and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Under citizens forum, Ric Nelson of EDF Renewable Energy updated the Board on the progress of the Milligan 1 Wind project. He noted that, as of the end of January, 2020, the company had paid out to regional vendors \$1,558,211, not including per diem of \$120 to \$150 per day to the site workers. He then informed the Board about construction activities of access roads, foundations and improvements to County roads. He ended by telling of an incident that had happened between a Saline County citizen's car and a common carrier truck, where the truck had turned in front of the car. He stated that no one was injured, and EDF representatives had visited with the driver of the car to determine the damages.

At 9:50 a.m., Leanne Manning and Anita Stougard with the Saline County Extension Office presented an agreement between Saline County, Syerra Watson and Crete Public Schools, to implement the School Intervention Worker program. Karpisek moved to approve the agreement, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Henning, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Kohout and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Program Coordinator Bonnie Bleich made a presentation to inform the Board that she plans to retire, and recommends that the Board find a replacement to fulfill her duties as coordinator for the County Spelling Bee, Reading Classic and display at the County Fair. She states that she started as a part-time secretary in the County Superintendent's Office, which gave rise to her current position. After discussion, it was decided that her replacement in the Highway Superintendent's Office may be assigned her current duties.

At 10:03 a.m., Veteran Service Officer Forrest Doyle introduced veteran David E. Sebek, who was presented a Certificate of Appreciation by Board Chairman Marvin Kohout. Mr. Sebek enlisted in the U.S. Army on January 26, 1954 and was discharged on January 25th, 1957. He spent 16 months in Korea and the rest of his tour at Fort Sill, OK. The certificate reads "The Saline County Commissioners wish to recognize your military service to the United States of America. Throughout our Nation's history, it is the effort of the men and women, such as yourself, that have provided the freedoms we, as Americans, dearly enjoy today. After discussion, Karpisek moved to appoint Henning as the Commissioner representative, Hardenburger as the at-large member, and Emergency Management Director John McKee as the county official, should he choose to accept the position. He also reminded the Board of the upcoming employee health fair on the 11th and 12th.

At 10:52 a.m., Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi presented resolution #2020-006, authorizing the Board chair to sign the construction engineering agreement with JEO Consulting Group, Inc. to provide services on project number BRO-7076(25). Karpisek moved to approve the resolution, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Kohout and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then presented a request to occupy right of way from Black Hills Energy to excavate a gas main to repair a small leak approximately 660 feet south of County Road H on the east side of County Road 2250. Henning moved to approve the request, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Kohout, Karpisek, Henning, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then presented a list of three vehicles formerly used, but no longer needed, by the Saline County Sheriff's Office. Filipi asked that the vehicles be declared as surplus and he be allowed to take them to the Nebraska State surplus sale for disposal. Karpisek moved to approve this plan, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Kohout, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then presented an amendment to the road haul agreement with EDF Renewable Energy for the Milligan 1 wind project. He indicated that the amendment would add approximately 6 tenths of a mile on County Road County Road 1000, running north from Highway 41. SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:33 a.m. on Tuesday, February 18th, 2020 by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, Janet J. Henning and Russ Karpisek, Commissioners, County Clerk Daryl Fikar and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. Commissioner Phil Hardenburger was absent.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Henning moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Henning and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the minutes of the February 4th, 2020 regular meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Karpisek questioned the wording of the February 4th minutes, specifically the citizens forum, believing there to be an ambiguity in the verbiage. He believes that the notes state that, during the windfarm construction, there had been no incidents, but then goes on to describe an incident with a semi-truck and a citizens vehicle. Milligan 1 Wind, LLC representative Ric Nelson was present, explaining that, when he stated that there were no incidents, he was speaking of workplace incidents. He went on to state that EDF had reimbursed the vehicle owner for damages. Voting aye to approve the minutes were Kohout, Karpisek, Henning and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Kohout then noted that an item on the agenda, specifically Ayars & Ayars presenting on repair to the mortar of the courthouse and old jail, would not take place, as that company specializes in design and build, not building repair.

Under citizens forum, Ric Nelson of EDF Renewable Energy shared a letter that Milligan 1 wind project had sent to landowners. They are planning a meeting with the landowners to discuss how construction activity will affect the 2020 planting season, specifically the timing to order seed and chemicals. Karpisek asked Nelson to remind the landowners that they will need to update their crop insurance agent and, possibly, the FSA Office regarding the number of acres under cultivation.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving, from Blue Valley Community Action, their February 18th meeting agenda, January 21st meeting minutes, their February report to the Board of Directors and their January and February news clippings. Also received was the 2019 annual NIRMA report.

Under report of officials, Henning announced that she had received a letter from Blue Valley Community Action, informing her that she is no longer a member of their board. A discussion followed, questioning whether she is a representative of Saline County, or a representative of the public. She also attended a Region V meeting on February 10th, the county spelling bee on February 12th and the county health fair last week.

Kohout reported attending a NIRMA law enforcement liability workshop last Friday, the health fair last week and a ground water seminar.

Krivohlavek reports that she attended the county health fair, a budget meeting with the Aging Services Director, she has an Executive Board meeting at Saline County aging Services on the 24th and a budget meeting with Aging Partners Director Randy Jones on the 27th. She reminds the Board of the soup and salad fundraiser for Saline County Area Transit in Western on the 29th from 11:00 to 1:00.

Karpisek reported that he attended an Employee Wellness Committee meeting and the employee health fair.

McDermott reported that he attended the employee health fair, reporting that 88 people had participated. He also reported that he has a Safety Committee meeting and a meeting with Cheever Construction tomorrow, and a Continuum EAP workshop on the 27th.

Henning moved to approve the Clerk of the District Court report of fees for January, totaling \$11,581.34. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.



Henning moved to approve the Sheriff's report of fees for January showing: writ fees \$1,728.00, mileage \$1,295.50, vehicle inspections \$510.00, gun permits \$115.00, totaling \$3,648.50. The motion was seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the County Clerk's report of fees for January, totaling \$16,651.25, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve resolution #2020-07, transferring \$3,121.72 from the General Fund to the Aging Services Fund to reimburse for health insurance premium expenses. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve resolution #2020-08, transferring \$675.00 from the General Fund to the Juvenile Services Aid Program Fund, to be reimbursed when funds are available. The motion was seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Maintenance Supervisor Dan Johnson spoke in regards to the mortar replacement and stone repair of the courthouse and old jail building. He noted that he has no preference with respect to which architect is retained. Since Ayars & Ayars has opted out of bidding the job, he would have no trouble working with Berggren Architects. Krivohlavek moved that the County retain Berggren Architects to oversee the mortar replacement and stone repair of the two buildings, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:28 a.m., Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi informed the Board that he had attended the Wilber City Council meeting on February 11th, where they discussed resurfacing of North Shimerda Street in Wilber. He noted that the estimate that they had received, from Pavers, Inc. is \$119,585.70. The County and the City of Wilber will split the expense, but he was unsure what the percentages would be until after more accurate measurements are made. The resurfacing will start at Hickory Street and run north to where the current asphalt ends, and is expected to be complete by August 1, 2020.

Filipi then noted that the state contract for motor graders expires at the end of February, so he will be purchasing a new motor grader prior to then, but the payment will not be made until after July 1st, during the new budget year.

At 10:38 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would recess.

At 11:00 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would reconvene.

Karpisek moved to enter closed session, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Krivohlavek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried. Kohout announced that, during closed session, the Board would be discussing a catastrophic leave application.

Karpisek moved to approve the catastrophic leave application discussed in closed session, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Krivohlavek, Kohout and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:35 a.m. on Tuesday, March 3rd, 2020 by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, Janet J. Henning, Phil Hardenburger and Russ Karpisek, Commissioners, County Clerk Daryl Fikar and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Hardenburger, Henning and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the minutes of the February 18th, 2020 regular meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Karpisek, Henning and Krivohlavek, abstaining Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Under citizens forum, Jeff Koll spoke about an upcoming item on the agenda concerning an amendment to the road use agreement with Milligan 1 Wind, LLC. His belief is that the use of the roads by construction traffic should be approved prior to the actual use of the roads. He also questioned the legality of the lay down yard for the Milligan 1 wind project, located between Highway 15 and County Road 1200 on County Road N.

Gary Veprovsky spoke next, commenting that he believes that the part of the amendment to the road use agreement which allows the County to levy fines for use of county roads by construction equipment that are not in the road use agreement was a good idea. He also questioned why Milligan 1 Wind, LLC is being allowed to bury cable on property that is not included in the conditional use permit.

EDF representative Ric Nelson was present, answering that the conditional use permit allowed for construction of wind turbine towers, and that the use of private land for burying cable is a contract between his company and the landowners and, therefore, does not need to be included in the conditional use permit.

County Attorney Eickman gave an opinion, specifically speaking of the lay-down yard for Milligan 1 Wind, that the property owned by Doug Horak could be used for this purpose, as this is private property and the contract that he has with Milligan 1 is between them, and is not part of the conditional use permit.

Koll then spoke again, stating that tower number 16 is not included in the map of the conditional use permit and that the County did not approve moving the electrical substation. Nelson answered that Nebraska Public Power District would not allow construction of the substation where it was originally planned, so EDF had purchased 80 acres of land to site the substation.

Krivohlavek noted that she believes that all of the Saline County Planning and Zoning rules and regulations were followed by the Board.

County Attorney Eickman informed the Board that he believes that such an extended conversation concerning one subject should be a separate agenda item.

At 10:22 a.m., Veteran Service Committee member Lyle Bartels introduced the Veteran of the Month, Alfred G. Brejcha, Jr. Mr. Brejcha enlisted in the US Army on November 28th 1945 at Ft. Lawton, WA. He served with the 63rd Infantry Regiment as a heavy mortar crewman with a rank of Private First Class. He earned the WWII Victory Medal, the Army of Occupation Medal and the lapel button (honorable discharge pin). He served in the Asiatic-Pacific theater from February to November of 1946 and was discharged at Camp Beale, CA on December 6th, 1946. Since he was unable to attend, he was presented, in absentia, a Certificate of Appreciation by Board Chairman Marvin Kohout. The certificate reads "The Saline County Commissioners wish to recognize your military service to the United States of America. Throughout our Nation's history, it is the effort of the men and women, such as yourself, that have provided the freedoms we, as Americans, dearly enjoy today. Please accept our deepest gratitude and appreciation. Let us never forget your demonstrated sacrifice, service, love, and commitment to your country. Thank You, God Bless You, and God Bless the United States of America". Mr. Brejcha received a standing ovation.



At 10:25 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would recess.

At 10:42 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would reconvene.

Planning and Zoning Administrator Lyle Weber presented an administrative subdivision application from Lori J. Fuller and Troy M. Steuer to divide an irregular 8.30 tract from the property in the SW ¹/₄ of section 2-8-4. Henning moved to approve the application, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to open the public hearing for consideration of approval of a conditional use permit to Keystone XL Pipeline to create a lay down yard along County Road 1600 between Highway 33 and County Road DD for supplies and equipment. The motion was seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger and Kohout, nays none, motion carried. Dan Forbes and Brittany Brockway were present to explain the project. Forbes noted that the driveway permits had already been approved. Karpisek questioned whether there would be any structures placed on the property. Forbes answered that there may be temporary contractor trailer(s) placed there, but nothing permanent. He explained that he expects work to begin on the property sometime in April. Jeff Koll commented that he thinks that Keystone is following the rules, and that is a good thing.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving, from the Southeast Nebraska Emergency Management Group, Regional Governance Board, their February 6th meeting minutes and their March 5th meeting agenda. From the Southeast Nebraska Development District, their January 23rd meeting minutes and February 27th meeting agenda.

Under report of officials, Henning reported that she has a Region V meeting on March 9th and will be assisting with the Reading Classic on March 12th.

Hardenburger reported that he had attended an Ag. Society meeting on February 12th and, coming up, has a Blue Valley Community Action meeting and another Ag. Society meeting.

Kohout reported attending an Employee Safety Committee meeting, a meeting with Cheever Construction, a Planning and Zoning meeting, an Employee Recognition planning meeting, a meeting at the Nebraska Safety Council last week, he attended a Saline County Wind Association meeting on Sunday and will attend the "Know Your Numbers" meeting tomorrow.

Krivohlavek reports that she attended a Saline County Aging Services budget meeting last week, she has a meeting with Aging Partners on Thursday, she attended the Saline County Area Transit fund raising luncheon, reporting that 128 people participated. She also investigated a complaint of road dust due to windfarm construction equipment and reported receiving an email from Sandra Koll asking for a copy of a letter that EDF distributed to the Commissioners during the previous meeting.

Karpisek reported that he has an Employee Wellness Committee meeting next Monday.

McDermott reported that he attended an Employee Safety Committee meeting on February 19th, a Workwell Connections meeting on February 26th, he attended a Continuum EAP Leadership Academy class on February 27th, he has a CURB Coalition meeting on March 16th, he will be attending the "Know Your Numbers" meeting tomorrow, an LEPC meeting on Thursday, an Employee Wellness Committee meeting on March 9th, a Crime Commission Diversion meeting on March 11th and the NACO Southeast District meeting on March 12th. He also informed the Board that there will be a small piece of property on the south end of Crete that will be coming up on a tax sale, and reminded the Board of the observation report sent by Jerry Berggren concerning the mortar replacement and stone repair of the courthouse and old jail building.



At 11:13 a.m., Henning moved to open the public hearing for the one-and six-year road plan. The motion was seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Kohout, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

County Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi explained that there are 3 projects that have been completed that were on the 2019 plan. He also updated the Board that there are 15 projects added to the 2020 one-year plan and 4 projects added to the 2020 six-year plan.

Henning moved to adopt resolution #2020-009, approving the 2020 one-and-six-year road plan, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Kohout, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then presented a request to occupy right of way from Norris Public Power District to construct an underground electric line at County Road 400, 1250 feet south of the northeast corner of section 9-8-1. Karpisek moved to approve the application, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Kohout and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then presented the second amendment to the road use agreement with Milligan 1 Wind, LLC. He noted that the amendment would approve 7 roads or road sections for crane crossings, 15 roads or road segments for boring equipment, and the option for the County to levy fines for use of County roads that are not included in the original agreement, amendment 1 or amendment 2. Karpisek commented that he still believes that the roads should be approved prior to use by the construction companies. Krivohlavek moved to approve the second amendment to the road use agreement, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning and Krivohlavek. Voting nay, Karpisek, abstaining, Kohout, motion carried.

Filipi then presented resolution #2020-010, an interlocal agreement between Saline County and Jefferson to construct two box culverts under the county bridge match program. One of the culverts will be in Saline County and the other in Jefferson County. The estimated cost of both projects is \$335,000.00, of which \$184,250.00 will be funded by the County Bridge Match Program. Krivohlavek moved to approve the agreement, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Hardenburger, Henning and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

The agenda also included consideration of an interlocal agreement between Saline and Lancaster Counties, but Filipi informed the Board that he was still waiting for information from Lancaster County, so he will present that agreement at a future meeting.

Filipi then updated the Board on various road and bridge projects going on around the county.

Henning moved to approve the claims as presented, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Kohout and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:33 a.m. on Tuesday, March 17th, 2020 by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, Janet J. Henning, Phil Hardenburger and Russ Karpisek, Commissioners, County Clerk Daryl Fikar and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Henning moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Hardenburger, Henning and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the minutes of the March 3rd, 2020 regular meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Karpisek, Henning, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Under citizens forum, Jeff Koll asked about an item that he discussed at the March 3rd meeting, regarding wind tower number 16. He inquired whether any of the commissioners had investigated, as he had informed them that he does not believe that this specific tower is in an area that is included in the conditional use permit for the windfarm. None of the commissioners had any additional information. Hardenburger noted that he was under the impression that the issue had been settled during the previous meeting.

Gary Veprovsky spoke next, commenting that he has observed cabling being buried on land owned by Allen Kreuscher, which is not included in the area covered by the conditional use permit. He had brought this subject up at the previous meeting, and asked whether the commissioners had any further information. Commissioner Krivohlavek informed Mr. Veprovsky that, should they want the commissioners to investigate any subject, then an item needs to be placed on the agenda. Fikar informed Koll and Veprovsky that they could visit with the County Clerk's Office to place an item on the agenda.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving, from Blue Valley Community Action, their March 17th agenda, their February 18th meeting minutes and their March report to the Board of Directors. He also received notice that the March 19th meeting of the Southeast Nebraska Development District has been cancelled, that the March 19th Aging Partners meeting in DeWitt would not take place and that the March 19th 5 Rivers RC&D meeting would take place via teleconference.

Under report of officials, Henning reported that she attended the LEPC meeting at Homestead National Monument on March 5th, a Region V meeting on March 9th and the Reading Classic on March 12th. Coming up, she has a Public Health Solutions meeting on March 19th.

Hardenburger reported that he had attended an Ag. Society meeting on March 11th and reports that the Blue Valley Community Action meeting scheduled for tonight has been cancelled, and a 5 Rivers RC&D meeting scheduled for the 19th would now be a teleconference.

Kohout reported attending the "Know Your Numbers" meeting with representatives of Madonna on March 12th, he has investigated several road complaints, he attended the Employee Recognition Banquet on March 7th, a Diversion program meeting, an Employee Wellness Committee meeting, he attended the storm spotter training at Homestead National Monument, the SE District NACO meeting and has a Planning and Zoning meeting tonight.

Krivohlavek reports that she attended the Employee Recognition Banquet, the Wilber-Clatonia School Board meeting and she reports receiving notice that the Governor will permit state and local governmental boards, commissions, and other public bodies to meet by videoconference, teleconference, or other electronic means through May 31, 2020.

Karpisek reported that he attended the Employee Recognition Banquet and that the Southeast Nebraska Development District meeting he was scheduled to attend has been cancelled.


County Attorney Eickman reported that, even though the federal court system has been shut down, the local courts are still operating, and will operate unless the Chief Justice of the Nebraska Supreme Court gives permission to shut down.

McDermott reported that he attended the "Know your numbers" meeting with Madonna on March 4th, the LEPC meeting on March 5th, the Employee Wellness Committee meeting on March 9th, the Southeast Nebraska NACO meeting on March 12th, a meeting with Public Health Solutions via Zoom on March 13th, he reports that the CURB Coalition meeting scheduled for March 16th had been cancelled, he has the "Real Colors" function on March 18th and the Wellness Committee protest meeting on March 30th.

At 9:57 a.m., Scott Keene with Piper Jaffray & Co. gave a presentation concerning the refinancing of the existing county bonds. He reports that, due to the COVID-19 virus situation, the bond market is in a state of flux. He recommends that the County consider refinancing the bonds, once the market settles down. According to the numbers that he presented, over the life of the bonds, the County could save in excess of \$1,200,000 between the 2012 and 2015 series bonds.

At 10:08 a.m., Henning moved to approve resolution #2020-011, releasing pledged security, cusip #3130A9ZG9, valued at \$60,000 to Farmers and Merchants Bank. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve resolution #2020-012, releasing pledged security, cusip #3130A9ZG9, valued at \$100,000 to Farmers and Merchants Bank. The motion was seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve resolution #2020-013, releasing pledged security, cusip #804491FC7, valued at \$485,000 to First State Bank Nebraska. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve resolution #2020-014, approving pledged security, cusip #804491FC7, valued at \$335,000 with First State Bank Nebraska. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the Clerk of the District Court report of fees for February, totaling \$32,601.82. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the Sheriff's report of fees for February showing: writ fees \$1,743.00, mileage \$1,124.25, vehicle inspections \$450.00, gun permits \$115.00, totaling \$3,432.25. The motion was seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Henning, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the County Clerk's report of fees for February, totaling \$15,768.25, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:17 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would recess, to reconvene in the Saline County District Courtroom for the COVID-19 discussion.

At 10:41 a.m., In the District Courtroom, Kohout announced that the Board would reconvene.

A verbal presentation was made, via conference call, by the Health Director of Public Health Solutions, Kim Showalter. She gave a short history of the COVID-19 virus, its' make-up, symptoms of infection, reasons

for its' spread, who is most susceptible and ways to prevent or obstruct its' growth. After discussion,

Krivohlavek moved that the Board vote to close the courthouse to the public, due to the COVID-19 virus,

effective at 8:00 a.m. on March 18th, 2020, until further notice. She also moved that the Emergency

Management Director, John McKee, send a message, via Alert-Sense to all enrolled citizens. The motion was seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, voting no, Karpisek. Motion carried.

At 12:49 p.m., Kohout announced that the Board would recess, to reconvene in the Commissioners meeting room.

Karpisek announced that he would need to leave the meeting.



At 1:04 p.m., Kohout announced that the Board would reconvene.

Assistant Highway Superintendent Bill Slezak presented a request to occupy right of way from Unite Private Networks to bury fiber optic cable in a 1.5" conduit in the S ¹/₄ of section 28-8-4. Henning moved to approve the application, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Slezak then updated the Board on various road and bridge projects going on around the county, noting that he and the Highway Superintendent have both had conversations with EDF concerning their displeasure at the condition of county roads that they have been using to construct the windfarm.

Henning moved to approve resolution #2020-015, transferring \$1000.00 from the General Fund to the Juvenile Services Aid Program Fund, to be reimbursed when funds are available. Hardenburger seconded the motion. Voting aye were Henning, Krivohlavek, Kohout and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Henning then moved to approve resolution #2020-016, approving pledged security, cusip #68905WDT6, valued at \$100,000.00 with Farmers & Merchants Bank. The motion was seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenburger, Henning and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning then moved to approve resolution #2020-017, approving pledged security, cusip #25928NEH4, valued at \$100,000.00 with Farmers & Merchants Bank. The motion was seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were, Henning, Krivohlavek, Kohout and Hardenburger nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the claims as presented, seconded by Krivohlavek. Prior to voting, McDermott explained that the claim to Cheever Construction is a payment against the hold-back amount for the addition project. He noted that there remains \$5,000 in that account to ensure the completion of a door project on the 3rd floor. Voting aye were Henning, Krivohlavek, Kohout and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenburger, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Hardenburger moved to move the Personnel Issue to Open Session from Closed Session, as it was the same discussion as the County Clerk appointment, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the minutes of the March 17th, 2020 regular meeting, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Karpisek, Henning, Krivohlavek, and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Under citizens forum, Kohout read aloud an email addressed to Daryl Fikar, County Clerk from Jeff Koll. The email stated: I again would ask that you, the Commissioners look into how the Milligan 1 CUP has been abused and misused as a right to all permit. I don't believe it should be the citizens of our county that should have to investigate how a permit issued back in 2016 for one specific use can be stretched into so many additional aspects of a project. The question of "what is being approved?" Was asked during the public hearing in 2016 by your very own commissioners prior to voting. The response and the modified motion was "only properties on the pink map". "Any other properties that want to be involved would need to apply for their own CUP." The question of whether a substation would need its own conditional use permit was also asked and the response was that it is included in the map on County Road O and 900. Ric Nelson's response to that of "NPPD didn't let us put it there" is not a viable reason to allow the change of location without a public hearing and a new permit. Following the approval of the Milligan 1 CUP in 2016 several other applications followed by public hearings took place to permit MET towers. For some reason seven and up to ten additional towers have been approved in the final application claiming that they are a part of the original CUP. MET towers require their own permit following a couple public hearings and votes. Why does the county continue to look the other way when it comes to our own rules! These hearings are an important part of allowing the public a chance for their voices to be heard. As far as crane crossings along with a final site map, those are things that require "county approval", as said in your roads agreement. All of this needs to happen prior to ANY towers being erected. As for who needs to approve this?. it is you the Commissioners. At the meeting regarding approval of the roads agreement, it was heavily discussed who was the "county" in that document. It came down to Tad's decision that county could mean Bruce "if it was something that he regularly had sole authority on". (Such as a driveway permit). Where a 600' crane crossings our county roads is NOT in his regular authority! To date Milligan 1 has not completed any of the 22 road culvert replacements "prior to construction". Or made the necessary road aggregate improvements that were required by THEIR engineers. Now we are willing to allow an out of state and country corporation to proceed as yet another requirement of their contract is being ignored! I hope that you our elected officials can understand why people are not feeling our local residents and our county itself is not being put first. I do hope that someone would take it upon themselves to question why the hell this is happening and do something to fix it! We plan on living here for the rest of our lives and what happens today effects how we will be living. With all due respect,

Under report of officials, Karpisek reported attending the SENDD Board Meeting on April 23rd.

Krivohlavek reported the Saline County Area Transit meeting was cancelled.

Hardenburger participated in two Zoom meetings, on April 16th, 5 Rivers RC&D, and on April 21st, Blue Valley Community Action.

Kohout reported attending via teleconference a Planning and Zoning meeting, NACO full Board meeting, noting there will be no increase in insurance this year and a better VSP policy was approved.

McDermott gave a reminder of the Policy & Review teleconference meeting; reported Berggren has advertised for and received four bids for the Courthouse tuck pointing. The bidding documents have been created and mortar samples have been sent to a lab for analysis.

10:02 Lyle Weber, Planning and Zoning Administer presented two minor subdivisions for approval. Roger Klein and Bill Velder joined the meeting via teleconference. The two minor subdivisions presented are for one project as all properties are connected. The subdivisions would allow for ease of access to each individual's property, Klein, 7.5 acres – Part NW ¹/₄ 19-7-3 and Velder, 5.8 acres – Part SW ¹/₄ 19-7-3. Karpisek moved to approve the Klein subdivision, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Kohout, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried. 10:58 a.m. John McKee, Saline County Emergency Manager gave an update of how COVID-19 is currently affecting Saline County. McKee stated Smithfield will remain open with a reduced schedule; Directed Health Measures (DHM) are to remain in effect until May 11th and churches could begin to reopen with special guidelines. McKee was informed by Kim Showalter with Public Health Solutions testing will continue in our area with the possible assistance of the National Guard. Public Health Solutions is conducting remote training for contact investigators once a positive test result is reported. McKee stated he is delivering personal protective equipment (PPE) as requested and is working with McDermott for PPE for the Courthouse. McKee cautioned a second wave of COVID-19 is possible.

11:13 a.m. Bruce Filipi, Highway Superintendent reported one FEMA Project on the Saline/Seward County line was finished last week, another FEMA Project north of Western, being finished today and the plan is to rock this road tomorrow, which leaves four FEMA projects remaining.

Filipi reported he is in regular contact the Wind Farm personnel. He temporarily closed a minimum maintenance road last week which was being used by the wind farm truckers. The wind farm had not rocked the road and were leaving deep ruts. He believes the County roads will now be rocked first, before they rock their access points. Filipi reported the last fine against the Wind Farm was issued on Aril 13th, with a total of seven fines issued to date, totaling \$13,000. Underground and driveway permits issued to date total \$110,429.40. The monies collected are deposited into the Road Fund.

Sheriff Moore stated he's had reports of increased semi traffic on the road from Smithfield (Farmland) going north to the south of Crete. Moore inquired if additional signage is needed indicating a 10 ton limit and air brakes being prohibited. It appears the majority of these semis are hog trailers. Filipi with contact the City of Crete for their input on what type of signage is appropriate.

There has been a request for a 911 address sign at a Blue River Lodge location. Previously the cabins were identified by cabin numbers. This is no longer the case. Filipi stated there is not a County road giving access to the Lodge location, however, the Roads department did order a sign and post for this request and will order a 911 address sign for any new residence, the fee is \$50.00. These signs are a benefit to the resident. They are important to establish an address, especially for emergency calls.

Filipi informed the Board of a May 11th bid letting for an asphalt overlay on the road east of Crete by the airport.

Bartels requested approval to open the first floor of the Courthouse to voters on May 12, 2020 to accommodate the Primary Election. Only the first floor will be assessible. The elevator will be unavailable to the public and the stairwells will be closed. The Election Office has discussed this request with the Security Office. Karpisek moved to approve this request, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Karpisek, Hardenburger and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Karpisek moved to approve Resolution #2020-025 transferring \$850.00 from the General Fund to the Juvenile Services Aid Program, to be reimbursed when funds become available, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Kohout, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Under report of officials, Karpisek, Hardenburger, Krivohlavek and Henning stated their scheduled meetings were cancelled due to COVID-19.

Kohout stated his scheduled meetings were postponed, he reported receiving a call from EDF, they are sending a \$2,500 check to the Saline County Aging Services Food Bank and a \$2,500 check to the Blue Valley Food Bank.

McDermott reported attending via teleconference a Drug & Alcohol Conference and a Spyglass invoice and billing meeting regarding telephone charges; he has upcoming meetings with the Wellness Committee, Leadership Council, Continuum, Safety Committee, NIRMA Board, Pre-Bid Conference for the Courthouse tuck pointing on May 26th, with the bids due June 8th at 4:00 p.m., and the bid opening on June 9th; on April 30th met with United Private Network regarding fiber optic lines installed for the State connections.

Henning moved to approve the appointment of Anita K. Bartels to fulfill the term of the retired Saline County Clerk Daryl I. Fikar, seconded by Krivohlavek. It is noted for the record, before an appointment was made, confirmation of qualifications was received from the Saline County Attorney and the Nebraska Secretary of States offices. Voting aye Krivohlavek, Henning, Hardenberger and Kohout, nay Karpisek, motion carried.

Karpisek moved to approve the County Clerk's fees for April in the amount of \$16,098.25, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Karpisek, Hardenburger and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Karpisek moved to approve the Sheriff's fees for April, showing writ fees \$1,287.00, Mileage \$1,101.50, Vehicle Inspections \$30.00, Gun Permits \$60.00, totaling \$2,478.50, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenberger, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Karpisek moved to approve the Clerk of the District Court fees for April in the amount of \$6,281.48, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Karpisek, Henning, Krivohlavek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Karpisek moved to approve Resolution #2020-027, Emergency Family and Medical Leave Expansion Act, with the elimination of pages 5 and 6, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Kohout, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:15 a.m. Jerad Reimers a representative from Adrian Smith's office, gave an update for the Congressman. Reimers reported the Grand Island office is primarily focused on case work to help navigate the Federal Bureaucracy, including grants, FEMA and the Corp of Engineers. He noted Congressman Smith is





forbidden to be involved judicially. He does serve on committees, with the Unites States-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA), working to increase agricultural market access, export of electricity, NAFTA compliance, telehealth and telehealth funding. Hardenburger asked Reimers where Smith stood on the meat packing and country of origin labeling, and enforcing the Packers & Stockyard Act. Hardenburger stated we need original processors for safe food in America. Reimers responded saying the Congressman is aware of these issues and is in favor of each. He is in talks with the USDA regarding localized meat production.

At 10:30 a.m. Discussion was opened regarding a policy to reopen the Courthouse, Extension Office and Aging Services to the Public, which included the planning, preparation, and implementation. NACO provided to the counties plans giving suggestions for reopening. Personnel protective plans are currently being put into place, including cough/sneeze shields, masks, gloves and disinfectants. It was the consensus to keep the offices closed until May 31st, 2020, then re-evaluate once new Directive Health Measures are released by the State. With the election being held on May 12th, the first floor of the Courthouse will be open, with access for voters to the assembly room which is precinct Wilber 1. Voters will not have access to the elevator or any stairways.

Kohout announced the Board would take a recess;

At 10:57 a.m. Kohout announced the Board would reconvene;

County Assessor, Brandi Kelly requested input from the Board regarding how to handle the tax protest hearing. The hearings are currently scheduled for June and July. Kelly stated one Nebraska County is doing mail in protests, and some other Counties are planning telephone conferences. It was concluded that since it is unknown when the Courthouse will reopen to the Public, this will be decided at a later date.

At 11:05 a.m. bids were opened for the Asphaltic Concrete Overlay Project on the road east of Crete by the airport. The two bids received from Pavers, Inc., Waverly, Nebraska in the amount of \$479,753.31 and Contractors, Inc., Lincoln, Nebraska in the amount of \$408,178.25. Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi said he would review the bids and give his recommendation at the May 26th Board meeting.

Filipi presented a request from Windstream to Occupy Right of Way at 578 County Road 1400, this is to provide service to a residence. Karpisek moved to approve this request, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Kohout, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi presented a Herbst Construction Inc. change order for Project DeWitt West C76(753), C007604215P. This cost overrun of \$7,250.00 is due to the Pile Data Table after driving the Test Pile. Karpisek moved to approve the change order, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi presented for approval, an Agreement for Cooperative Bidding for the 2020 County Bridge match program between Saline County and Lancaster County. With this agreement Saline County will receive a 55% reimbursement. Henning moved to approve this agreement, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Karpisek, Hardenburger and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi updated the Board on various projects, including two more FEMA projects being completed, along with another one today. The road at County Line A and West 103 will be closed for a couple of weeks. There is plugged culvert and a shallow gas line in this area. The culvert is being replaced and Filipi is working with the gas company to bury the gas line appropriately.

Filipi discussed with the Board, Road 2250 south out of Crete toward Smithfield. There is an area near the Blue River that is washing out. Filipi stated they have been dumping riprap, much of which is from the old library in Crete, but they need more. Once adequately filled in, they will build back the berm, that had washed out.

Karpisek moved to approve Resolution #2020-028, transferring \$960.00 from the General Fund to the Juvenile Services Aid Program Fund, to be reimbursed when fund become available, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Karpisek moved to approve Resolution #2020-029, authorizing the Saline County Treasurer to transfer 54.06% of 2019 taxes collected for the Saline County General Fund to the Saline County Road Fund, seconded





by Henning. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Karpisek, Hardenburger and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Hardenburger moved to approve the claims as presented, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenburger, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Karpisek moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout, and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Hardenburger moved to approve the minutes of the May 11th, 2020 regular meeting, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Karpisek, Hardenburger and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Under Citizens forum, Charles McKay read from the State of Nebraska Accountability and Disclosure Commission, Synopsis Case #19-39, Action Taken on March 6, 2020, Respondent: Marvin Kohout, settlement agreement.

Under correspondence, Bartels reported receiving the Aging Partners May 11th meeting agenda; the SENDD May 28th meeting agenda and April 23rd minutes; from the City of Friend Planning Commission, a June 1st Meeting Notice for a Blight/Substandard Study on the Redevelopment of Area #2; and from Maintenance employees Dan and Kim, suggestions when the Courthouse reopens to the public to shut off the water fountains and restroom access for the public be limited to the first floor only, when the DMV reopens be available to the driver only, for learner permits- driver applicant only plus one adult.

Under report of officials, Kohout reported attending Wellness, Planning & Zoning, and Safety Committee meetings via teleconference.

Eickman reported Courts are in session, with the majority of cases being conducted via Webex.

At 9:50 a.m. Wilber Mayor Roger Chrans updated the Board on the previously approved paving project of North Shimerda. The engineer with Olsson Associates estimated the cost would be \$197,022.00. Bidding took place on November 12, 2019. The accepted bid was submitted from Pavers, Inc. Lincoln, NE, in the amount of \$119,585.70. The completion date is August 31, 2020. Chrans with work with Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi on this project.

At 10:03 a.m. John Day with Blue Valley Behavioral Health gave an update on services provided over the past year. The office in Crete is open to the public with minimal staff. Staff is available to assist with telehealth. There has been in an increase in medication management and BVBH is looking to expand and grow. 50%-60% of their services are accommodating clients through increased telehealth options. Day submitted their 2020/2021 budget request of \$8,000.00, the same amount as requested for last fiscal year.

At 10:15 a.m. John McKee, Emergency Manager, reported to the Board there has been minimal low land flooding as a result of the rains over the weekend. McKee reported the State will begin opening things up June 1st, with additional mandates of no more than 25 people at a gathering, maintain 6' distancing and Public Health Solutions must give approval for any large gatherings. McKee provided a copy of Standard Operating Procedures for Unmanned Aircraft System (UAS) Program, effective May 26, 2020. McKee presented for approval an Interlocal Agreement to create the Southeast Region, a separate legal entity, to provide for cooperative public safety services by and amount the counties of Cass, Gage, Fillmore, Jefferson, Johnson, Lancaster, Nemaha, Otoe, Pawnee, Richardson, Saline, Seward, Thayer and York. Karpisek moved to approve the Interlocal Agreement, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Kohout, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:25 a.m. Don Dison, IEA Site Manager for the Milligan 1 Project, requested approval of 6 amendments for boring crossings. One is due to the land now being cultivated, one is an extension of an

At 11:09 a.m. Henning moved to close the gravel bids for the 2020-2021 year, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Karpisek, Hardenburger and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried. Bids were received from Beatrice Sand & Gravel, Beatrice, NE; Gana Trucking & Excavating, Inc., Martell, NE; Rock On Inc., Beatrice, NE; and Johnson Sand & Gravel, Columbus, NE. At 11:33 a.m. Karpisek moved to close the culvert bids for the 2020-2021 year, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Karpisek, Hardenburger and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried. Bids were received from Ace/Eaton Metals, Kearney, NE and Metal Culverts, Inc., Jefferson City, MO. The bids are placed on file and are of public record in the Commissioners' Journal as attachments #9 and 10.

Bruce Filipi, Highway Superintendent announced he will review all bids and come back to the Board on June 9th at 11:00 a.m. with his recommendations.

Filipi along with the County engineers recommended awarding the bid from Constructors, Inc., Lincoln, NE, in the amount of \$408,178.25 for the Crete East Overlay Project. Hardenburger moved to accept the bid, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenburger, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi presented a request from Windstream to occupy right of way at Road Y and 400. This request is to repair a bad cable. Karpisek moved to approve the request, seconded by Hardenburger, voting aye were Hardenburger, Karpisek, Henning, Krivohlavek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi presented Resolution #2020-030 to approve the Disaster #NE19 Emergency Relief Program. Karpisek moved to approve to approve, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Henning, Krivohlavek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi requested approval of change order from CBMP between Saline/Jefferson/Fillmore/Seward Counties for Bridge C008602140; Project #C-76(501), for a cost reduction of \$5,745.36. Henning moved to approve the change order, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi reported the Roads Department has ordered an F550 dually truck through the State contract in the amount of \$67,804.00. This truck purchase was budgeted for and approved in the 2019-2020 budget. Due to factory cutbacks as a result of COVID-19, the truck will not be delivered and paid for, until the 2020-2021 budget year.



Filipi reported there was a wash out south of H Road due to the heavy rains over the week. A Crete grader operator has been hired. Filipi will be sending this new operator and another new hire to a 3 day training course.

Henning moved to approved the Blobaum & Busboom PC, Certified Public Accountants, acceptance and understanding of services for Saline County, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Karpisek, Hardenburger and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Hardenburger moved to approve the Delta Dental of Nebraska insurance rates, with an increase of 5.02%, effective September 1st, 2020, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenburger, Krivohlavek, Karpisek, and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

At 11:56 a.m. Karpisek moved to enter closed session, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenburger, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried. Kohout announced during closed session the Board would be discussing an employee catastrophic leave request.

At 12:05 a.m. Karpisek moved to exit closed session, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Kohout, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none. Kohout announce during the closed session the Board discussed the employee catastrophic leave request, with no action taken.

Two of the box culverts are for Saline County, one at a cost of \$252,892.30 with a 55% reimbursement from the State and one at a cost of \$243,471.15.

Filipi addressed an article in the NIRMA Interchange May/June 2020 edition. The article addressed fences placed next to county roads on the county's right-of-way, or worse yet, across a county road. Neb. Rev. Stat. §39-301 states that any person who obstructs a public road (including the right-of-way) with fencing is guilty of a criminal misdemeanor offense. County Attorney Tad Eickman suggested to follow NIRMA's recommendation in this article by passing a Resolution to enforce this state law and to get landowners to remove traffic hazards such as fences on or next to county roads. Filipi will draft a Resolution and present it to the Board for approval at the July 21st meeting.

Filipi updated the Board on the box culvert near Highway 15 should be finished today. Work is continuing to finish the last of the culverts lost in the flood last year, with expected September completion dates.

On November 1, 2019 the Saline County Treasurer turned over 68 delinquent distress warrants to the Saline County Sheriff's Office for collection, totaling \$43,495.88 in delinquent personal property taxes. Henning moved to accept the report, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:12 a.m., Kent Musil with the Saline County Ag Society reported a successful modified County Fair. Musil gave an update of the improvements made to the Saline County Fairgrounds to date and presented a list of improvements they are looking to make during the 2020-2021 fiscal year, requesting \$45,000.00 from the County for these improvements.



At 10:21 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would recess.

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, August 4th, 2020 by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Russ Karpisek, Philip S. Hardenburger, Janet J. Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek Commissioners, County Clerk Anita K. Bartels, Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Henning moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Hardenburger moved to approve the minutes of the July 21st, 2020 regular meeting, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Under Citizens Forum, Gary Veprovsky requested clarification on the different dollar amounts shown in the resolutions for refunding the Highway Allocation Fund Bond, Series 2012 and refunding Limited Tax County Building Bonds, Series 2015. The Board agreed these were very good questions and requested to address these concerns during todays presentation of the refunding bonds by Scott Keene with Pieper Sandler.

Jack Sukovaty addressed the Board by teleconference, to follow up on a letter he sent to the Board dated January 15, 2020. Sukovaty requested Saline County Zoning Regulations be reevaluated, opened to public input and hearings to address what he perceived to be totally inadequate criteria concerning wind energy systems. His suggestion is to specifically address Article 6, Section 619. Specific concerns are: 1. No limit or control on tower height; 2. Financial responsibility for failure of company to address closure and decommissioning costs. This needs to be done upfront of any permit issuance and not ten or twenty years in the future. That is not how financial assurance is done and makes no sense; and 3. Set back distance from non-participating residences needs to be increased from 1,200 ft. to one mile because the waiver option is already in place. In his estimation the hearings, topic and regulations should be better advertised and the public input actively sought by the County on such an important matter.

Rick Nelson representing the windfarm project reported the project is at 40% completion, which includes 89 of 99 foundations, 99 roads cut with all but 10 rocked. Olsson Engineering will be flying drones over the area to assess any crop & CRP damage and the University will be assessing for compact issues. Upon receiving this information payments will be made to reimburse landowners.

Under correspondence Bartels reported receiving from Jefferson County Planning and Zoning a notice the March 26, 2020 meeting has been rescheduled for August 13th, 2020, regarding proposed amendments to zoning regulations; from the City of Crete, the agendas for a July 27th Planning Commission meeting, July 28th, Public Works Committee; August 4th agendas for the City Council regular meeting, Public Works committee, Parks & Recreation, Legislative & Economic Development committee; from Blue Valley Community Action their 2019 Impact Report and Quarterly Connection; a letter from the Nebraska Office of the Attorney General regarding opioid litigation; and a notice of a Construction and Operating Permit transferred to Ross Wollenburg Farm.

Karpisek reported receiving a follow up protest tax evaluation letter from Robert Znamenacek.

Kohout reported the Board of Adjustments has an opening for a member. They are hoping to fill the position with someone who resides in the middle of the County. Contact John Barta if interested.

Under report of officials Kohout reported attending a Planning & Zoning meeting; a NACO benefits zoom meeting; an upcoming Safety Committee meeting on August 14th; and a NIRMA online workshop August 12th and 13th.

Hardenburger attended a zoom Blue Valley Community Action finance committee meeting and has an upcoming zoom Blue Valley Community Action meeting on the 6th.



Krivohlavek reported attending a Saline County Aging Services budget review meeting.

McDermott reported attending the Annual Continuum meeting, an upcoming NIRMA online workshop on August 12th and 13th; on August 20th and 21st a NIRMA Board of Directors meeting; reported the cancellation of the Self-Defense Conference in October, which will be replaced with webinars; and he stated he has received requests to transmit Board meetings live.

At 10:00 a.m. Scott Keene with Pieper Sandler presented the drafts and resolutions for refunding the outstanding Highway Allocation Fund Pledge Bonds, Series 2012, Resolution #2020-047 and the outstanding Limited Tax County Building Bonds, Series 2015, Resolution #2020-048. Keene answered several questions on the refunding processing. He gave an example, that the refunding of the bonds is similar to refinancing a home mortgage to get a better interest rate. In doing so, we would not be extending the life of the bonds, we would be saving money by paying less interest. He also explained the PAR amounts reflect the cost if the bond fund account would not be fully funded and it would be necessary to borrow money to make a payment. He stated the bond accounts are well funded and he does not feel this is a concern, only a figure included in the paperwork to facilitate actions in the future should it be necessary. Krivohlavek moved to approve Resolution #2020-047, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried. Krivohlavek moved to approve Resolution #2020-048, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:24 Krivohlavek moved to open the public hearing for a conditional use permit for a swine finishing building, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Les Lawver applied for a conditional use permit to build a 2,400 head swine unit. This would be a family operation. They have a contract with Cactus Farm for the sale of the hogs. Karpisek expressed concerns about the strong odor with such an operation. It was explained construction would include an enclosed holding area for waste, not an open lagoon, with 300 acres available to inject the waste, which is significantly more acres than is required.

At 10:28 a.m. Krivohlavek moved to close the public hearing for a conditional use permit for a swine finishing building, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the conditional use permit for the Lawver swine finishing building, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays Karpisek, motion carried.

At 10:30 Brian Blobaum, CPA with Blobaum & Busboom, presented a preliminary of the 2020-2021 fiscal year budget. Blobaum stated the draft being presented was missing only a few accounts, which will not make a significant impact. Blobaum will return during the August 18th meeting for further discussions and officials with meet with the Board the afternoon of the 18th to discuss their individual budgets. The September 1st meeting is designated if additional discussions or changes are needed to the budget. The Budget Hearing is scheduled for September 15th at 9:00 a.m., with the regular Board of Commissioners meeting to follow.

At 10:55 a.m. Kohout announced the Board would recess.

At 11:05 a.m. Kohout announced the Board would reconvene.

Henning moved to open a public hearing for a conditional use permit application for a Viaero tower, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Mike Harms, Site Acquisition Specialist for Viaero and Industrial Tower West addressed the Board, requesting a conditional use permit to erect a communications tower in Swanton near the Farmers Coop. It would be a 195 ft. tower, completed the Spring of 2021. Harms has met with the Farmers Coop and has received their approval.

At 11:14 a.m. Karpisek moved to close the public hearing for the Viaero tower, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, August 18th, 2020 by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Russ Karpisek, Philip S. Hardenburger, Janet J. Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek Commissioners, County Clerk Anita K. Bartels, Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Henning moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the minutes of the August 4th, 2020 regular meeting, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Under Citizens Forum, Gary Veprovsky voiced concerns regarding the lights on the wind turbines. Veprovsky stated currently there is a little red light on the turbines and questioned why the lights would need to be changed to a flashing white light. Veprovsky also requested all Commissioner meetings be available with a live audio and visual feed. Krivohlavek replied she has requested the live feeds be made available in the past and this topic is on today's agenda for discussion.

Chuck McKay addressed the Board questioning whether the 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. working hours were in the road agreement for concrete trucks. He stated on August 8th, the concrete trucks started running at 4:00 a.m. and were done by 2:00 p.m. The Board confirmed the working hours have been addressed with the concrete plant. McKay brought up several issues regarding the wind towers. He felt safety issues were being avoided by the Planning and Zoning Committee. He inquired if the Board had received a safety manual from the manufacturer of the wind towers. McKay presented 2 pages from the Nordex website regarding danger zones around wind towers. He is looking to change any future wind tower placements for consideration of danger zones. McKay asked the Board to request the Planning and Zoning Committee allow citizens to be present, allowing both sides of the story to be heard. Board members stated the Planning and Zoning Committee is its own entity, having no jurisdiction over their meetings. McKay requested the Board get a safety manual from Zesta, the manufacturer of the wind towers being erected in Saline County.

Jeff Koll also expressed concerns with the wind turbine lighting, specifically regarding aircraft activation. Koll stated the turbines should be 45 decibels or lower. He also requested going forward, permits involving wind turbines not be transferable. Koll expressed interest in filling the open seat on the Planning & Zoning Committee. He stated concerns, which need to be addressed, are the set back zones of turbines, so a turbine does not encroach in a trespass zone and make manufacturing specs a part of the conditional use permit for safety and liability reasons.

At 10:02 a.m. Anita Stougard, Youth Diversion Coordinator gave an update on the program and plans for the next year. Due to COVID-19, there are funds available to roll over for this school year. Stougard has been working with Family Services Lincoln to fill a need for mental health support and hire a part time mental health therapist. The therapist would be at Crete Middle School one and ½ days per week and Crete High School ½ day per week. Stougard stated a consultant agreement with Family Services Lincoln is needed to move forward. The Board gave consent to proceed and to present the agreement to the County Attorney and Board for the necessary signatures.

At 10:15 a.m. Gary Veprovsky addressed the Board to discuss Accountability Concerns. Veprovsky stated the lack of accountability erodes public respect. Examples he gave which caused him to question accountability were the courthouse addition/remodel, specifically the doors, air conditioning and the parking lot upgrade. Veprovsky believed someone other than the citizens should be paying for these types of issues. McDermott explained the issue with the doors was not an additional cost. The doors were a warranty



replacement through the contractor. McDermott also explained many of the changes made during the remodel and renovation was a result of several different Fire Marshals doing the inspections. From one Fire Marshal to another, each would have their own assessment of what needed to be added or changed. Addressing the parking lot upgrade, this conversation began during renovation, but was not addressed until now.

Veprovsky referred to the resolution passed at the last meeting regarding fences and obstructions in the County right of ways. He presented a photo to the Board of a rock pile that filled the ditch at 1500 & O Roads. He reported three months ago trees were cut down or trimmed and the debris was left on his property, him unable to move cattle. He contacted Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi, Filipi promptly addressed the issue. However, the contractor only moved the debris across the road to the neighbor's property. Veprovsky commended Filipi for being accountable when addressing road issues. Veprovsky stated he telephoned Bartels to find out why Rick Nelson gave a report at the last Board meeting, not under Citizens Forum, but it was placed in the minutes under Citizens Forum. Bartels explained she placed it there, because Nelson was not on the agenda, but given the floor to speak as a courtesy by Kohout. No action was requested or taken by the Board. She placed it there simply following an outline of the minutes. Bartels intended nothing malicious or deceitful.

Veprovsky brought up a previous issue Chuck McKay addressed with the Board, regarding Kohout voting on issues he may have a conflict of interest in. Krivohlavek stated this was addressed by the Nebraska Political Accountability and Disclosure Commission and was resolved based on conflict of interest laws. Karpisek noted this issue went through proper channels at the State level and as such there are no repercussions at the County level.

At 10:37 a.m. Kohout announced the Board would recess;

At 10:45 a.m. Kohout announced the Board would reconvene;

Maintenance Superintendent Dan Johnson opened discussion on the parking lot drainage issues. Wayne & Bobbi Crosby, owners of the property to the east of the parking lot was also present. Johnson suggested replacing the railroad ties by pouring a second concrete curb near or on the property line, setting posts for a fence. Johnson and Crosby will make another physical assessment of the area. Johnson will make contact with contractors to secure bids.

Under correspondence, Bartels reported receiving from Blue Valley Community Action, their August 18th Board of Directors agenda, the minutes of their June 15, 2020 meeting, the August 2020 reports to the Board of Directors and their June-July 2020 news clippings and from the City of Crete their August 18th agendas for the Crete City Council, the Public Works Committee, Parks & Recreation Committee, Legislative and Economic Development Committee and Finance Committee.

Under Report of Officials Kohout reported attending a Safety Committee meeting; NIRMA webinar; has a Planning and Zoning meeting tonight; Thursday a NACO Board meeting with the Governor; and stated NACO is looking for a Southeast District Board member, which is a 5-year commitment.

Hardenburger participated in a Blue Valley Community Action zoom meeting to select an auditor; has a Blue Valley Community Action meeting tonight; a Five Rivers RC & D meeting on Thursday; and noted they are not expecting to have a hazardous waste collection site until spring 2021.

McDermott reported attending an Employee Assistance Program meeting and stated Saline County's contact will be Jenny Hill; attended a Safety Committee meeting; a NIRMA webinar; tomorrow he has a NIRMA Board meeting via teleconference. He reported MIPS is discontinuing all email support. He is in the process of setting up a Saline County domain. All <u>@saline.naco.org</u> users will be required to change their email address.

Henning moved to approve the July 2020 Clerk of the District Court fees in the amount of \$18,630.30, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the July 2020 Clerk fees in the amount of \$16,975.00, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.


Karpisek moved to the approve the Annual Personal Property Inventories of elected and appointed offices as presented, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Discussion was held to make available live audio and video of Commissioner meetings. McDermott stated it is doable, with a cost involved to purchase a dedicated laptop, camera and audio equipment. This cost is estimated to be around \$2,000 to \$3,000. McDermott recommends using YouTube to accomplish this. Audio is currently available to the public by dialing into the meetings. To make video available to the public, without purchasing additional equipment at this time, Karpisek moved to have Krivohlavek set up a Saline County Facebook page and McDermott to set up availability via YouTube, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays Kohout, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the Treasurer's Distress Warrant Report as presented, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2020-054 transferring \$110,000 from the Inheritance Fund to the General Fund to be reimbursed when funds become available, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2020-055 transferring \$1,600 from the Inheritance Fund to the Bailiff Fund to be reimbursed when funds become available, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2020-056 transferring \$250 from the Inheritance Fund to the Employee Wellness Fund, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi, presented for a request to occupy County right of way from Spectrum/Charter to relocate cable at the NE corner of County Road 2100 and County Road J. Henning moved to approve the request, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi requested permission to begin paperwork in cooperation with the City of Crete to replace the bridge at Tuxedo Park. This is a \$300,000 commitment from the County using soft match funds, with the City of Crete reimbursing the \$150,000 in cash. Board gave verbal approval to go ahead with paperwork.

Filipi gave an update on road projects including replacing a wood bridge with triple tubes near County Road 2100 & County Road J and they are continuing to replace rusted out culverts. He reported there have been major issues with the wind farm construction. He shut them down last week until they repaired the road damage. He is continuing to fine them when the situation warrants. Filipi also received reported on the cement trucks running as early as 4:00 a.m. Since Filipi put a stop to this, they no longer run before 7:00 a.m.

At 11:52 a.m., Henning moved to enter closed session, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Kohout announced during closed session the Board would be discussing an employee catastrophic leave request.

At 11:57 a.m., Henning moved to exit closed session, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Kohout announced during closed session the Board discussed an employee catastrophic leave request. No action was taken. A decision was tabled until the afternoon session to allow time to obtain additional information.

Henning moved to approve the claims as presented, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, September 1st, 2020 by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Russ Karpisek, Philip S. Hardenburger, Janet J. Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek Commissioners, County Clerk Anita K. Bartels, Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Henning moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Hardenburger moved to approve the minutes of the August 18th, 2020 regular meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Under Citizens Forum, Gary Veprovsky addressed the Board regarding the moratorium on wind farm permits. His hope is the Board will take advantage of this opportunity. Veprovsky also thanked the County individual who was responsible for moving the dangerous rock and debris shown in the picture he presented during the last meeting.

Under correspondence, Bartels reported receiving from SENDD their August 27th Executive Committee agenda, and from the City of Crete their August 24th Planning Commission agenda, August 25th City Council Work Session agenda and their September 1st agendas for the Crete City Council, the Public Works Committee, Parks & Recreation Committee, Legislative and Economic Development Committee and Finance Committee.

Under Report of Officials Krivohlavek reported having a September 10th Veteran Service Board meeting;

Hardenburger reported having an Ag Society meeting next week;

Kohout reported attending a Planning and Zoning meeting, a NACO Board zoom meeting with the Governor, a NACO benefit services meeting, will attend a Historical Society meeting on Sunday and a September 9th zoom NACO Board of Directors meeting;

Henning reported her Region 5 and LEPC meetings were canceled;

McDermott reported attending a NIRMA Board meeting, cancellation of the LEPC meeting, employee flu shots are scheduled for October 15th. He reported the third floor door which needed to be changed according to recommendations from the Fire Marshall is now at Cheever Construction and will be installed after September 22nd. The granite County seal will be ready in approximately one week, with arrangements to be made to hang it in the main entrance lobby south wall.

Saline County Emergency Director John McKee reported the 2020 Emergency Management Performance Grant was approved. Saline and Jefferson County will split \$55,000. McKee gave a COVID update, in which the State will be in Phase 3 until September 13th, moving to Phase 4 on September 14th if the numbers stay as they are.

Henning moved to approve the appointment of John McKee, as the authorized representative for Saline County for the federally declared disaster DR4521, to work with the CARES Act, FEMA and NEMA, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Bartels reported Brian Blobaum CPA, delivered copies of the 2020-2021 Budget to be presented at the Budget Hearing on September 15th, along with a copy of the Notice of Budget Hearing and Budget Summary to be posted in the County newspapers. The Board consensus was no changes needed to be made.

Clerk of the District Court Amber Mulbery brought to the attention of the Board, there will be 27 pay periods in the calendar year 2021, therefore the salary of the elected and appointed officials is negatively



impacted. It was agreed the annual salary was correct, however computing the salary with 27 pay periods versus 26 pay periods is where the difference is. It was decided to reach out to the State Auditor's office for clarification and address this issue in two weeks.

At 10:05 a.m. Saline County Planning & Zoning Administrator, Lyle Weber addressed the Board. Weber gave a synopsis of the Planning & Zoning meeting a couple of weeks ago. He reported the Planning & Zoning Commission voted for a moratorium on issuing conditional use permits for wind farms for 4 months, until December 31, 2020. The vote was 6 to 1, 1 member abstaining. The commission passed this moratorium to give them time to review and make changes to regulations they are currently working on. Eickman stated the Board of Commissioners have a Planning Commission they rely on to make recommendations. The Board of Commissioners do not have to pass a resolution for the moratorium, but it would make it very difficult to have two sets of rules. Eickman has prepared a moratorium resolution, with the dates omitted. During the moratorium discussion Veprovsky inquired if Kohout should step down at leader of the meeting. No action was taken.

Dave Vavra, Chairman of the Saline County Wind Association addressed the Board, stating he is not a member of the Planning & Zoning Commission. He has spoken to the Planning & Zoning Commission, making recommendations on set backs and red lights on the towers. Noting these two issues are immaterial to the two current projects and would only apply to the third project with Apex. Vavra's concern with the moratorium is it would give the impression Saline County is closed to wind energy. He sees no benefit to a moratorium.

Krivohlavek asked Weber if all present at the Planning and Zoning meeting were given the opportunity to speak and why the Planning & Zoning Commission voted to go forward with the moratorium. Weber confirmed anyone at the meeting who wanted to speak was given the opportunity. His understanding from the Planning & Zoning meeting was there is nothing currently in the works and they wanted time to work on new regulations, so they voted to put the moratorium in place until the end of the year. Eickman stated Weber contacted him the morning after the meeting, to draw up a resolution for the Board of Commissioners consideration. The blanks placed in this resolution were to allow for the Commissioners to make changes to dates and etc., if they choose to do so. Krivohlavek read a copy of the proposed resolution aloud.

Jeff Koll addressed the Board, stating he was the one who brought this moratorium issue to the Planning & Zoning Commission. He has been working on this since last August. This moratorium would give the Planning & Zoning Commission an opportunity to make changes. Koll agreed with a request by Veprovsky, where Kohout should step down as the Board of Commissioners representative to the Planning & Zoning Commission. Koll gave an example of their concerns being, Kohout invited a representative from Saline County Wind Association to speak during this meeting, but did not invite the individual who brought the moratorium issue to the Planning & Zoning Commission. Kohout stated he was to speak during this meeting. Koll replied he was not specifically called or contacted to speak during this meeting. Koll requested the Board to consider reappointing a different member to attend Planning & Zoning Commission meetings.

Karpisek moved to approve a wind farm moratorium, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, Kohout nay, motion carried. Eickman is to execute a final resolution for a moratorium and will present it at the next meeting for approval.

Krivohlavek asked Vavra to acknowledge if any new wind farm companies do express interest in Saline County, to advise them to come back after the first of the year.

At 10:47 a.m. Kohout announced the Board would take a recess;

At 11:01 a.m. Kohout announced the Board would reconvene;

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2020-057 to set the final 2020 levy allocation for the Historical Society, Saline County Agricultural Society, Friend Community Healthcare District, Saline County Rural Fire District and Friend Rural Fire District, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the Windstream Right-of-Way request OSP-21983 in conjunction with the DeWitt Bridge Project West to repair a damaged cable, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.



Under Citizens Forum, Rick Nelson gave an update on the wind farm progress. Stating over 5 million dollars has been spent with local subcontractors and regional businesses. So far 100% of the turbine foundations are complete, 99 turbine sites have been excavated, 28 engineered fields complete, 32 geo sites complete, and 99 sites cages are complete. The fetch plant will be breaking down next week. The concrete tankers will be gone and they will begin using Beatrice Concrete for concrete pads below transformers. This will eliminate a lot of large haulers. 33 Vesta turbines are up and have been punched out. All 36 of the 2.75 turbines are now on site. They are at 82% of all the underground cables. NPPD is working on the Tobias sub. The Milligan sub is at 100%. They are continuing to work on road repairs as needed and will have access to fields ready for harvest.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2020-058 transferring \$205,000 from the Inheritance Fund to the General Fund, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2020-059 transferring \$4,000 from the Inheritance Fund to the Bailiff Fund, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2020-060 transferring \$100.00 from the Inheritance Fund to the Juvenile Services Aid Program Fund, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none motion carried.

Kohout reported for Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi, the roads department is continuing road maintenance and replacing culverts.

Henning moved to approve the claims as presented, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried,

Under correspondence, Bartels reported receiving from the City of Crete, their October 6th meeting agendas for the City Council, Public Works Committee, Legislative & Development Committee, Public Safety Committee and Finance Committee; and the County received the Annual Compliance Evaluation for the Law Enforcement Center, reporting the facility is in full compliance;

Under report of officials, Kohout reported attending a NACO full board meeting, a NACO benefits meeting, the Legislative Conference, a meeting with Bartels and Scott Keene regarding the refunding of the Courthouse and Highway Bonds, and has the upcoming NACO Conference on December 9th & 10th;

Krivohlavek has a Saline County Area Transit (SCAT) meeting on Thursday;

McDermott reported attending the annual NIRMA meeting with the election of new board members and a regular NIRMA Board meeting; participated in a webinar on Diversity and Inclusiveness; the October 6th Wellness meeting has been rescheduled for October 19th; the hanging mechanism for the Saline County seal is in place; received a notice of a refund from Windstream for a partial credit of \$7,000+; the flu shot clinic is tomorrow; tomorrow afternoon he will attend a Cass County security consultation; Thursday he will attend a Maintenance Workshop with Dan Johnson in Aurora; on October 20th he will watch a presentation on mental health and on October 27th a NIRMA workshop by Pam Bourne on COVID in the workplace.

At 9:47 a.m., Jennifer Igo and Maricela Galdamez with Nebraska Strong Recovery Project addressed the Board, outlining the services, supported by a FEMA Grant, for those impacted by COVID and flooding. This grant funding is available until June 2021. Nebraska Strong Recovery Project is free and confidential. They also do volunteer work in the community. Krivohlavek gave Igo contact information for Saline County Aging Services. Galdamez encouraged looking at their Facebook page and their webpage with the University of Nebraska.

At 9:52 a.m. Planning and Zoning Administrator Lyle Weber, requested from the Board, their opinion whether the two proposed applications from R & R Christo Construction, LLC, for two confined chicken operations, should be treated as 1 or 2 operations. Stephen Mossman and Andy Scholting, representing R & R Christo Construction LLC, answered questions and explained although the two operations are identical except the location of the facilities, which are 10 miles apart. The applications were submitted by the same applicant, the application for the two separate permits were paid with one check and the compliance determinations made under the zoning regulations would be identical for each site. They believe the issues of common applicant, similar applications, one check, similar operations and in particular, identical compliance determinations, are all irrelevant given the language of the Saline County Zoning Regulations and how such operations would be treated by the Nebraska Department of Environment and Energy (NDEE). Reisdorff stated this company has been transparent and has tailored the two sites to meet the Saline County Planning and Zoning regulations, in his opinion it would be two separate applications. To clarify whether it should be two separate applications, the example was given: if one application was filed and a week later the second application was filed, it would be treated as two separate applications. Krivohlavek moved to approve the applications from R & R Christo



Construction, LLC and two separate applications, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Krivohlavek and Kohout, nays Karpisek, motion carried.

Present were Kohout, Russ Karpisek, Janet J. Henning and Stephanie A. Krivohlavek Commissioners, County Clerk Anita K. Bartels, Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. Commissioner Philip Hardenburger was absent, and County Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Karpisek moved to approve the minutes of the October 13th, 2020 regular meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, and Krivohlavek, Henning abstained, nays none, motion carried.

Under Citizens Forum, Wendy Keller addressed the Board with concerns involving the building permits for chicken farms near her home. Keller stated her biggest concern is water. Their well pumps 9 gallons per minute, their neighbor Dennis Broz pumps 4 ½ gallons per minute w/sand and Dennis Bors pumps 6 gallons per minute. The information Keller found on the internet was 200,000 chickens would require 25,000 gallons per day. Her concern is this demand for water will deplete the water supply to the residents in the area. If water is trucked in, along with feed trucks, it would increase traffic and wear and tear on the roads. Not knowing where in the process the building permits were, she asked if there was anything that could still be done.

Gary Veprovsky expressed his dislike for the method the chicken farm was handled at the last meeting. He felt the Board should have waited two weeks to get more information, stating it was poor politics with a quorum of only 3 board members. Krivohlavek explained the Board was not voting on approving the building permits. The vote was on whether the permits should be considered one or two separate permits. Krivohlavek stated the Deputy County Attorney gave the opinion the building permit applications were completed following the Saline County Planning and Zoning current regulations.

It was noted more citizens need to attend the Planning and Zoning Committee meetings. The issues of the wind farms, chicken farms and other zoning issues are discussed at these meetings, before permits are issued. If citizens would attend the Planning and Zoning Committee meetings, many issues could be addressed or prevented before permits are issued.

Krivohlavek asked Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi if the Roads Department is contacted during the building permit process to address possible road issues. Filipi stated Roads is not involved the process.

Dean Hatcliff, representing his neighborhood, addressed the Board stating his property is a ¹/₄ mile from eight of the proposed chicken barns. He stated County Road I is a death trap. He does not believe it is fair to their air quality with the south winds to deal with the increased dust and smell.

It was asked if a Nebraska Rural Water District or the Nebraska Department of Environment and Energy is involved in issuing building permits. Planning and Zoning Administrator Lyle Weber, stated water is not part of the Saline County building permit application process, only the land. County Attorney Tad Eickman will investigate the authority the NRD's and NDEE may have in these situations.

Brian Pribyl spoke to expand on Veprovsky's comments. He thought the chicken farm issue should have been tabled to obtain more information, hopefully to avoid ramifications.

Laura Novak who lives 1 1/2 miles south from the Pleasant Hill chicken farm location, addressed the Board stating the intersection at County Road 1900 and Road I does not have stop signs, and corn fields on 3 sides. She is disturbed by the lack of neighbor notification. Novak stated there is a house 1/8 mile from the location and several other homes nearby. Pollution, smell, dust and increased traffic on these roads are a big concern.



Kohout stated he received a call from Dave Musil, expressing water concerns with the proposed chicken farms.

Karpisek asked Eickman if a moratorium could be done on these chicken farms. Eickman stated it would need to be placed on the next agenda for action to be taken.

Eickman stated he will further investigate the Planning and Zoning Regulations. It may be the Planning & Zoning Administrator can bring these two building permits before the Planning & Zoning Board which could allow for public comments and input.

At 10:38 a.m., Weber and Raymond Slama requested approval of a minor subdivision of approximately 4 acres in Section 35 Township 7 Range 4. Krivohlavek moved to approve, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Southeast Nebraska CASA Executive Director Marci Fehlhafer and CASA Administrative Assistant Sonia Almodovar, gave the Board a very positive update on their services. Fehlhafer reported she had applied for and received the Response and Recovery Grant, along with the Stabilization Grant. With these grants they were able to hire two temporary employees. They have started a podcast called CASA Talk. Currently there are four published and can be found on any podcast platform. They have just launched a virtual capital campaign called CASA For Every Kid. Where they hoping to raise \$10,190.00 to recruit 10 more volunteers. Felhafer is hoping Almodovar will become permanent and for her to possibly have an office in the Courthouse to serve Saline County. Marci is working to become bilingual and their Marketing Director is bilingual. Felhafer thanked the Board for their support. Henning commented CASA has grown under Marci's leadership.

At 10:45 a.m. Kohout announced the Board would recess;

At 10:57 a.m. Kohout announced the Board would reconvene;

Under correspondence, Bartels reported receiving from the City of Crete, their October 20th meeting agendas for the City Council, Public Works Committee, Legislative & Development Committee, Public Safety Committee and Finance Committee; and their October 26th agenda for the Planning Commission; from SENND their October 22nd Executive Committee Agenda; from Blue Valley Community Action their October 20th Regular Meeting Agenda for the Board of Directors, the August 18th zoom virtual meeting minutes; the October 2020 Reports to the Board of Directors and the July-September 2020 News Clippings.

Kohout received communication from the Crime Commission relative to our diversion program with the County Attorney's office and LeAnn Manning. The communication was a follow up to the cooperation during the October 2020 grant monitoring.

Under report of officials, Krivohlavek reported receiving several calls regarding the chicken farms expressing concerns with the water supply and roads. She attended the October 15th Saline County Area Transit meeting, reporting the buses are up and running with thorough daily cleaning.

Kohout reported attending the Employee Wellness Meeting, Planning and Zoning Meeting; a zoom meeting with the Governor; and has an upcoming Solid Waste Management meeting where they will discuss the issue of the lack of a weighted quorum to make decisions.

Karpisek attended the Employee Wellness Committee meeting.

McDermott reported on the October 14th flu clinic; the Sheriff Tax Sale was moved from October 14th to November 19th at 2:00; on October 14th he attending the courthouse security consultation in Plattsmouth; October 15th Maintenance Workshop with Dan Johnson in Aurora; has an upcoming Wellness Committee meeting on November 9th; attended webinars, one with Pam Bourne on the Work Environment after COVID and the other on employee mental health; on Thursday a meeting with SpyGlass regarding the audit of communication billings.

Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi presented a request to occupy a right of way by Windstream WO#71500003000123, OSP-23080 for approval to bore new copper cable at County Road 800. Karpisek moved to approve, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi reported they are in the midst of replacing the bridge on the Plymouth road. Roads is continuing to replace driveway culverts and bridges as weather permits. Filipi is continuing to monitor roads the wind


farm contractors are using and has issued more fines for violations by the truck drivers. The Board gave Filipi guidance to contact EDF to amend the contract to increase the fines for these road violations.

Henning moved to approve the September 2020 Clerk Fees in the amount of \$14,406.11, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the agreement with Anita Stougard to implement the Saline County Juvenile Service Plan, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2020-074 for the Amendment and Addendum to NIRMA/NIRMA II Intergovernmental/Interlocal Agreements, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the agreements with Saline County and the Young Diversion Workers Ana Perez Mendez and/or Syerra Watson for the implementation of school intervention work, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the Audit Agreement allowing The SpyGlass Group to analyze the communication service agreements of Saline County for the purpose of cost recovery, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2020-075, transferring \$240,000 from the Inheritance Fund to the General Fund to be reimbursed when funds become available, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, November 10th, 2020 by Vice Chairperson Russ Karpisek. Present were Karpisek, Janet J. Henning and Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, present via teleconference were Marvin Kohout and Philip Hardenburger Commissioners, County Clerk Anita K. Bartels, Deputy County Clerk Jennifer Hermsmeier, and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Karpisek advised those present of the open meetings act posted at the back of the room. He also announced the Governor has signed Executive Order No. 20-34 which states elected officials ordered to quarantine or isolate due to exposure to COVID-19, in conformance with guidance from the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services, may fully participate, vote and be counted as part of a quorum in meetings when attending by videoconference or by telephonic conferencing or by conferencing by other electronic communication without having the meeting site where that elected official is located open to the public. This waiver shall apply to all public governing body meetings that occur through December 31, 2020.

Henning moved to approve the agenda with the addition of Emergency Management Manager John McKee to give a COVID update at 11:00, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the minutes of the October 27th, 2020 regular meeting, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, and Henning, Hardenburger abstained, nays none, motion carried.

The Citizens Forum and discussion of the Moratorium for Poultry Confinement Farms were combined;

To open the discussion Karpisek stated he suggested a possibility of moratorium at the last meeting and requested this discussion be placed on this meeting's agenda. Krivohlavek asked why he thought a moratorium may be needed. Karpisek response was to give the Planning and Zoning Committee a chance to review the regulations as currently written, based on the determination of whether the current applications should have been two separate building permit applications or a conditional use permit.

Joel Weber, Weber Feedyards, stated he has serious concerns and reservations when it comes to a moratorium on any type of livestock. Saline County is a livestock friendly county, which has done a lot for this county, and will continue to do so. Weber's comments included that in today's market climate you must be diversified to include both farming and livestock. If you put a moratorium on the poultry business, all of a sudden you will be asking for moratoriums on hogs and cattle which will curtail any operations for future generations.

Scott Spohn from Friend, a corn and soybean farmer. He has served on the Friend school board for 10 years where they are begging for additional revenues. Livestock consumes the corn and soybeans grown by farmers. He stated Saline County is a perfect spot for these types of operations. After serving on the school board, he is reminded you do not do what is best for one or two families, you do what's best for hundreds of kids. Friend gets almost 80% of their revenue from ag land. Ag land is supported by the livestock industry. If one or two people complain about having one of these is their backyards, what does this do to our industry and tax revenue. He stated it is absolutely ridiculous to even be talking about it as a livestock friendly county. This isn't about one or two families, it's about what's best for the county.

Karpisek stated he agrees with the statements made. He asked to have the moratorium issue placed on the agenda because there was not a lot known about the chicken barns and wanted further discussions held.

Dan Nerud a Pleasant Hill, Dorchester, Crete area farmer, voiced his opinions, he is against a moratorium, we are an ag related community/county. Where do you think our grain goes? He stated he just wanted to make that point.

Steve Mossman, attorney for R&R Christo Construction, LLC, does livestock planning across the State. He stated in his mind a moratorium is legally problematic, especially when it's directed towards a certain type





of livestock. The current permits in questions, followed the current Planning & Zoning Regulations. His understanding is the current moratorium hasn't been heard by the Planning & Zoning Committee and would amend the current Planning & Zoning regulations, approved by the Board. By putting this on the agenda without running it through the Planning & Zoning Committee was against the Planning & Zoning regulations, causing a legal problem with moratoriums.

Andy Sholting, Nutrient Advisors, West Point, NE, stated he had worked with the applicant on a couple of different sites. Nutrient Advisors has worked with several livestock producers to permit sites throughout Nebraska, Iowa and South Dakota. Sholting stated as they worked through our livestock regs, we have a very quality set of regulations. When producers complete a permit, there are several requirements that must be met, noting we have pretty significant setbacks. There is a lot of work in planning and finding a site to meet all the requirements. The applications submitted where within the threshold of size. Citizen concerns are almost exclusively caused by the fear of the unknow. There are over 400 houses operating in eastern Nebraska with no problems.

Steve Martin, Alliance for the Future of Agriculture in Nebraska (AFAN), previously with the Nebraska Department of Agriculture, worked with the Saline County Planning and Zoning Committee on the Livestock Friendly applications. He doesn't feel moratoriums are the way to go about changing planning and zoning regulations, it would give a negative connotation. The fear of the unknow is legitimate, but now we do know. He gave an example of Lincoln Premium Poultry, and offered to facilitate of tour of their operations. Martin submitted copies of a letter from Jessica Kolterman, Director of Administration with Lincoln Premium Poultry. Her letter discouraged implementing a moratorium on poultry operations in Saline County. She stated they have approximately 12 poultry farms in Seward County. As a resident of Seward County, she is often asked "when will the poultry barns be built and get birds?" Many of these barns have been in place with birds for around a year and a half, no one even knows they are there. Close neighbors have shared with her they have seen little or no impact.

Gary Veprovsky noted two meeting ago individuals on the opposite side of the poultry barn issue spoke and it is good to hear from both sides now. More citizens, on both sides need to be involved and come to the Planning and Zoning and Commissioner meetings, this is democracy in progress. We need everybody there at the same time, so everybody can hear what's really going on. He pointed out there wasn't one who complained last time here, they needed to come today too.

At 10:00 a.m. Karpisek excused himself to attend a court hearing, stating he appreciated everyone's input and although it was his request to put it on the agenda, he did not wish to move forward with the moratorium.

Chris Bousquet, representing the Nebraska Dairy Association and Nebraska Dairy Farmers spoke. He works with Steve Martin in recruiting for dairy farms across the State of Nebraska. He wanted to get the point across that any moratorium of livestock gives the sense that Saline County might not be open for business. A moratorium of livestock is not a good image.

Hardenburger stated he made his living in livestock for over 40 years. Most of the concerns are about the unknown. He understands their concerns and wanting to be heard. When he heard concerns regarding odors, flies, rodents and dead birds, he had to stop them and explain that is not how modern agriculture works. Chicken barns or hog confinement facilities have the latest technologies. It's a matter of being educated. Livestock is the best way to diversity to keep young people on farms, stating a moratorium sends the wrong message and is a bad idea. Grain farming and livestock is the backbone of the State of Nebraska and we must not hinder that.

Kohout agreed with Hardenburger, stating as a farmer with sheep and cattle he has to diversity, he does not think it's a good idea either.

No action was taken on the moratorium.

Krivohlavek reported to her knowledge, the two building permits submitted for the chicken barns have been pulled.



At 10:08 a.m., Scott Keene with Piper Sandler presented the 2020 Doane Refunding Documents and Resolution #2020-077 for approval. Keene stated the County was only facilitating this refunding, it is well stated in the documents the County has no obligation or liability in payment should Doane default. Henning moved to approve, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Krivohlavek and Kohout, nays none, Karpisek was absent, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve resolution #2020-078 to transfer \$145,000 from the Inheritance Fund to the General Fund to be reimbursed when funds become available, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Krivohlavek and Kohout, nays none, Karpisek absent, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve resolution #2020-079 to transfer \$3,100 from the Inheritance Fund to the Juvenile Services Aid Program Fund to be reimbursed when funds become available, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenburger, Krivohlavek and Henning, nays none, Karpisek absent, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the October 2020 District Court Fees in the amount of \$12,312.29, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, Hardenburger, Kohout and Karpisek, nays none, Karpisek absent, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the October 2020 Sheriff Fees, Writ Fees \$1,319.00, Mileage \$1,403.00, Vehicle Inspections \$610.00 and Gun Permits \$70.00, totaling \$3,402.00, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Hardenburger and Krivohlavek, nays none, Karpisek absent, motion carried.

At 10:20 a.m., Karpisek rejoined the meeting.

County Treasurer Deb Spanyers, stated according to Statute 77-1718, she presented to the Sheriff the 2020 Distress Warrants for unpaid taxes. As of October 30th, 2020 there are 63 warrants totaling \$39,333.74 for unpaid taxes. Karpisek moved to approve, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Kohout, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

McDermott reported on the highlights of the final draft of the 2021 Saline County Employee Wellness Program. He stated the main change was to incorporate all participants into the wellness portal for data accuracy. Kohout, moved to approve the 2021 Wellness Program, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Hardenburger, Krivohlavek, Karpisek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Sheriff Alan Moore introduced "Buster" to the Board. Buster is the new edition to the K-9 program. The Saline County K-9 program has been in effect since the early 90s and has been a great program for law enforcement. Moore has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) agreement with Sheriff Gustafson at Gage County to acquire Buster. Indy, currently handled by Tom Hudiburgh will retire soon and Buster will take her place with Hudiburgh. Buster is a 5-year old Belgian Malinois and was acquired from Gage County at no cost through the MOU. As part of the MOU, Saline County would offer K-9 assistance as available to Gage County.

At 10:36 a.m. Karpisek announced the Board would recess;

At 10:47 a.m. Karpisek announced the Board would reconvene;

Under report of officials Krivohlavek reported receiving a few calls regarding the chicken farm building permits; stated Joel Weber called her regarding the poultry moratorium and his interest in serving on the Planning & Zoning Committee; Krivohlavek apologized if she missed phone calls or voicemail messages, she switched phone plans, which caused an issue for a few days;

Henning reported participating in a zoom CASA meeting last Wednesday and yesterday she attended a Region V Services meeting;

Kohout reported having a NACO Board of Directors zoom meeting; this Sunday he has a Saline County Historical Society meeting in Dorchester; an upcoming Planning & Zoning meeting and an upcoming zoom meeting with the Governor;

Hardenburger reported he has an upcoming zoom meeting with Blue Valley Community Action and he received calls on the chicken farm and moratorium;

McDermott reported he was introduced to our new Windstream Account Advocate, Val Chavez; yesterday he attended the Wellness Committee Meeting where the discussion of the Health Fair, which is





tentatively set for the 3rd week of February; he has a Spyglass meeting on Thursday, a Leadership Webinar on the 17th, Safety Committee meeting scheduled for the 18th and on the morning of the 19th a NIRMA Webinar series lead by Brandi Johnson begins;

Emergency Management Manager John McKee gave a quick briefing of the information he received from Kim with Public Health Solutions. Rural hospital COVID units are at full capacity. Right now, there are no major issues with personal protection equipment, supplies are flowing good. At the current rate, expect most, if not all counties will be in the red risk dial within the next three to four weeks. Another issues PHS is having is many people are still refusing to cooperate with contact tracing or not quarantining as instructed. There is an element of personal responsibility needed. Kim is appreciative of any input from elected leaders on how to deal with those not cooperating. McKee encouraged the continuation of County employees to wear masks if they are within 6 feet of each other or whenever they are helping the public.

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, November 24th, 2020 by Chairperson Marvin Kohout. Present were Kohout, Russ Karpisek, Janet J. Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, and Philip Hardenburger Commissioners, County Clerk Anita K. Bartels, and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings act posted at the back of the room.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the agenda seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the minutes of the November 10th, 2020 regular meeting, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Under the Citizens Forum, Jen Igo with Nebraska Strong addressed the Board, inquiring if the Board could offer contact information or recommendations who may benefit from their programs. The Board recommended she contact Saline County Aging Services, all City and Village offices, along with each local Chamber of Commerce.

Under Correspondence, Bartels reported she received from Blue Valley Community Action, the November 17th Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors Agenda, their minutes for the October 20th zoom virtual meeting and the November 2020 Reports to the Board of Directors; from NIRMA a check for \$9,684 was received as a recommitment dividend.

Under Report of Officials, Krivohlavek stated she received a phone call from Dani Klasek expressing her frustration with flood lights shining in her home 24/7 from the power plant; and she reported the next meeting date for Saline County Aging Services is to be determined;

Hardenburger attending a Blue Valley Community Action zoom meeting last Tuesday and the Five Rivers RC&D meeting on the 19th was postponed until December;

Kohout attended a NACO Board zoom meeting, on December 10th is the NACO Business meeting, the Saline County Historical Society meeting was canceled, he attended the Planning & Zoning meeting last Tuesday, on Thursday he attended a zoom meeting with the Governor and state the Safety Committee meeting was canceled;

Karpisek reported receiving a call regarding road issues which he has discussed with the Highway Superintendent;

McDermott reported attending a Spyglass Introductory meeting on the 12th, he attended webinars with EAP Continuum and Brandi Johnson, he attended the November 19th Sheriff's sale noting 4 of the 7 properties sold with the County acquiring 3 of them, he reported JK Electric has changed the electrical power and Electronic Contracting Company is programming the access to the third floor secure room, on November 30th he will participate in the Crete High School grass roots leadership program, and the Homestead LEPC meeting will possibly be canceled;

At 9:56 a.m., Senator Tom Brandt updated the Board on the bills which were passed during the legislative sessions. There was discussion on the COVID pandemic, including the work Public Health Solutions has been doing. Brandt thanked Janet Henning for her service with the Public Health Solutions board. Karpisek expressed to Brandt how important it is to keep the Inheritance Tax with the County, this money is used to balance the County budget each year.

At 10:45 a.m., Clerk of the District Court Amber Mulbery, expressed the need to update and add digital technology to the District Courtroom. There currently is not a sound system, camera, microphones or speakers in the courtroom. The current projector is often not compatible with electronics brought into the courtroom. County Attorney Eickman agreed with Mulbery. This technology was installed in the County Courtroom



during the renovation, but not in the District Court Courtroom. The Board gave Mulbery the go ahead to obtain Request for Proposals, so specifications can be written and bids could be obtained.

At 11:00 a.m. Veteran Service Office Forrest Doyle and Lyle Bartels Saline County Veteran Service Committee member, along with the Saline County Board of Commissioners, presented Bernard Navatril a Certificate of Appreciation for his military service of 34+ years, from January 1953 until retirement in April 1987. Navatril served in the Nebraska Air National Guard and United States Air Force. He retired as a Senior Master Sargent. The Board and all present thanked Navatril for his dedication and service to his Country.

At 11:07 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would recess;

At 11:22 a.m., Kohout announced the Board would reconvene;

Planning and Zoning Administrator Lyle Weber reported at the last Planning & Zoning Committee Board meeting, the Board directed Weber to request the Board of Commissioners to extend the wind farm moratorium, as approved with Resolution #2020-61. Eickman stated it would be prudent to do an extension with an end date. Eickman suggested February 28, 2021. Karpisek moved to approve a moratorium extension to February 28, 2021, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, and Krivohlavek, nays Kohout, motion carried. A resolution will be drafted recognizing this date extension for Board approval at the next meeting.

At 11:00 a.m., Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi presented a Request to Occupy Right of Way from Windstream. This project is to replace 700' damaged section of service wire on County Road 2100. Karpisek moved to approve, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi updated the Board on various road projects, including the replacement of the bridge on County Road U between Road 1400 and 1500. They will continue work on driveway culverts and replacing bridges with tubes as long as weather permits.

Filipi is continuing to deal with road issues involving the wind farm truckers. The truckers are using and tearing up county roads which were not on the approved list. Filipi has collected another \$15,000 in fines. Filipi reported he has closed County Road Q from 700 to Turbine 4. This road is not a main road and would not hinder local traffic. The road will be closed until further notice. Filipi is also monitoring County Road 300 north of Tobias. If he determines it necessary to close this road as well, it would still be open to local traffic.

Krivohlavek made a request for Filipi to address the concern of Dani Klasek, regarding flood lights shining into her house. Filipi stated he would follow up to see what lights are causing this issue.

McDermott reported to the Board the CDC has changed their COVID 19 Guidelines indicating when an employee may return to work after they have received a positive test result. In the updated CDC guidelines, a negative test is no longer required to return to work, only a 10 day quarantine from the onset of symptoms. The County's current guidelines were written in June, following the CDC guidelines at that time with the understanding the County is a critical infrastructure. Karpisek made a motion to approve the updated COVID-19 Staff Guidelines to follow the CDC recommendations, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

McDermott opened discussion to take action of the sale of 4 parcels of land in Crete to the City of Crete. The parcels are located at 16th & Evergreen, 2 parcels at 4th & Iris and 1 parcel at 5th & Forest. Karpisek moved to provide the County Attorney the task to process in the interest of both the County and the City of Crete the sale of the properties as discussed, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the October 2020 County Clerk fees in the amount of \$22,508.25, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, December 22nd, 2020 by Chairperson Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Russ Karpisek, Janet J. Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, and Philip Hardenburger Commissioners, County Clerk Anita K. Bartels, Deputy County Clerk Jennifer Hermsmeier and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings act posted at the back of the room.

Henning moved to approve the agenda seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the minutes of the December 8th, 2020 regular meeting, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Under Correspondence, Bartels reported receiving from the City of Crete, the December 15th agendas for the City Council regular meeting, Public Works Committee meeting and the Public Safety Committee meeting; an Approval to Operate notice from the State of Nebraska Department of Environment and Energy for Lawver Farms Animal Feeding Operation; a thank you from Jill Smith on behalf of the Doane University Board for the County's assistance with their refunding; a draft of the June 2020 audit and informed the Board of a Saline County Emergency Declaration for the collapse inside the storage facility at Americold Logistics.

Under Citizens Forum, Gary Veprovsky addressed the Board, requesting to go on record stating he does not feel the Planning & Zoning Board is doing what the citizens want regarding setbacks of wind towers. He stated the setback of one miles is not sufficient and supplied documentation whereas Hamilton County and Merrick have two mile setbacks from the Property Line for a Non-Participating landowner. He went on to say making the statement that increasing the setbacks would kill wind energy is not true, developers would adjust accordingly. He stated he feels the County should be represented by Counsel at these meetings, only the attorney for Milligan EDF has been present. Veprovsky remarked he believes two Planning & Zoning Board members are biased because they have wind towers and are not protecting the nonparticipating property owners. He stated from day one his main concern was protecting the nonparticipating property owners. Veprovsky inquired how a Planning & Zoning Board member is appointed. He stated Joe Weber and Jeff Koll have both expressed an interest to serve on the Planning and Zoning Board, but have been turned down because they do not reside in a area of the County that is not represented. Appointment of Planning & Zoning Board members was tabled until Attorney Eickman was present.

Emergency Manager John McKee addressed the Board, stating funding has been secured for the DeWitt Stream Gauge for 2021. USGS is contributing \$6,300-\$6,400, NRD is contributing \$2,000 with the balance being covered by Koch Fertilizer LLC, which will be approximately \$6,900-\$7,000. McKee reported COVID vaccines will soon be available to EMT and Paramedic personnel, followed by Law Enforcement, then to remaining citizens around May or June. McKee reported the number of positive test results has decreased in Saline County.

Under Report of Officials, Hardenburger reported attending a 5 Rivers RC & D meeting on Thursday the 17th;

Kohout reported attending a zoom NACO Board meeting and NACO Conference; a zoom meeting with the Governor; a Highway and Courthouse bond refunding meeting; a Wellness Committee meeting, a Planning & Zoning meeting and issued a reminder the annual performance reviews are coming up;

Karpisek reported attending a zoom SENDD meeting with the discussion being the installation of rural broadband and the effort of trying to buy abandoned homes to rejuvenate and sell them, getting them back on the tax rolls;



McDermott reported ongoing Spyglass meetings, with the next one being the 29th; he attended the NACO Business meeting, a Wellness Committee meeting on the upcoming Health Fair; on the 16th met with the Keystone Pipeline to discuss security, attending a NIRMA webinar presented by Pam Bourne on FMLA and this afternoon he will attend a meeting on upgrading the technology in the District courtroom;

Clerk of the District Clerk Amber Mulbery reported meeting with ECC Communications and with Lancaster County to begin the process of updating the District courtroom technology.

At 10:37 a.m. Kohout announced the Board would take a recess;

At 10:50 a.m. Kohout announced the Board would reconvene;

Henning moved to approve the November 2020 County Clerk fees in the amount of \$21,614.35, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the November 2020 Sheriff's Fees, Writ Fees \$1,315.00, Mileage \$1,356.00, Vehicle Inspections \$630.00, Gun Permits \$90.00 and Miscellaneous \$42.00 totaling \$3,432.00, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2020-087, authorization to transfer 31.87% of the 2020 taxes collection from the General Fund to the Road Fund, as proposed in the 2020-2021 Saline County Budget, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Karpisek moved to approve Resolution #2020-088 placing a cap on employee vacation hours to 240 hours, in order to encourage the use of vacation time, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2020-089 confirming Christmas Eve as a full day of holiday leave, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Resolution #2020-090 to transfer \$16,554.18 from the General Fund to Aging Services for 6 months of health insurance, retirement and social security, was tabled until the next meeting to coordinate the transfer of funds with the Treasurer's office.

Planning & Zoning Administrator Lyle Weber and Nicky Zalesky presented an Administrative Subdivision for Rick & Jan Buchanan. This subdivision is to divide the number of acres in the parcel where their residence is located. Three acres would remain with the residence and the remaining 17 acres would be farm ground. Karpisek moved to approve, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Kohout announce at the last Planning & Zoning meeting, Gary Veprovsky volunteered to serve on the Saline County Variance Board of Adjustment Committee. Henning moved to approve his appointment, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

At 11:13 a.m., Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi presented a Windstream request to occupy the right of way on 2109 County Road F to bore under the road. Henning moved to approve, seconded by Karpisek. Voting ave were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi gave an update on current road projects, including the completion on Road 2100 & J bridge replacement.

At 11:16 a.m. the Board requested Eickman's opinion on compensation for individuals serving on County committees. Eickman recommended all committees be treated the same. Added to the discussion was how individuals are appointed to fill vacancies on committees and whether or not an individual needs to reside in a specific area to be appointed. Eickman stated it was in the County's best interest to have all areas of the County equally represented. An example would be to designate committee districts similar to the Commissioner districts. Eickman will draw up paperwork with language to address these issues.
